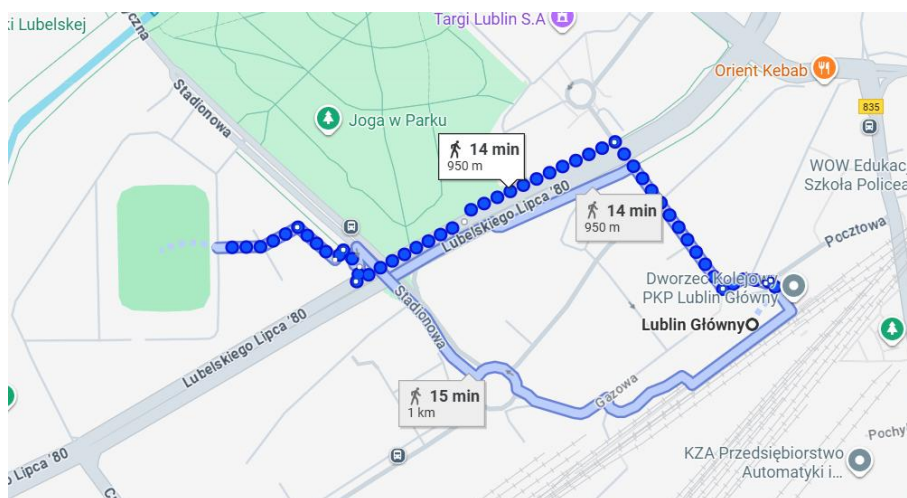

Our local contact who lives in Lublin has provided the following info

Lublin is a friendly city, and I haven't heard any foreign fans had any problems here – you are advised not to wear any Che Guevara or other communist wear - as that would be the only thing that could cause any problems in any city in Poland

As for the body searches - they're carried by the security not the police, and as far as we've had all the Dynamo matches here - they haven't been too invasive - they usually will ask you to turn back to them, quickly tap from arms to legs and if anyone has any bag - ask to open it. Please remember - you probably won't be allowed to take a big backpack to the stand - they will need to be given to deposit .

As many of your fans might come to Lublin by train from Warsaw or other cities - it is good to know that the Main Train station is called LUBLIN GŁÓWNY and it is about 14 minutes walking distance from the stadium



As for the Russians invading our airspace - Lublin Airport has been locked in both instances as we are very close to the Ukrainian and Belarussian border and a huge amount of the drones came to our region - the city hasn't been affected itself. If anyone would be concern about the airport I would suggest Warsaw Chopin (WAW), Warsaw Radom (RDO) - both the closest to Lublin, or even Rzeszów (RZE) and Kraków (KRK) - those two are about 4 hours train travel from Lublin. However again - we haven't been affected straight by the Russian drones - but our airport might be used by the military if needed - so then it would be closed but the flights are always transferred to the closest Airport possible in such a situation
