One Body

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. (1 Cor. 12:12)

As we begin this Lenten season, it is time for us to prepare for Christ's journey to the cross. We prepare by reflecting on our baptism, the event that has united us as the body of Christ. We celebrate our membership in the body of Christ each time we come together to worship. Yet it seems that fewer and fewer of us participate in making that worship happen. So let us begin this Lenten journey by looking at two worship positions that often go unfilled – assisting minister and children's message – and the questions you have asked me about them.

Q: Why do we have an assisting minister? Isn't that the pastor's job?

A: No. The pastor's "job" is to proclaim the words of forgiveness during the Confession and Forgiveness, preside at the Sacraments (Baptism and Communion), and supervise the sermon (either by preaching or supervising whoever is preaching). Worship is not performance. It is participation. It is what we all do together to thank and glorify God.

Q: Then what does an assisting minister do?

A: Technically, assisting ministers are everyone who assists with the worship service — ushers, greeters, acolytes, lectors, cantors, altar guild, communion assistants, musicians, etc. But we usually refer to the assisting minister as the representative of the assembly who leads the prayers of the people — the Prayers of Intercession, the Offering Prayer, the Prayer after Communion — and dismisses the congregation at the end.

Q: Do I have to do it from the lectern?

A: No. You can do it from your pew with a handheld mic.

O: Do I have to cantor?

A: No. Some of our assisting ministers do cantor also. But we can have both an assisting minister and a cantor separately. If we don't have a cantor, the pastor can speak the words instead of cantoring.

Q: Why can't the pastor do all the children's messages?

A: The pastor can gladly do all the children's sermons. But when the children were baptized, the congregation promised to "support them and pray for them in their new life in Christ." It is good for the children to interact with others in the church and to know that we all value them and are there to help them in their faith journey.

Q: Would I have to write an original children's sermon?

A: You are welcome to write a message yourself. But the pastor can also provide a resource for a children's message. If you would rather read a book to the children, the pastor can provide that as well.

Do you have more questions? My door is always open. I welcome all who are interested in serving as assisting minister or delivering the children's message. Are you ready to try something new this Lenten season while we worship our Lord and Savior together as one body?




Wednesday, March 1 5:30-7:30 pm
