

The EUSPBA MidAtlantic Branch hosts the Delco MidAtlantic Workshop in Baltimore the weekend of February 2&3, 2008. In addition to a weekend of workshops, the MidAtlantic branch hosts the Robert Gilchrist Challenge. This is an Under 21 Piobaireachd challenge which is held on the Saturday of the workshop. competitor submits four piobaireachd and plays one in the morning competition. The top six competitors compete again in the afternoon. The winner of the competition receives airfare to compete in the MacGregor Memorial competition at the Argyllshire Gathering in Scotland.

Also, in February, the Metro Branch hosts the Metro Cup competition. This event draws some of the best players in the world. This year's competition will be held February 16, 2008, in Newark, New Jersey. SET TUNES-2008

In previous newsletters, we presented the 2006 & 2007 Set Tunes. In June 2007, The Piobaireachd Society has issued the 2008 Set Tune list. A copy is available from the website for download, but a list of the tunes is also available here.

The Highland Society of London Gold Medals have long been considered the top prizes in solo competition. The Highland Society of London Gold Medals are the top prize offered at the Argyllshire Gathering in Oban and at the Northern Meeting, formerly at Inverness, and now currently being held at Aviemore. A piper can only win the gold medal at each of these competitions once. After winning the gold medal, the piper is eligible to compete in the Senior Piobaireachd events (The Senior Piobaireachd at Oban or The Clasp at the Northern Meeting).

In the 1970's, the field of competitors for the Gold Medal became too large to handle so the Silver Medal competitions were created as a stepping stone to the Gold Medal.

The Piobaireachd Society has been charged with creating a list of Set Tunes for these competitions. They change the tunes from year to year so that different tunes will be guaranteed play time. The list of Set Tunes also defines the expected level of difficulty for each of the three contests.

This year, the Senior Competition Set Tune list is comprised of modern tunes. The Gold & Silver Medal Tune list is made up of some very popular tunes.

THE PIOBAIREACHD SOCIETY OF CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA SOLO PIPING COMPETITION

We have been running a solo piping competition in the central PA area since 1998. However, this is only the second year that the competition was held under The Piobaireachd Society of Central Pennsylvania. This was the largest competition that we have fielded in terms of competitors, events, and judges.



After a schedule conflict last year, we were able to schedule our event in conjunction with the Pipes & Drums Festival once again. This is an event sponsored by the Scottish Society of Central Pennsylvania. It is an event which highlights some of the local pipe bands. This year featured the Zembo Highlanders of Harrisburg, PA, and the Guilford & Glencoe District Juvenile Pipe Band of Towson, Maryland.

The event is held at the historic Fort Hunter Mansion & Park just north of Harrisburg along the Susquehanna River.

One of the draws to the competition here in central PA is the wide-range of sanctioned events offered. We offer the full gamut of events. In addition to the standard Piobaireachd & March, Strathspey & Reel events, we also offer 6/8 March and Hornpipe/Jig events, as well as, Slow March for Grade IV. The events are sanctioned by the Eastern United States Pipe Band Association.

As mentioned earlier, this year we had a record 73 competitors signed up for the events. We had five piping judges, and for the first time, we had a snare drumming judge. This year was the first year for EUSPBA-sanctioned solo amateur snare drumming events. In addition, we added four unsanctioned events. We hosted a Drum Salute contest for any drum corps that wanted to present a drum salute. In addition, we had Piping Quartet competition.

As we are a piobaireachd society, we offered two unsanctioned piobaireachd events to encourage the performance of rarely heard tunes. We held a Short Tune competition and a Modern Tune competition. The short tune competition consisted of a list of tunes that have been

composed with no taorluath or crunluath. The competitor had to pick a tune from a list compiled by the society. For the modern tune competition, the competitor had to submit and play a tune composed since 1920.

Unlike the cold, windy weather we had in 2006, this year's competition was a beautiful day to play the pipes. The Piobaireachd Society of Central Pennsylvania would like to thank the many volunteers who helped make the competition happen: Thompson & Betsy McConnell, Tom & Jeanine McConnell, John & Sylvia Smrz, Tom & Margaret Thomson, Roxanne Dean, and the Scottish Society of Central PA.

The Judges for the competition included David Bailiff, Duncan Bell, Paula Glendinning, Chris Hamilton, and John Wassman. Our drumming events were judged by Jon Quigg.

Next year's competition will be held June 14, 2008, at the Fort Hunter Mansion and Park.

"AN INTRODUCTION TO PIOBAIREACHD"

The Piobaireachd Society of Central Pennsylvania held its 3rd Annual "Introduction to Piobaireachd" workshop on November 3, 2007, in Lititz, Pennsylvania. This workshop is designed as a beginner's introduction to piobaireachd. The workshop includes an introduction to the history of piobaireachd & piobaireachd competition. We briefly covered the classification and structure of piobaireachd.



The workshop was led by Thompson McConnell. Those in attendance included Andrew Chalfoun (Maryland), James Diener (Pennsylvania), Karen Helm (Pennsylvania), Dave Kolmer (Virginia), Sherry Kreamer (Pennsylvania), Marla McKenna (Virginia), Marty McKeon (Pennsylvania), and John Morrison (Pennsylvania).

We covered the "Lament for the Old Sword." This lament, as indicated by the title, elegizes a sword which had valiantly served its owners in many



campaigns but was sadly no longer of use in battle. It must be remembered that there was great reverence for weapons in Gaelic tradition and therefore this is a worthy subject.

One legend holds that this was the sword with which Carrabberi Ruadh killed Oscar [brother of Ossian dall, the last of the Fiann] and which he subsequently used in all his battles eventually bringing it to Kintyre. His descendents were both the Lords of Kintyre and Kings of the Isles, and the sword is said to have been in the hands of one or other of these families for several centuries. According to tradition, this lament was composed by the last owner to express its plaintive cry now that it no longer served in battle.

At each workshop, The Piobaireachd Society of Central Pennsylvania opens up the floor for anyone interested in playing a piobaireachd for the group. Four pipers performed.
