#### Edmund L. Regalia Scholarship for Continuing Students

The Regalia Scholarship is an exciting addition to the opportunities offered to Kennedy-King eligible students who are still in community college. Initiated in 2017-18 the Regalia Scholarship supports those students who are most at-risk of leaving college after their first year , most often due to the pursuit of work that provides for their family. The scholarship offers assistance for tuition and books, but also wraps around unmet needs like rent, food or transportation.

I used the Regalia Scholarship award to pay for books, tuition, notebooks, gas and a parking permit. The award is not just one less worry for me, but also one less worry for my father as well."

The Regalia Scholarship will help me bridge current financial challenges that could have inhibited my pursuit of my passion for science."


ticipants as the keynote speaker. The event provided our scholarship recipients with a view into working for an energy company. It was a big success!


