Update – Diesel Emergency Generator Air Permitting in Washington *Mark Landau, Air Quality Permitting Specialist*

Landau Associates

This presentation will provide a topic update on the air permitting process for emergency generators. In a chapter meeting in 2019, Mark highlighted the contrasting requirements throughout Washington State – where in Grant and Douglas counties the air permitting process for emergency generators is considered to be one of the most onerous in the nation versus in King County, where there is no permitting requirement at all.

In this presentation, Mark will provide a brief overview of the air permitting process in Washington, an update on regulatory changes (both recently-enacted and future-anticipated), and a discussion about air-related compliance challenges that data centers face.

About the Speaker

Mark is an air quality permitting specialist and project manager with over 14 years of experience navigating the air quality regulatory process in Washington and Oregon. He has extensive experience with air quality permitting for diesel emergency generators and preparing human health risk assessment documentation, which is required by multiple clean air agencies in Washington and Oregon when installing diesel emergency generators at a site.

Building and Fire Codes related to the design, installation and use of battery systems to store electrical energy continue to evolve as new technologies emerge and code authorities revise their approaches on how to regulate these systems in buildings. The 2021 versions of the International Building Code and International Fire Code, which will be adopted by the State of Washington in 2023, have been significantly revised with regard to the use of batteries in buildings such as data centers.


