## Irish Gift Exchange

As we prepare for the Annual Holiday Festivities, one that can be a lot of fun is the gift exchange. Old hands at this will know what I am talking about. Others may not and we want everyone interested in having fun, joining in. When I volunteered to play "<u>Cinder Claus</u>", "<u>Bodb Derg"</u> [pronounced: boôß 'djerg] it seemed many in the conversation didn't really know how it worked, or even what to call it. It goes by several names, but <u>Dirty Santa</u> is what it was called during Christmas. BUT CHRISTMAS IS PAST, So we turn Irish for St. Patrick's Day. Why not?

#### Here are the rules we use:

- Bring a gift. Since we belong to a Railroad Society, one would expect the gift to be RR related.....In our case, RR equipment, buildings, accessories, Garden items, tools, resources, there are millions of things. Pick something you have and decided you don't want or need. Or buy something if you want to keep everything you currently have stocked away in your basement.
- You can bring one gift for each member of the family who wishes to play, or one for your whole family. Each gift should be of a \$30 50 value range. Good used stuff works fine, and value is based on your discretion, but don't "cheap out" the final recipient of your prize.
- ⊗ Wrap it.
- 8 Bring it. You will place your gift into the pile in exchange for a Pot -O- Gold ticket, which will be used to determine order of precedence for the game. See <u>Bodb Derg</u> for the gift pile.
- ⊗ Once the game begins, <u>Bodb Derg</u>, that's me, will randomly draw a ticket. The holder of the ticket will be the first to play.
- ⊗ You will look at all the nice lovely wrapped gifts from out of the Pot -O- Gold, and choose one. Then unwrap it for all to behold & ooh and ah over.
- Now the fun begins. The next tickets drawn have two options. Pick a new, beautifully wrapped gift,....... Or steal a previously unwrapped gift, like the **Sidhe** stealing a child from it's crib!
  - ⊗ If you unwrap a new gift, it's like accepting a changeling. We move to the next ticket. If you steal another baby, the person from whom you stole gets to unwrap a new one. Or steal if there is an available un-stolen child,....er,...gift out there. And the fun continues .....
  - Stealing rule: Depending on who you play with, a gift may be stolen a set number or an unlimited number of times. This could make for a very long night. WE LIMIT STEALING OF A GIFT TO TWO TIMES. Once a gift is opened, stolen, then stolen again, it goes out of play. Bodb Derg will monitor.
  - A player may have their gift stolen, open a new one, then have it stolen, and on and on. Remember.
     A gift can be stolen only twice, but the holder of the gift may end up being stolen from time and again.... Luck of the Irish. Ask John Lees.
  - As the game progresses, a gift might be opened, NOT stolen for some turns, then get stolen later in the game, so even if you select early, your gift may get stolen later. Fear not. You then get to start all over again by stealing, or unwrapping anew.
- $\otimes$  The last ticket pulled signals final stages of the game.
- There should be one gift remaining in the pile. If the last ticket holder opens the last gift, ok. If they decide to steal from the available opened gifts, their victim can opt to steal or open the last gift.
- ⊗ Once the last gift is opened, one would think the stealing is done. But Noooooooo
- Now, the 1st ticket pulled, like a **Banshee wailing in the graveyard**, finally gets to get back into the game, and steal any still available un-stolen gift to finally end the game.




















### **How Paddie Built the Rails**

When President Abraham Lincoln signed the Pacific Railroad Act into law on July 1, 1862, the act gave two companies, the Union Pacific Railroad and the Central Pacific Railroad, responsibility for completing the transcontinental railroad. They were authorized extensive land grants and issued 30-year government bonds to finance the undertaking. Irish immigrants were among the primary builders of the Central Pacific Railroad.

By 1852 Ireland had lost nearly half its population due to the potato blight (a disease that killed the country's staple food crop). This caused a famine. While approximately 1 million Irish people perished from starvation, another 2 million abandoned the land in the largest single population movement of the 19th century. Nearly a quarter of the Irish nation, hundreds of thousands of Irish peasants, landed on the shores of the United States.

Herded like livestock in dark, cramped quarters, the Irish passengers lacked sufficient food and clean water. Nearly a quarter of the passengers who sailed to North America died at sea. Upon arrival, many exiles could progress no farther than within walking distance of the docks where they disembarked. In the opinion of many



Americans, the British were not sending their best people. These people were not like the industrious, Protestant Scotch-Irish immigrants who came to America in large numbers during the colonial era. They fought in the Continental Army and tamed the frontier. These people were not only poor, unskilled refugees huddled in rickety tenements, they were Catholic. The Irish were particularly vilified by the country's Anglo-Saxon Protestants who felt they were being invaded by the very Papist they left the continent of Europe to escape.

Anti-Irish mobs in Philadelphia destroyed houses and torched churches in the deadly Bible Riots of 1844. While the number of German immigrants entering the United States nearly matched that of the Irish during the 1850s, the Irish filled the most menial and dangerous jobs, often at low pay. They cut canals. They dug trenches for water and sewer pipes. They laid rail lines. They cleaned houses. They slaved in textile mills. They worked as stevedores, stable workers and blacksmiths.

The Irish immigrants became the primary early builders of the Central Pacific Railroad. Unfortunately however, management was not very

inspirational, and pay was not exactly high. This resulted in many Irish workers walked off the job. The Central Pacific Railroad then turned to Chinese laborers. By 1868, they numbered about 12,000, or 80 percent of the entire workforce. Central Pacific crews built 15 tunnels along the route. The longest tunnel, called the Summit, ran 1,659 feet. Despite the initial segregation and distrust, Irish and Chinese laborers worked together more and more as the miles of track piled up.





1852. A crew of predominantly Irish laborers completed the final link of the B & O, connecting the Ohio River Valley with the East Coast. The construction of railroads was hard, back-breaking work, and was carried out by the lowest members of society. For roughly \$25 a month, those laborers built some of the largest bridges and longest tunnels in the world at that time across steep and winding terrain.

The Logo of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad is featured toward the bottom of this monument in Wheeling, WV.
