It Was Chaos in CHOO CHOO Town I Tell You !



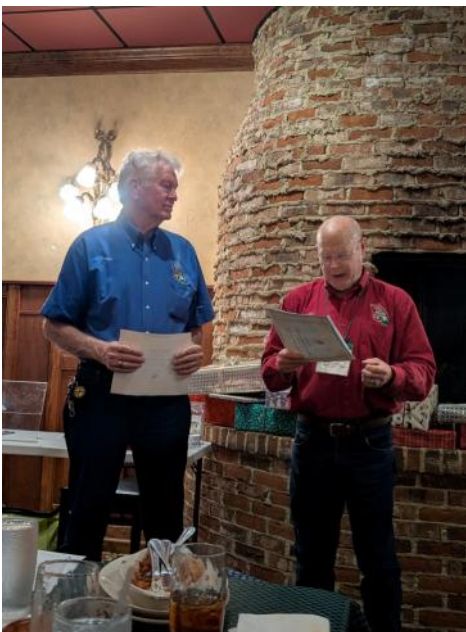

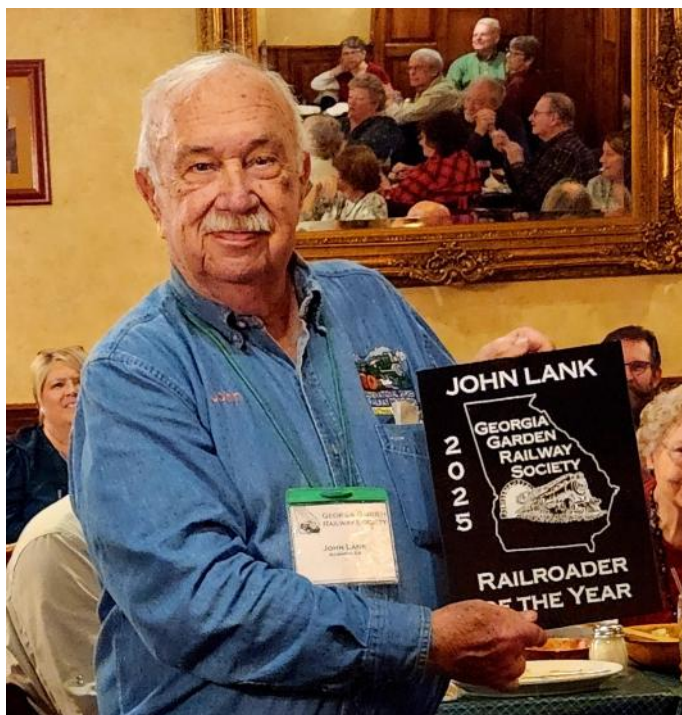

Coconut Pie

Linda Decker per Martha Meade

$\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Bacon (Emil says bacon goes with everything). Fry crispy and munch on while making the pie. . . . Keep fingers and pie filling clean.

1 stick butter
1 cup sugar
3 eggs, beaten
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup buttermilk
1 can/package flaked coconut (8 oz.)
Pinch of salt
 $\frac{1}{2}$ Tsp Vanilla (optional)
1 9" unbaked pie shell

Cream butter and sugar, add beaten eggs, and stir well.
Blend in all other ingredients.
Bake in 9" pie shell @ 300 degrees until set (approx. 40 min.)

A vote was taken and unanimously approved.

Garden Railroader of the Year – There were two strong nominations, from the Membership, for Garden Railroader of the Year. Two awards were presented:

Railroader of the Year – This person has excellent attendance at monthly membership meetings as well as at community and GGRS sponsored train shows. This person is helpful in recruiting new members at train shows, regularly assists in crowd control and layout operations at our train shows, and has been known to mentor new members. He has served on the Executive Board since 2020 (and has volunteered to serve again in 2026). As a Board member, he contributes greatly to the updating and revision of society policy. He has also been helpful in reducing our inventory of excess equipment over the last couple of years. He has and his wife Carolyn, helped plan our annual holiday meeting for several years. GGRS is proud to award Garden Railroader of the Year to John Lank.

Garden Railroader Family of the Year – This family regularly attends monthly GGRS meetings and often serve at the Membership Table when we host a table at area train shows, thus helping create our largest membership of almost 100 families this year. Both have opened their fantastic indoor layout to our members and to the public on several occasions this year, including a layout tour during the BTO convention. They have volunteered to serve as event coordinators for the Piedmont Division train show in 2026. Even as they travel to foreign nations on vacation, they serve as GGRS ambassadors by passing along GGRS themed gifts to overseas train engineers, conductors, and other staff. Dan has served effectively on the Board since 2023 with helpful input. GGRS is proud to award Garden Railroader Family of the Year to Dan and Carol Steidle.

At approximately 1:00 p.m. the meeting was adjourned, followed by a lively gift exchange game of "How the Grinch Stole Christmas".

Passenger Rail Plans Between Atlanta and Tennessee Cities Inch Forward

According to WSB, long-discussed plans for passenger rail service linking Atlanta to several major Tennessee cities are moving ahead, as planners focus on using existing rail infrastructure to keep costs down. Because high-speed rail is considered too expensive, planners are targeting conventional passenger service along current freight corridors to connect Atlanta with Chattanooga, Nashville, and Memphis.

Ellis Smith, who is helping lead the effort, says the main challenge has been scheduling passenger trains around slower-moving freight traffic. The proposed solution involves adding sidings, or sections of double track, so freight trains can move aside while passenger trains pass. "We're building sidings and double tracks so the freight trains can move over and the faster passenger train can pass them by," Smith said. "That's the whole game, that's what we're working on."

Smith recently spoke to the Chattanooga City Council, saying the project has buy-in from mayors along the route, as well as the Georgia Department of Transportation and the Tennessee Department of Transportation. He says planners have also held partnership discussions with Amtrak.

The project has federal funding attached and is now moving from planning into an engineering design phase. Smith estimates that phase could take about two years, though he says delivery timelines and total costs for the full project are still unclear. "We're using the existing rails that today already connect Chattanooga, Atlanta, Memphis, and Nashville," Smith said.

While additional investment will be needed in the years ahead, planners say the approach could make it feasible to launch passenger rail service in years rather than decades, potentially creating a new regional rail link between Georgia and Tennessee.

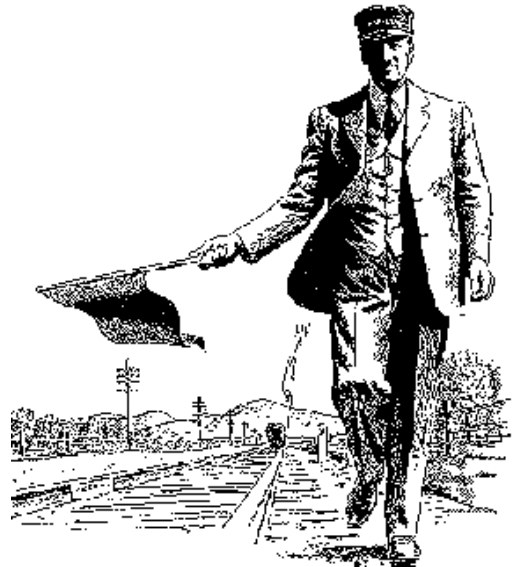
