Dear Neighbors,

One of the many questions received by the officers and Board members is what is the status of the 1215 York Road property? The owners had gone to a Baltimore County Development Review Committee (DRC) last November. The DRC is composed of representatives from each of those departments involved in land-use

decision so designated by their directors to represent their respective departments. They approved the request of the owners to build on the property a Royal Farms with electric charging stations.

At this time the DVIA board has voted to retain an attorney to appeal the decision that was approved in early December. There is concern with this process, the checks and balances as well as future communications during the build. We are waiting for the hearing date and compiling information in preparation. We will keep the community abreast of all.

The Dulaney Valley Improvement Association is a social welfare non-profit organization for the Dulaney Village neighborhood.

Members of the Dulaney Valley Improvement Association include those 634 residences and properties that reside within the area formed by the intersection of York Rd. (45) and Seminary Rd., Seminary Rd. and Dulaney Valley Rd. (146) and the Baltimore Beltway (I-695), and the Baltimore Beltway (I-695) and York Rd. (45).

The DVIA Board consists of five officers who are elected to one-year terms during our January meeting. Those positions are President, Vice President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding

Secretary. Each position carries voting rights. There are also a number of general Board Members who are not officers who hold voting rights at all DVIA meetings. A motion is made by a Senior Officer to appoint an individual to the Board, and, pending an approval vote by the other Board Members, the individual becomes a Board Member. Members interesting in running for an elected officer position must submit their name for consideration before the October meeting. Meetings are held on the second Monday of each month (except for July and August).

Membership in the DVIA is voluntary, and open to any persons residing in the aforementioned boundaries. Dues are annual and donations are greatly appreciated. All funds go toward providing community services for residents, including seasonal activities, community gatherings, yard sales, community decoration, and general improvements to our community. The DVIA Board is a committed group of volunteer residents from our community who work tirelessly to ensure the highest quality of living for our community members.
