The Dining Car

At the request of several members, a new section has been added to the consist: a dining car, where you can share your favorite dishes with club members. Many are just dying to try them out, after sampling your signature dish at a recent club meeting. Send entries to the editor. A simple recipe, instructions, and if possible, a photo to entice your fellow members to give it a try!

Deborah's Coca Cola Cake

1 cup butter 3 tablespoons cocoa $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups marshmallows 1 cup Coca Cola

In a sauce pan melt butter, and add 3 tablespoons of cocoa, Coca Cola and marshmallows. Stir and bring to a boil. Boil for 1 minute. Stir until all marshmallows are melted. Let cool. (I usually put mine in the freezer while I am working on the next two steps).

2 cups sugar

2 cups self-rising flour

Mix these two ingredients together in a mixing bowl.

½ cup milk

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix together.

When ingredients in freezer have cooled so they won't cook the eggs, add them to the flour and sugar, stirring as you add them. Next add milk and egg mixture stirring thoroughly.

Bake at 350 degrees. I check after 30 minutes to see if done by inserting a toothpick.

If not, I bake 5 more minutes and check with a toothpick.

Icing:

½ cup butter 3 Tablespoons cocoa

6 Tablespoons Coca Cola

Bring ingredients to a boil while stirring, and boil 1 minute. Remove from heat.

Add 1 box of powdered sugar a little at a time while stirring.

When all has been added, add 1 teaspoon vanilla. Then I get out my hand mixer and mix well to incorporate all the lumps.

Optional: 1 cup of chopped pecans may be added to the icing if you like nuts. I usually put them in the microwave for about a minute to bring out their flavor before adding.








Georgia Garden Railroader of the Year Nominations Requested

- Open Air Coach in Lake Placid, a newly converted and semi-enclosed passenger car offering bench-style seating and 360-degree viewing of the passing landscape. Prices will vary based on the trip.


