

# Georgia Goes to Alabama to meet Tennessee....& It's not SEC Football !

Our May Member Event was out of this World....Country?....Okay, would you believe state? We're just back from the Huntsville, Alabama area, where we made the long distance drive to attend a Tri-State meeting.

Our May Club Meeting was held at the home of Jenny & Grant Sweer's. This was our first Tri-State Club Meeting; GGRS, Nashville Area Garden Railroaders and the Grant Funk Alabama Railroaders. From the fun and fellowship enjoyed by all, I doubt it will be our last.



Construction on the Grant Funk Railroad started in May of 2018 and was fully functional for the NGRA 2021 convention. It is a raised railroad with over 1000 feet of bridge works, powered track with 3 loops and one pointto-point reversing section that will become a full loop in the future.

There are 3 rail

yards in the planning. The lower three tracks run any train and railroad we want with no historical representation what so ever. If it looks good, we run it. The top track is more slated narrow gauge and late 1800s style railroads. The lower two tracks minimum diameter is 10ft, mid-level railroad has 18ft minimum diameter.

Grant started his collection in 2005 buying mix and match consists to run for fun hence the name of the railroad.

Jenny tries to use mainly perennial plants on the railroad. There are many varieties of creeping thyme such as wooly, red, white, highland cream, and elfin. Some other plants are Turkish speedwell, ajuga, creeping jenny, dianthus, baby's breath, Calluna heather, snow in the summer, mazus, creeping angel wire, purple verbena, and lots of different sedums and hens and chicks. She can't even remember all the varieties she's got out there!

For trees, there are boxwoods, Japanese maples and hollies, rosemary and junipers that I've tried to bonsai, some of the dwarf trees from the Iseli Nursey in Oregon, Alberta Spruce and a Mugo Pine to name some of them. After a family vacation to Colorado, I fell in love with the narrow-gauge steam trains of the west. The large-scale train companies were beginning to introduce some American models and those were primarily Colorado narrow-gauge. I was hooked!

In 1990, I replaced the HO trains in the train room with a 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  X 9 table top oval complete with trees and buildings. I soon decided I needed more room and after looking at Garden Railways magazines, decided to build my first outdoor garden railroad in 1992.

I attended my first National Garden Railway Convention in Cincinnati in 1995 and met some fine folks from Georgia that were members of the Georgia Garden Railway Society. I joined up shortly after that and have enjoyed attending meetings and fellowshipping with members for years now. One of the highlights of my time in garden railroading was in 2004, when twenty members of the GGRS attended the National Garden Railway Convention in Denver (site of the very first convention and they know how to do a convention).

Another amazing time, but coupled with lots of work, was when GGRS hosted the 2018 National Garden Railway Convention and I served as co-chairman. I have had the privilege of attending 16 National Garden Railway Conventions plus a few other regional and national events. # Last Call GGRS 1:1 Scale Train Rides! By Ted Yarbrough

# **Rides!** By Ted Yarbrough

The first ride is coming VERY quickly on the Tennessee Valley Railroad's Copper Hill Special set for Saturday, May 31. This ride will be diesel powered and follow the Hiawassee River from Delano, Tennessee to Copper Hill, Tennessee. This train excursion will take you to the apex of the renowned Hiwassee Loop. Witness this incredible railway marvel near Farner, Tennessee, where the tracks intriguingly cross over themselves as they spiral up the mountain. Notably, there are only six such loops in North America, with this one being the sole example east of the Mississippi River. Copper Hill is located on the Georgia state line (it actually runs right through the middle of town). We will be seated in the traditional coach seats. The train will have about a 90-minute layover so you can eat lunch and explore the town before the return trip. The train leaves at 9:30



and returns at 5:30. Tickets with our group rate cost \$72.00 for adults and \$42.00 for children under 13 years old and must be ordered NOW BY PHONE with Olivia at Tennessee Valley Railroad and she can add you on to our group. Give her a call at 423-894 -8028 and let her know you are with the Ted Yarbrough May 31 group. Then let me know you have booked and I will get your tickets with the group and have them at the train (departing from 'Train Parking' pasture on HWY 411 in Delano, Tennessee-on right going north just past Hiwassee River).


The second & third rides will be with the BTO Convention in Helen, Georgia this July. To help support the BTO, we will be riding on their scheduled train trips. The first BTO trip will be Monday, July 14 on the Blue Ridge Scenic Railway. This trip will carry passengers from the city of Blue Ridge, Georgia to the border town of McCaysville, Georgia. This is on the old L&N Hook and Eye Line. You will have about 90 minutes for lunch in town (included in your ticket) and exploring the state line town of Copper Hill,



Tennessee. The train will then return to Blue Ridge. Bus transportation is included and there will be DOOR PRIZES on the trip back to Helen. I will ride this trip because I will be taking my great nephews and it is more child appropriate in that it is a shorter bus ride and train ride. The second BTO train ride will be on Thursday, July 17 on the Great Smoky Mountain Railroad Nantahala Trip. This ride will be in crown class and include a box lunch. This is a very scenic ride to the Nantahala Outdoor Center and return. Steam power is anticipated for this train ride. Bus transportation is included with DOOR PRIZES on the return trip. This is one of my favorite train rides in the Eastern US. To ride with the BTO, you must be a member of their group and register for the convention (order tickets on the convention registration form at www.bigtrainoperator.com). Registration deadline is soon approaching!!!!!

Accept our invitation to ride with the GGRS this year on a 1:1 Scale Train Ride. We have a great time and it is very enjoyable riding the full-size versions of the trains we model.



Want some railroad history related to North Georgia? What was the Civil War's "Great Locomotive Chase"? Where are those locomotives today? Who received the nation's first "Medals of Honor"?

Come to the Thursday, July 17 BTO Clinic at 7 p.m. and meet Union secret agent James J. Andrews and his nemesis, Confederate Conductor William A. Fuller, as they describe the thrilling account of the theft and recovery of the locomotive, "The General" and the 90-mile chase from Atlanta to Chattanooga.

The plan was to steal a train on its run north towards Chattanooga, stopping to damage or destroy track, bridges, telegraph wires, and track switches behind them, so as to prevent the Confederate Army from being able to move troops and supplies from Atlanta to Chattanooga. But as one would expect, the plans started to fall apart as soon as they were implemented.

This presentation will give you the full story from the gentlemen themselves.....(well, perhaps from their ghosts) and direct you to the most interesting train drama from the Civil War, or as we here in the south call it, "The war of Yankee aggression".




