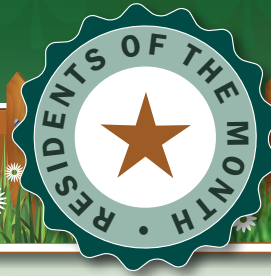

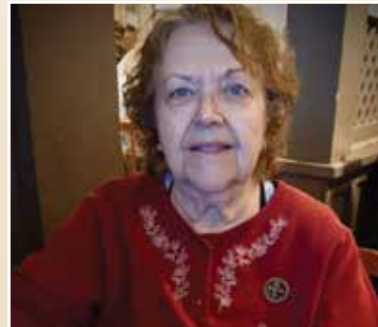

THE GARDEN GUYS,

March - the most colorful time of year when both winter and spring blooms overlap and color begins to fill the landscape. Spring is the busiest gardening time of the year, especially when it comes to pruning. Here

at Desertscape, it's **SPRING CLEAN-UP TIME**. Time to cut back those shrubs and ground covers, Both your potted plants and in-ground plants will be healthier and more attractive if you remove branches that are diseased, dead, or rubbing together, Each time you make a pruning cut you stop growth in one direction and encourage it in another.

Pruning tasks vary in scope – from removing large tree limbs to pinching out new growth on your perennials. Plants that have become too densely branched should be thinned to allow air and sunlight to reach the inner leaves and stems. Be sure to remove any wayward branches and suckers (stems growing up from the roots) and water sprouts (upright shoots growing upward from the trunk or branches), It should not, however, be necessary to cut back any plant continually just to keep it in bounds. If your plant requires that much attention it is probably planted in the wrong location, In general, pruning is best done in spring but dead, damaged or diseased wood should be removed immediately. When pruning, always cut right above the bud. The precise placement of a cut is important. If you cut too close to a bud, the bud is likely to die. If you cut too far away from it you will leave a stub that will no longer give any active growth. A proper cut would be about ¼ inch away from the bud, sloping away at a 45-degree angle. Remember to remove any dead leaves, twigs, or weeds that may be underneath any in-ground plants as this can help prevent fungus, disease, or other problems.

Spring cleanup time is hard work but also gives us a sense of accomplishment. It shows that we care about our homes and we have pride in our neighborhood. We need to keep our lots clean and weed-free. But what

exactly is a weed? The term “weed” is used by most gardeners to describe any plant that grows rapidly, thrives in a wide range of conditions or is simply in the wrong location. Weeds can grow in soil or gravel and reproduce themselves with ease. Hand-pulling or hoeing is your best bet for eliminating most weeds. One must be diligent and get those nasty things removed before they have the chance to set seed or you may end up with an even larger weed problem. Dig out the roots which will prevent the weed from resprouting – do not leave pulled or hoed-out weeds on bare ground or gravel since enough moisture could cause them to sprout again. It is so important to be a good neighbor and keep your weeds pulled. Nobody wants to pull weeds that have drifted in from seed from a neighboring lot. Keeping Desertscape weed free is a community effort and we all need to show our pride in our park. After all, it is the right thing to do.

All that pruning and weeding is a lot of work, but one cannot welcome spring without planting some flowers. A longtime favorite of gardeners everywhere is the **MARIGOLD**. With many different species and cultivars, overall height can range anywhere between 7-inches to 4-foot, depending on the variety, This American native likes full sun, average soil and is easy to grow from seed. The seed can be sown now. Whether you choose to use seed or nursery grown plants, both grow very well in containers and can be planted in either Spring or Fall here in Phoenix.

Spring clean-up time has never been easy, but at least we have the cooler weather on our side. Let's make the best of these temperatures by getting our lots cleaned up, pruned, weeded and some flowers planted. It's time to show that Desertscape is our home and that we all take pride in living here.

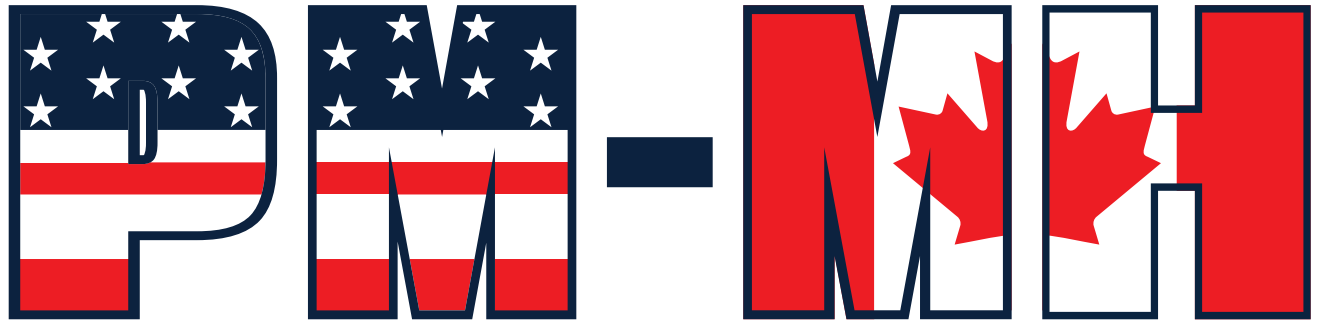

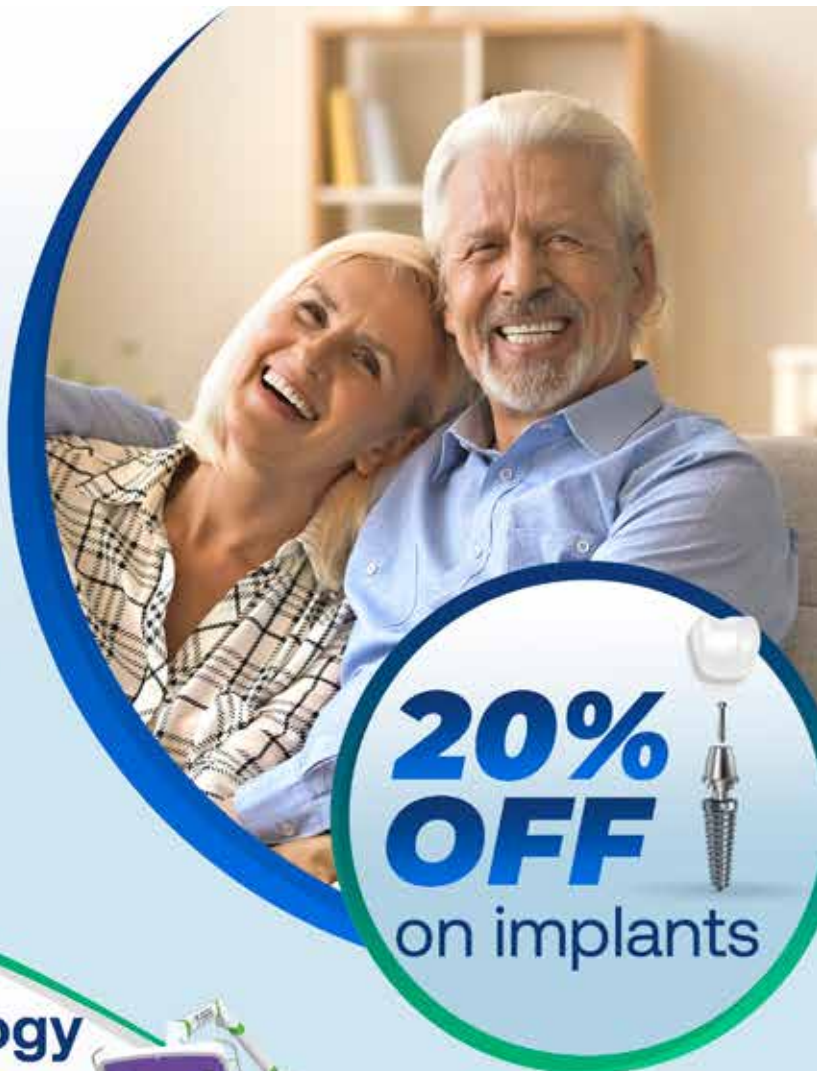
