

Game Play & Rules

- Read all of this out loud to all players. Listen closely, you will need this info! Do not pre-read any of the finds. Go in order and don't jump. If you can't find one then move on.
- The game is designed to get you out on an adventure, experience the 22 acres around you and have fun finding hidden treasures together.
- Use our trails, maps, pictures and hints to find water safe containers that you will sign, date and leave a note on given paper. Each find is worth one point. You can earn extra credit on some finds. Some of these boxes have trinkets and treasures you can trade out for (one per winner). We love to see treasures from where our guests are from! If you forgot a trade no big deal, get us next time. Some containers are just big enough for the pen and paper. Please put them back as you found them!
- The property line is marked on the right side and the center by orange and blue ribbons on trees. There are no property markers to the left so please stay on the trail and don't venture off property.
- You can all play on one team, make separate teams or play every adventurer for themselves! See who can collect the most points. Loser cooks dinner or gathers fire wood!
- Going down the trail is always the easiest. Coming back up can be tough so take your time, bring plenty of water and a snack.
- The adventure can take anywhere from 45 minutes to 3 hours. Take longer if you like.

Start on the flat gravel area below the deck. The trail leads down to the right. You will cross over a large down tree to the first drainage ditch crossing.

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Mossy Rock - Teal

This treasure is a trinket treasure! Grab a small treasure and trade if you can.


Notes
