"(After studying the results of a "Decade of Evangelism" the ELCA concluded)..... There was - **get ready** - only ONE factor that was a good predictor for whether or not a church grew: The **ONLY** factor that really matters is whether or not a church has a clear enough vision of where God wants it to go that it is willing to do whatever it takes to follow wherever God leads.

How we do things *does* matter. But that's not the real issue. The real issue is who we **ARE**. Are we people who are so confident in God's love and grace that we are able to try new things and welcome new people and embrace new ideas and dream new dreams? Are we clear enough about what we are being called to do and to be that we are willing to set off on whatever new adventure God calls us to?

Are we full of enough hope that we can dare to fail, to risk messing everything up, to take the chance that we are wrong? Are we free to love, to serve, to share, to sing, to laugh, to lead, to give ourselves away? Are we willing to let ourselves be turned upside-down and inside-out by a God who wants for us, for our congregations, and for our world more than anything we could ever even ask or imagine? Who **ARE** we? Who are **YOU**? How is your life being changed by God's power and presence and call? How is God changing your congregation? These are the real questions. And this is the place to begin."

May the God of hope be with you, inspiring, calling and inviting you to dream and to believe in possibilities.

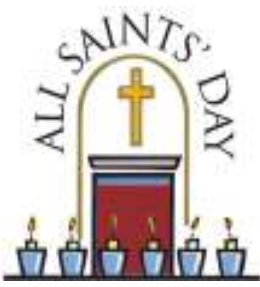

Congregation Council Action from September 2021:

Motion was approved to call a special congregational meeting to vote on the recommendation of the Council to sell the parsonage.

Transition Team Update

On 10-05-21 the Transition Team had a meeting with Pastor Dave Whetter, assistant to the Bishop, and DJ Whetter, a representative of the Kansas Leadership Center. Discussion was on information gathered so far from the meetings, how to prepare to continue to move forward in our transition process and about the process of writing and submitting the MSP (Ministry Site Profile). The transition team has continued to collate the data from all of large and small group discussions, the last discussions being at both the 8:30 and 11:00 services on 10-17-21. Common themes that have emerged from the discussions are: worship and music is an area of strength, moving to one service would bring unity and community, we are not in a growth pattern but we have a desire to support youth and families, service projects are a highlight for our congregation, we are open to shared ministry and partnerships, we have an uncertainty about leadership styles, we struggle with the willingness to change, we are not currently sustainable, and we have a desire to share God's love through our community through helping youth, families, and the homeless. On 10-18-2021 we began writing the first draft of the MSP. Once the transition team has a final copy of the MSP, it will be a joint effort of the Transition Team and the Call Committee to edit it or approve it to be submitted to the Council. The Council then has full editing authority and once pleased with the document, will vote to approve it. Once approved, the document is submitted to the Synod for review and must receive approval to be posted by the Bishop. Once posted, ministerial candidates can view it. If you have any questions or desire to give input into the data that has and continues to be collected, please contact one of the Transition Team members. Thank you to everyone for your candid and thoughtful contributions to our conversations and to this process.

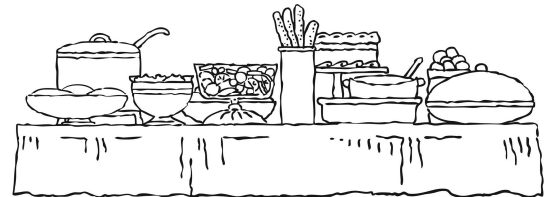
