A MESSAGE FROM DESERTSCAPE'S ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT, Cheri Kramer



Thanksgiving Day, annual national holiday in the United States and Canada celebrating the harvest and other blessings of the past year. Americans generally believe that their Thanksgiving is modeled on a 1621 harvest feast shared by the English colonists (Pilgrims) of Plymouth and the Wampanoag people. The American holiday is particularly rich in legend and symbolism, and the traditional

fare of the Thanksgiving meal typically includes turkey, bread stuffing, potatoes, cranberries, and pumpkin pie. With respect to vehicular travel, the holiday is often the busiest of the year, as family members gather with one another.

AND THIS IS THE REST OF THE STORY.

Yeah, it was made up. It was Abraham Lincoln who used the theme of Pilgrims and Indians eating happily together. He was trying to calm things down during the Civil War when people were divided. It was like a nice unity story.

Yes, it was public relations. It's kind of genius, in a way, to get people to sit down and eat dinner together. Families were divided during the Civil War.

So, what really happened?

We made a treaty. The leader of our nation at the time—Yellow Feather Oasmeequin (Massasoit) made a treaty with (John) Carver [the first governor of the colony]. They elected an official while they were still on the boat. They had their charter. They were still under the jurisdiction of the king [of England]—at least that's what they told us. So they couldn't make a treaty for a boatload of people, so they made a treaty between two nations—England and the Wampanoag Nation.

It basically said we'd let them be there and we would protect them against any enemies, and they would protect us from any of ours. So, the Pilgrims didn't invite the Wampanoags to sit down and eat turkey and drink

Ah, no. Well, let's put it this way. People did eat together [but not in what is portrayed as "the first Thanksgiving]. It was our homeland and our territory, and we walked all through their villages all the time. The differences in how they behaved, how they ate, how they prepared things were a lot for both cultures to work with each other.

So, you did eat together sometimes, but not at the legendary Thanksgiving meal.

No. We were there for days. And this is another thing: We give thanks more than once a year in formal ceremonies for different season, for the green corn thanksgiving, for the arrival of certain fish species, whales, the first snow, our new year in May—there are so many ceremonies, and I think most cultures have similar traditions. It's not a foreign concept and I think human beings who recognize greater spirit than they would have to say thank you in some formal way.

So, in reading this story of the first Thanksgiving and what really happened I think Abraham Lincoln was a smart man to put together the story of the first Thanksgiving the colonists shared with the Wampanoag people. The story united people during the Civil War and since then.

We as a country get together at Thanksgiving and give thanks to our family and friends for what we have and what our country has given to us. I know in these hard times it is not easy to give thanks, but we must remember that we are all family and that we are "ONE NATION UNDER GOD, INDIVISIBLE, WITH LIBERTY AND JUSTICE FOR ALL."

I hope that all of you in our Desertscape Community spend time with your family and friends this year at Thanksgiving time and enjoy each other's company and friendship.


days and times. The pool is open with water exercise each morning at ten o'clock come and join your friends and meet new neighbors.



The date of this event is November 15 2025, from 5:30 pm to we run out of wine. (5:30pm to 8:00pm)


In the past the turn out for our Wine and Cheese night have been really good. We are hoping this event will be the same.

Autumn Harvest Beef Stew: An Incredible Essential Recipe for Fall

AUTHOR: CHEF ELLIE GRACE | TOTAL TIME: 2 HOURS 30 MINUTES



Ingredients

- 2 pounds beef chuck, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 large onion, diced
- · 3 cloves garlic, minced
- · 4 cups beef broth
- 2 cups carrots, sliced
- 2 cups potatoes, diced
- 1 cup parsnips, diced

- 1 cup celery, diced
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 2 teaspoons dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary
- 1 bay leaf
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- Fresh parsley, chopped (for garnish)

Step-by-Step Instructions

Making Autumn Harvest Beef Stew is straightforward if you follow these steps:

- Brown the Beef: Heat olive oil in a large pot over medium-high heat. Add beef cubes in batches to avoid overcrowding. Sear until browned on all sides. Remove and set aside.
- 2. Sauté Aromatics: In the same pot, add the diced onion and garlic. Sauté for 3–4 minutes until the onion becomes translucent.
- **3.** Add Tomato Paste: Stir in tomato paste and cook for an additional minute, allowing it to caramelize slightly and enhance its flavor.
- 4. **Deglaze:** Pour in a splash of beef broth. Scrape the bottom of the pot to release any browned bits. This adds flavor to the stew.
- 5. **Return Beef**: Add the browned beef back into the pot along with the remaining beef broth.

- **6.** Add Vegetables: Incorporate carrots, potatoes, parsnips, and celery into the mixture.
- **7. Season:** Add dried thyme, rosemary, bay leaf, and season with salt and pepper.
- 8. Simmer: Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low.

 Cover and let the stew simmer for about 2 hours or until the beef is tender.
- Adjust Seasoning: Taste and adjust seasoning as necessary, removing the bay leaf before serving.
- **10. Garnish:** Serve hot, garnished with fresh parsley for a touch of color.

By following these clear steps, you ensure that your Autumn Harvest Beef Stew turns out rich in flavor and delightful in every bite.






