



Minutes - GGRS March 22, 2025 Annual Business Meeting

At approximately 12:30 p.m. GGRS Past President, Terry Manning, called the membership to order for the Annual Business Meeting at Provino's Italian Restaurant, Kennesaw, GA.

Election of Officers – Terry Manning resigned as President of the Georgia Garden Railway Society on January 18, 2025 in the presence of GGRS Board Members Dennis Bass, Pam Williamson, Ginny Manning and Dan Steidle. Ted Yarborough was notified by phone and accepted the role as President. At today's meeting, John Lees, presented a slate of officers for the Executive Board: Ted Yarborough, President; Terry Manning, Treasurer; Pam Williamson, Secretary; Members at Large Emil Decker, John Lank, Ginny Manning, and Dan Steidle. A vote was taken and unanimously approved.

Membership - Executive Board Member and Membership Coordinator, Ginny Manning, gave a membership update. We currently have 84 family memberships and 10 outstanding renewals.

Garden Railroader of the Year – There were two strong nominations, from the Membership, for Garden Railroader of the Year. Two awards were presented:

Railroader of the Year – was awarded to Ginny Manning for the work she has done to grow and retain membership by attending GGRS events and manning the membership table to promote the Society.

Railroad Family of the Year - was awarded to Peter and Lori Thomas for their participation at Club layouts (Paw Patrol, touch me train, coordination with other train clubs) serving as Web Master, and always promoting Garden Railroading.

Conventions – there are 2 conventions this year

Nation Garden Railway Convention – June 18 – 22, 2025 Sacramento, CA. This year's convention car is an Engine and Caboose. The Sacramento Valley Railroad Society is working on a display showcasing all 40 years of NGRC cars. They currently have all but two.

Big Train Operator Club Convention – July 13 – 18 Helen, Georgia. Ted Yarborough has been assisting the BTO lining up layout tours and 1:1 train rides. To attend the convention, you must be a member of the BTO (\$50.00 p/year for a family membership). As the convention is right here in Georgia, let's have a strong GGRS presence.

2025 Club Meetings - The first Club Meeting of 2025 will be held April 12th at the Chatworth Depot. This meeting will be held in conjunction with the Model Train Expo. GGRS will set up two or three loops of track outdoors on the concrete pad beside the depot to run trains throughout the day for visitors to the depot. Lori Thomas will have her Paw Patrol layout and Leslie Ann Bundy will have her Easter layout in addition to the Club free-style layout.

Club Layouts – There are ongoing discussions about GGRS sponsored layouts. In the past, the Society had secured track to large wooden modules that could be configured to fit the space we were allotted for a layout. As venues have changed and space has been reduced, the large wooden modules were no longer needed and the Society transitioned to a free-style layout. In July of 2023 the modules were dismantled. We are now exploring the idea of selling the trailer and housing the free-style layout at the home of a Society Member.

The Vines - Dennis Bass gave an update on the Vines; a 79-acre Gwinnett County Park in Loganville with an outdoor G-scale garden railroad. Trains run on over 1,000 feet of track and a 25-foot bridge. Several GGRS members coordinate the running of the trains on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month from 10:00 A.M. 2:00 P.M. May through September. Volunteers are need to assist with spring clean-up in April and monthly running of the trains. Please contact Dennis Bass mail4bassde@gmail.com or 404-312-7942. Due to park renovation the Vines Railroad may be closed in 2026, so make sure to come out this year to see a great railroad.

Miscellaneous – John Lees showcased his book on his Southern Railroad X376 Caboose which was a long-term project started in 2006 when it was moved to the Lees side yard. (If you haven't seen the caboose, and you should, it is one of the layouts on the BTO yard tours).

Roy Williamson advised the membership on a couple of issues:

The Springfield Massachusetts 2026 National Garden Railway Convention is officially cancelled. There will be a train show, but no layouts, no banquet or train rides.

The May GGRS Club Meeting in Huntsville, AL is being billed as a Tri - State G-Scale Meetup. In addition to GGRS attending, the Nashville Area Garden Railroaders and the Alabama Boys (they do not have a formal club) will all be in attendance.

The GGRS Club Meeting at the new *Trainz* facility will be held in November.

At approximately 12:45 p.m. the meeting was adjourned; lunch was served follow by a lively gift exchange.

Banta 1:20 Scale Beaver Creek Fire Department by Ted Yarbrough

I recently completed the Banta Model Works Beaver Creek Fire Department. The kit is shipped well packaged and has wonderful photo and text instructions. It is rather easy but enjoyable to assemble (I have put together several laser cut kits including one other from this manufacturer in the past).



Be careful separating a few of the small laser cuttings as I broke a couple, but was able to glue them back without any structural problems. The only complaint is that the laser scrubbing on the two front doors could be a little deeper as once paint was applied, even in light coats, they pretty much became invisible.

Each assembly is packaged together.



Sub assembly. I used naming tape to help hold building together until wood glue dried completely.

Painting & details

I like the fact you can have the windows closed or open to any setting you desire, making for a good option so the windows do not all have to be identical. Instructions show front doors red, but after painting them this way, I decided to repaint them white for more contrast. Lots of options and overall great addition to any garden railroad town.

GGRS 1:1 Scale Train Rides!

There will be **THREE GGRS 1:1 Scale Train Rides for 2025!** Come ride a real train with other garden railroaders. The first ride is coming quickly on the Tennessee Valley Railroad's Copper Hill Special set for Saturday, May 31. This ride will be diesel powered and follow the Hiawassee River from Delano, Tennessee to Copper Hill, Tennessee. This train excursion will take you to the apex of

the renowned Hiwassee Loop. Witness this incredible railway marvel near Farner, Tennessee, where the tracks intriguingly cross over themselves as they spiral up the mountain. Notably, there are only six such loops in North America, with this one being the sole example east of the Mississippi River. Copper Hill is located on the Georgia state line (the line actually runs right through the middle of town). We will be seated in the traditional coach seats. The train will have about a 90-minute layover so you can eat lunch and explore the town before the return trip. The train leaves at 9:30 and returns at 5:30. Tickets cost \$75.00 for adults and \$45.00 for children under 13 years old and must be ordered in advance (tickets are non-refundable, but can be transferred to another person if someone else wants to go in your place). Mail a check, made out to Ted Yarbrough, to Ted Yarbrough, 212 Love Drive, Chatsworth, GA 30705 by APRIL 27 to secure your seat on the Copper Hill Special.




The second & third rides will be with the BTO Convention in Helen, Georgia this July. To help support the BTO, we will be riding on their scheduled train trips. The first BTO trip will be Monday, July 14 on the Blue Ridge Scenic Railway. This trip will carry passengers from the city of Blue Ridge, Georgia to the border town of McCaysville, Georgia. This is on the old L&N Hook and Eye Line. You will have about 90 minutes for lunch at the



Bura-Bura Riverfront Restaurant (included in your ticket) and exploring the state line town of Copper Hill, Tennessee. The train will then return to Blue Ridge. Bus transportation is included and there will be DOOR PRIZES on the trip back to Helen. I will ride this trip because I will be taking my great nephews and it is more child appropriate in that it is a shorter bus ride and train ride.

The second BTO train ride will be on Thursday, July 17 on the Great Smoky Mountain Railroad Nantahala Trip. This ride will be in crown class and include a box lunch. This is a very scenic ride to the Nantahala

Outdoor Center and return. Steam power is anticipated for this train ride. Bus transportation is included with DOOR PRIZES on the return trip. This is one of my favorite train rides in the Eastern US. In order to ride with the BTO, you must be a member of their group and register for the convention (order tickets on the convention form at www.bigtrainoperator.com).

Want some railroad history related to North Georgia? What was the Civil War's "Great Locomotive Chase"? Where are those locomotives today? Who received the nation's first "Medals of Honor"?

Come to the Thursday, July 17 BTO Clinic at 7 p.m. and meet Union secret agent James J. Andrews and his nemesis, Confederate Conductor William A. Fuller, as they describe the thrilling account of the theft and recovery of the locomotive, "The General" and the 90-mile chase from Atlanta to Chattanooga.

The plan was to steal a train on its run north towards Chattanooga, stopping to damage or destroy track, bridges, telegraph wires, and track switches behind them, so as to prevent the Confederate Army from being able to move troops and supplies from Atlanta to Chattanooga. But as one would expect, the plans started to fall apart as soon as they were implemented.

This presentation will give you the full story from the gentlemen themselves.....(well, perhaps from their ghosts) and direct you to the most interesting train drama from the Civil War, or as we here in the south call it, "The war of Yankee aggression".


