

Direct Tax Rebate Payments

The Minnesota Department of Revenue has begun sending direct tax rebate payments of up to \$1,300 for tax year 2021 to eligible Minnesotans. Legislation signed in May provides payments of:

- \$520 for married couples filing a joint return with adjusted gross income of \$150,000 or less
- \$260 for all other individuals with adjusted gross income of \$75,000 or less
- Another \$260 for each dependent claimed on your return, up to three dependents (\$780)

We are sending direct deposit payments first, followed by paper checks in the mail. We expect to issue 2.1 million rebate payments by the end of September.

We used previously filed 2021 income tax or property tax refund returns to determine who is eligible and payment amounts.

What Happens Next

For most recipients, we'll send the rebate payment to the bank account or mailing address on your 2021 income tax or property tax refund return. If you updated your bank, address, or refund method with us in July, we'll use the information you provided.

- **Direct Deposit:** Payments will be deposited in your bank account starting in late-August. The payment will appear as "State of Minnesota 2021 Tax Rebate Program" on your bank statement.
- **Paper Check:** Checks will be delivered by mail starting in early-September and continuing through the rest of the month. Checks will be mailed in a plain white envelope and are protected by standard banking safeguards to help detect and prevent fraud.

If you think you are eligible for the rebate but did not receive it by October, review the eligibility requirements on this page. If you're eligible for a payment, a customer representative can look into your situation. Email mntaxrebate@submittable.com or call 651-565-6595.

Who is Eligible

You are eligible if you met all of the following requirements:

- You were a Minnesota resident for part or all of 2021
- You filed one of the following returns by December 31, 2022:
 - [2021 Form M1](#), Minnesota Individual Income Tax
 - [2021 Form M1PR](#), Homestead Credit Refund (for Homeowners) and Renter's Property Tax Refund
- Your 2021 adjusted gross income (line 1 of Form M1 or Form M1PR) was:
 - \$150,000 or less for married joint filers
 - \$75,000 or less for all other filers
- You were not claimed as a dependent on someone else's 2021 Minnesota income tax return

Taxpayers who died before January 1, 2023, are not eligible.

Common Questions

I chose Direct Deposit. Why did I get a paper check?

We may still mail a paper check in some cases to ensure you receive the payment, such as:

- If a direct deposit is returned due to a banking error or incorrect bank account information.
- If you elected to have tax preparation fees deducted from your 2021 tax refund.

Can I track the status of my rebate payment?

No. This rebate payment is being processed outside the usual tax refund processing system so it will not show up in the Where's My Refund? system.

Is the rebate payment taxable?

This payment is not taxable on your Minnesota income tax return and will not be taken to pay any unpaid tax or debts we collect for other agencies.

We've requested guidance from the IRS to determine if the rebate is taxable on your federal return, and will relay their decision when we receive it.

What if I lived in Minnesota for only part of 2021?

Part-year residents receive a portion of the rebate based on their income in Minnesota. For example, if 25% of your 2021 income came from Minnesota, you will receive 25% of the rebate amount.
