Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Easter we celebrated Christ's resurrection which granted us the promise of forgiveness and the hope of eternal life. I have to admit that this year may have been the strangest Holy Week that I and most of you have ever experienced. And yet we still celebrated Easter.

I have mentioned this before but it bears repeating: Easter was not cancelled because there is absolutely no way in which we, mere humans, can cancel what God has done in Christ. At the April council meeting, we discussed again how the COVID-19 virus is challenging and changing how we do our ministry. It was not an easy conversation. Council decided to continue pausing our in-person worship and other activities. When the orders are lifted, council will meet again to determine how we will re-open our building.

We know that not everyone is in agreement with the council's decision. It was not an easy decision to make. We know that pausing in-person worship is not ideal but it is the best move for safety of our members during this pandemic.
