Brothers and sisters in Christ,

In figuring out something to talk about, I found myself on Facebook once again and at a post that I shared a few weeks ago.

“Judas had the best pastor, the best leader, the best adviser and the best counselor and he still failed. The problem is not the leadership or the church that you go to. If your attitude or character does not change or your heart does not transform; you will always be the same.”

Think about that for awhile. We all know that we are sinners and not one of us is worthy to be saved. And yet God forgives us and offers eternal life despite our ugliness to one another and to God. If God’s grace does not change us, then we will continue to be ugly to one another. We will continue to not allow ourselves to be touched and changed by the Gospel. Instead of spreading God’s love to others, we will be sharing hatred and lies.

I don’t know about you, but I do believe that a world that is focused on God’s love for all is a much better option than a world of hatred. Judas proved that even with the best pastor, leader, adviser and counselor, failure is still a possibility. The problem with Judas is that he decided that his own selfish reasons were more important than what Jesus was teaching. As a result of his own decision, Judas betrayed Jesus.

Each one of us is Judas. We can be more concerned about our own selfish desires and interests than the common good of all. We can look down upon others and even condemn others without even knowing the truth or just thinking that others are not as good.

We all condemn Jesus to death each day because of our sins. And yet it is Christ who spreads his arms wide and takes our punishment. He takes on our condemnation and offers us forgiveness in return.

When we live in forgiveness instead of condemning others, we live in God’s grace. That grace brings about a change within us that allows us to share Christ’s love with others. It helps us to change from Judas to be more like Christ as we live with one another.

God's Work. Our Hands. 2019

Over 35 volunteers of all ages from Immanuel, Redeemer, and St. John's Lutheran Churches participated in "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday on September 8 at Ashby House. Ashby House empowers homeless families and individuals to improve self-sufficiency, self-advocacy, and holistic recovery. Congregation members worked in the newly located family shelter taking out nails and prepping spaces for construction. Others worked in a nearby



Ashby House facility cleaning out construction debris. Over at the main office, the downstairs crew put together LWR Baby and School Kits, while the upstairs crew sorted and organized donated items for immediate accessibility.

Ashby House Facilities Manager, Jeff Shaw, stated that the work done by our crew would have taken weeks for staff to accomplish. And some things would have never gotten done. While the rain kept us from doing the originally planned outdoor landscaping, the indoor work kept folks busy. Jeff invited us back later this fall for another work day to do the landscaping. At the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in August, the social statement [*Faith, Sexism, and Justice: A Lutheran Call to Action*](#) was approved. The social statement is entitled a “call to action” because it urges members to recognize patriarchy and sexism as sinful and invoke systemic changes which fosters abundant, flourishing life for all persons within both church and society.
