Goal

To provide opportunity to our young people so they can use their own initiative to benefit themselves and their community

History

The late 1960's were a tumultuous time in America. Two men paid the ultimate price for their belief in equality of opportunity—Senator Robert F. Kennedy and Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. were assassinated. Visionary residents of Contra Costa County moved by these events founded a living memorial to continue the fight for equal opportunity. Forty-nine years later the Kennedy-King Memorial College Scholarship Fund continues to seek opportunity in education for all.

Scholars

Scholarship recipients are drawn from the three Contra Costa community colleges—Contra Costa College, Diablo Valley College, and Los Medanos College. The Kennedy King Memorial Scholarship Fund, Ltd., has been awarding scholarships to socially, educationally, and economically disadvantaged students since 1969.

Scholarship Awards

Kennedy-King awards two-year \$12,000 undergraduate scholarships, and one-year \$6,000 graduate scholarships. The fundamental requirement is that students are matriculating from one of the three County community colleges to a four-year degree granting university.

Outcomes

Since 1968 Kennedy-King has awarded 956 scholarships totaling almost \$6.2 million. Prior recipients are now contributing members of the local community as medical professionals, lawyers, teachers, engineers, scientists, business men and women, and government officials. Three former scholarship recipients now contribute as members of the Kennedy-King Board of Directors. As an all-volunteer organization Kennedy-King continues to use over 95% of contributed funds for scholarships.

Summary

The Kennedy-King scholarship goes to students of proven need, ability, and desire to succeed. Kennedy-King's 54-year history of success ensures that your donation will provide the intended benefits—a college education for a worthy student, and community benefit for Contra Costa.




MARISA KLAPPERICH Diablo Valley College

"From an early age, life was an endless cycle of perseverance. One of my earliest memories was getting home one day after school to a police officer stopping us at our front door and preventing us from entering our home. We had been unjustifiably evicted and, because my parents were undocumented, legal action was something they were too scared to take. From then on, money had always been tight, but my parents had never once made it seem like that. For that I will forever be grateful.

"Growing up as part of the Latinx community, asking for help was considered a 'sign of vulnerability' which was embedded in my head at an early age. With the minimal education from my parents and language barrier, school was 10-times harder. Everything from asking for help on class work, financial aid, supplies, etc. was an adjustment to what I had ever known growing up. Characterize the meaning of receiving the Kennedy-King Scholarship on your college experience and on your career.


