

February 2025

February – and it might be cold out there, but not too cold to pot up some flowers. A staple of cool season gardens is the Pansy, and its cousins, the Viola and the Violet. These three

flowers have such a complex ancestry that many botanists are unwilling to assign them to a species. It doesn't matter what you call them since they are all so closely related.

Pansies and Violas are both descendants of the wild violet and were grown in Europe as early as the 4th Century B.C. But the Pansy is no shrinking violet, this is a plant with history.

The name "Pansy" comes from the French word "pensée" meaning "thought". It was so named because the flowers dark center resembles a human face, and as each bloom matures, it nods forward looking as though it were in deep thought. A flower with a face.

According to ancient Greek mythology, the Pansy got its colors from Cupid's arrow which turned purple after piercing the heart of a white flower, causing it to bleed purple. It was said that just one drop of the flowers juice would cause lovesickness. In German and Scottish folklore, pansies were called "stepmothers", the large lower petal was the mother, the two petals to either side were the daughters and the two small upper petals were stepdaughters. In medieval times, the blossoms were mixed into potpourri, added to both sweet and savory dishes, used to flavor alcoholic drinks and to perfume linens. It is said that Napoléon gave Josephine Violets on their wedding anniversary. "Violet" was a password during the Emperor's exile and his loyalists made it their symbol of hope for his return.

In Britian, Adm. James Gambler (1756-1833) began crossing various wild species of the Viola family in the early 1800's. Mary Elizabeth Bennet (1785-1861) crossbred Violets during the same period and showcased the new Pansies to

gardeners in 1813. By 1850, the Pansy had been introduced to North America and by the late 1800's, it had become the continent's most popular flower grown from seed. Today, the Pansy is considered one of the world's most beloved flowers, with just about every color you can imagine. They have a commanding presence in today's gardens.

Pansies are a cool-season annual since they are able to withstand cool temperatures. They typically bloom from fall to mid-spring but will wane in the early-summer heat. In Phoenix, Pansies seem to grow best from fall to winter. These plants will thrive in rich well-drained soil that receives morning sun and afternoon shade. In a large pot or container (use a shallow one since Pansies are smaller plants), set 5 to 7 plants 6 to 7 inches apart for a strong visual impact and to prevent overcrowding. This is one excellent container plant.

Many varieties can reach 8-10 inches in height with a similar spread. Keep the soil moist and remove spent blossoms as needed. For continuous blooms, apply a balanced fertilizer a couple of times during the growing season. Prune Springblooming Pansies back for a possible repeated bloom. Pansies can re-seed and produce "volunteer" plants. This is a flower with thousands of years of history that deserves its own special spot in every garden. That's it for now.
