Message from the President



Hello neighbors! Fall is upon us with leaf raking, back to school, and preparing your home for the upcoming winter and holiday seasons. A quick reminder while you are walking your dog in the community, please kindly pick up after your dog. Please also note, do not walk your dog on the school property while school is in session. Our students use the fields throughout the day and encountering either the presence of a dog or the dog waste can interfere with the class programs.

As you are aware, the community has been actively involved with the concerns for the 1301 York Road and 1215 York Road properties. The DVIA Zoning Committee, board members, and I have met with Councilman Kach to learn of the options for zoning in the area. Currently the DVIA Board is awaiting further communication to discuss the planning of the area with the owners and/or their attorneys. The DVIA Board has expressed as many of our neighbors to Councilman Kach the concerns with the original plans for apartment buildings.

While the process might feel frustrating, it is a long-term investment in the community. We, your DVIA Board, are fully invested and committed to the process. At this time, the 2020 Baltimore County Comprehensive Zoning Map Process (CZMP) has begun. The process for CZMP began with online Public prefiling from August 19<sup>th</sup> - 30<sup>th</sup>. From September 3<sup>rd</sup> to October 15<sup>th</sup> the Open Filing Period began. This is where we are now, watching for any indication from the owners of the properties.

The next phase is the Planning Board & Planning Direct filing period from October 1<sup>st</sup> -15<sup>th</sup>. The County Council filing period is November 1<sup>st</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>. The Agency Review begins December 1<sup>st</sup> to January 31<sup>st</sup>. Moving into 2020, begins work sessions and then finally in June begin the public hearings. September of 2020 will be the County Council Vote.

As we move through the CZMP process, we will inform the community regarding assistance with letter writing, calling, and emailing to the councilman, the planning board, and county executive. Currently, each is aware that the community does not agree with the apartment buildings.

The DVIA community has been a strong voice with expressing the concerns for development in the community to our public officials. Thank you for your continued support for the community.
