OPPORTUNITY ZONES SELECTED

On April 20, 2018, Mayor Bowser nominated 25 census tracts to be Opportunity Zones to the U.S. Treasury for certification. The Opportunity Zones program was established by the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 to encourage long-term investments in low-income urban and rural communities nationwide. The Opportunity Zones program provides a tax incentive for investors to re-invest their unrealized capital gains into Opportunity Funds.

The census tracts nominated for Ward 7 & 8 are:

MAYOR BOWSER HIGHLIGHTS PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN MPD AND UDC-CC AT THE NATIONAL MUSEUM OF AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY AND CULTURE

First-Of-Its-Kind Training Course Will Focus on the African American Experience in Washington, DC. Mayor Muriel Bowser on 4/13/18 celebrated a partnership between the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) and the University of the District of Columbia Community College (UDC-CC) at the National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC). Through the partnership, all sworn and civilian members at MPD will participate in a training course that provides insight into the African American experience in the District and the history of neighborhoods in Washington, DC. "When residents and officers trust each other and understand each other, we are all safer," said Mayor Bowser.

Mayor Bowser Celebrates One of the Largest Municipal Solar Projects in the Country at HD Woodson High School

On Tuesday, April 17, Mayor Muriel Bowser kicked off #EarthWeekDC by cutting the ribbon at HD Woodson High School in Ward 7 to celebrate the launch of one of the largest on-site solar projects in the country. HD Woodson is one of roughly 50 District government facilities with a solar photovoltaic (PV) system. With a combined 670 kilowatt (kW) solar roof and parking lot installation, it is the most powerful solar power generating system in the District.

Together, solar arrays on the 50 government sites, including schools, recreation centers, MPD facilities, as well as a hospital and warehouse, generate more than 11 megawatts of solar electricity.

FREE BOOKS PROGRAM CHANGES CHILDREN

Public Library, in conjunction by city Council member Charles Allen, tapped into the program in 2016 and created Books from Birth, which provides children up to five free books that are mailed to their homes, one each month.

Currently, more than 27,000 Washington families are registered with the public library, which has sent out 431,060 books since the program's inception, said Michael Linder, who coordinates the program for the library.

Another 5,605 children have "graduated" from the program after turning age 6, Linder said. The program is an effort to close the literacy gap in Wards 1, 5, 7 and 8, he said. To register to receive free books, go to <https://www.dclibrary.org/freebooks>.

D.C.'S DEANWOOD IS SLOWLY GENTRIFYING

Deanwood, a Northeast neighborhood in D.C.'s Ward 7, has been a Black enclave for over a century, but in a few years, it will become a part of the District's gentrifying areas.

Deanwood is located in the far Northeast corner of the District and is bounded by Eastern Avenue to the northeast, sharing a border with Prince George's County, Md., and Kenilworth Avenue to the northwest, Division Avenue to the Southeast and Nannie Helen Burroughs Avenue to the south. While Deanwood is one of the oldest Black neighborhoods in the District, longtime residents see a change is coming.

The Hill East mixed-use development will bring affordable housing, retail and community green space to Ward 7. Donatelli Development plans to

develop two parcels at the Stadium-Armory Metro station, currently the site of government agency parking lots and a portion of the 67-acre site known as Reservation 13, there will eventually be two mixed-use buildings with a respective 91 and 253 residential units. Both buildings will have ground-floor retail and underground parking; they will straddle C Street where it intersects 19th Street SE. Reservation 13 has been part of Ward 7 since a 2011 redistricting.

DEDICATION OF SOME CONWAY CENTER

Father John Adams, President of SOME, the SOME Board of Directors, and Corporate Advisory Board cordially invite you to the Dedication Ceremony of the SOME Conway Center on Saturday, **May 19th at 11:00am.** The center is the first facility in the District of Columbia that provides affordable housing, job training, and health care in a single location. EMPLOYER ASSISTED HOUSING PROGRAM (EAHP)

The Employer-Assisted Housing Program (EAHP) offers eligible District government employees and first responders a deferred, 0% interest loan and a matching funds grant for down payment and closing costs to purchase their first single family home, condominium, or cooperative unit in the District. The down payment assistance is a loan for the purchase of a principal residence in the District. The loan has zero interest, and no payments are required until the property is: (1) sold or transferred; (2) no longer occupied as principal residence; or (3) refinanced with cash out. There is no income cap for EAHP applicants, nor is there a cash contribution requirement. [Read More.](#)

HOME PURCHASE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (HPAP)

The Home Purchase Assistance (HPAP) program provides interest-free loans and closing cost assistance to qualified applicants to purchase single family houses, condominiums, or cooperative units. The loan amount is based on a combination of factors, including income, household size, and the amount of assets that each applicant must commit toward a property's purchase. As of 2017, eligible applicants can receive a maximum of \$80,000 in gap financing assistance and an additional \$4,000 in closing cost assistance. [Read More.](#)

MAYOR BOWSER LAUNCHES RIGHT CARE, RIGHT NOW INITIATIVE

April 19, 2018, Mayor Muriel Bowser launched the *Right Care, Right Now* initiative, which connects 911 callers with less serious and non-life-threatening injuries and conditions to primary care providers near their homes, helping preserve resources for serious emergencies. With the addition of a nurse triage line to the Office of Unified Communications, some 911 callers who may be better served and treated in a primary care setting, will be transferred to a nurse. If a nurse agrees that a caller may be best served in a primary care setting, the nurse will identify a doctor's office in the caller's neighborhood where the patient will be able to receive medical care the very same day. A TEMPORARY WIN FOR BARRY FARM TENANTS AS REDEVELOPMENT HALTED BY COURT

Residents of the Barry Farm public housing project in Anacostia won a victory in the courts Thursday in their long-standing effort to avoid being relocated.

The District has been trying for a decade to remake the property into a 1,400-unit mixed-income development, with new public spaces and retail shops. But current residents of the historically African American complex insist that the D.C. Housing Authority redevelop the site before their housing is demolished. 203(K) REHABILITATION MORTGAGE INSURANCE

Limited 203(k) Mortgage

FHA's Limited 203(k) program permits homebuyers and homeowners to finance up to \$35,000 into their mortgage to repair, improve, or upgrade their home. Homebuyers and homeowners can quickly and easily tap into cash to pay for property repairs or improvements, such as those identified by a home inspector or an FHA appraiser. Homeowners can make property repairs, improvements, or prepare their home for sale. Homebuyers can make their new home move-in ready by remodeling the kitchen, painting the interior or purchasing new carpet.

203(k) Mortgage

The Section 203(k) program is FHA's primary program for the rehabilitation and repair of single family properties. As such, it is an important tool for community and neighborhood revitalization, as well as to expand homeownership opportunities. [Read More.](#)

CHANGE COMES TO EXCEL ACADEMY DCPS SELECTS NEW EXCEL PRINCIPAL

After three months of uncertainty, students and families at Excel Academy (2501 Martin Luther King Jr. Ave. SE) are finally sure that they can return to the school for the 2018-2019 academic year. The school will officially move to District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) under a new principal, Tenia Pritchard, in June 2018. An all-girls school serving preK-3 through grade eight, Excel Academy has the stated goal of "providing girls a solid academic foundation and enrichment opportunities to prepare them to succeed in high school and college and to develop the skills and confidence they need to make healthy, positive lifestyle choices."

Excel Academy had previously held a charter from the District of Columbia Public Charter School Board (DCPCSB). In January, DCPCSB voted unanimously to revoke Excel Academy's charter because the school had not met its charter goals. [Read More.](#)
