A series about Great train robberies will appear in the next couple of issues. Which will be your favorite? Will you stage a scene on your railroad this year?

As a child, nothing was more exciting than a movie with a robber, (or a hero), riding a horse to chase down and climb aboard a steaming, smoking, wheel - spinning locomotive as it flew down the track. Hoofs pounding, horse straining, a quick grab to climb aboard the caboose

Oh the thrill! I can hear the heart pounding music even now. When did this "stock scene" in so many western's actually first happen?

Jesse James, the notorious outlaw, and his brother Frank are best remembered as bank robbers, but they were also the first gang to hold up a moving train. The earliest heist came on the evening of July 21, 1873, near Adair, Iowa.

Early in July the gang had learned that \$75,000 in gold from the Cheyenne region was to come through Adair on the recently built Chicago, Rock Island, & Pacific Railroad. Jesse sent his brother, Frank James, and Cole Younger to Omaha to learn when the gold shipment would arrive.

On the afternoon of the robbery, the bandits went to the section house and obtained some pies and other food from Mrs. Robert Grant, wife of the section foreman. Meanwhile, the rest of the gang broke into the handcar house, stole a spike-bar and hammer with which they pried off a fish-plate connecting two rails and pulled out the spikes.

As their target rounded a blind curve, the gang used a rope to dislodge the track, causing the locomotive to derail and topple into a ditch. The crash killed Engineer John Rafferty of Des Moines. The fireman, Dennis Foley, later died of his injuries. Several passengers were injured, but, as planned, the cars derailed and stopped on the tracks.

John Burgess, the express guard, was forced to open the safe. In it they only found \$2,000 in currency. The gold shipment had been delayed. They collected only about \$3,000, including money and loot taken from the passengers.

A train loaded with armed men left Council Bluffs for Adair and dropped small detachments of men along the route where saddled horses were waiting. The trail of the outlaws was traced into Missouri where they split up and were sheltered by friends. Later the governor of Missouri offered a \$10,000 reward for the capture of Jesse James, dead or alive.

The Adair robbery shocked the public for its sheer boldness, and went a long way toward establishing Jesse James' reputation as a celebrity criminal and folk hero.







From 1860 - 1882, the James Gang was the most feared band of outlaws in American history. They were responsible for more than 20 bank and train robberies and the murders of countless individuals who stood in their way. They stole an estimated \$200,000.

On April 3, 1882 Jesse James stepped up on a chair to dust a picture, and Robert Ford, a member of the gang, seized the opportunity to shoot James in the back of the head. The Ford brothers wired Gov. Crittenden to claim their reward and surrendered to authorities. They were charged with 1st degree murder, pleaded guilty and were sentenced to hang, but two hours later Crittenden granted a full pardon. Jesse James has been a popular hero and villain ever since; the subject of many books, movies, and even town festivals.

2021 Train Ride Votes Are Coming In

GGRS members have spoke (well, kind of). Two members want to take the Western Maryland new restoration ride, one wants Cass, one wants the Great Smoky Mountain's first class with meal, and one wants the Tennessee Valley Railroad's dinner train. I do not want to bare bad news, but we are not going to do all of those!

After contacting the Western Maryland Scenic Railroad, they could not give me a definite date or price for any excursions with the Baldwin Locomotive Works locomotive no.1309. This excursion would be pulled by a very unique locomotive that is just returning to service, but would be the trip farthest from the Metro Atlanta area. Hopefully, some members will venture out on their own and report back about their experiences with supporting photos.

That leaves Cass and the two first class train rides with meals. The GGRS attended the May, 2015 Railfan Weekend at Cass. 8 members made the trip and enjoyed the weekend riding and photographing the trains. There is not a railfan weekend this year. Mountain Rail West Virginia owns Cass Scenic Railroad (steam), Tygart Flyer (diesel), and Durbin Rocket (steam), with all three rides located about an hour from each other. It would be possible to ride all three in three days (plus a day driving up and a day driving back). This trip would involve several nights in hotels as well as a couple days driving and could get rather expensive. While this trip would take as long as the Western Maryland trip, more train rides would be available in the same timeframe.

September 2020 the GGRS embarked on an excursion with the Great Smoky Mountains Railroad in an open-air first-class car. A record number of our members attended this trip. The GGRS has done several trips with this railroad including chartering a caboose (more than once) and riding the entire line on a photo special in coach class. All were enjoyed. Onboard dining is included for first class in luxury passenger cars as we travel out of Bryson City, NC. This trip would be a lunch time train ride pulled by a steam train. Price is approximately \$115.00 per person for meal and 4 ½ hour train ride.

The 2019 GGRS excursion was with Tennessee Valley Railroad with a double header steam train. We have probably taken this railroad on more GGRS excursions than any other line as it appears to be a favorite of many members. We even experienced a derailment on one of the Christmas Dinner Train trips years ago! This trip would be the closest to the metro Atlanta area. Dinner trains operate around the city of Chattanooga on Saturday evenings at various times through the year. Prices start at \$80.00 per person for 2 ½ hour train ride with meal.

Realistically, we are most likely looking at a dinner train either out of Chattanooga, Tennessee on a Saturday evening or a dinner train out of Bryson City, NC someday at lunch. Tennessee Valley dinner trains are diesel powered and Great Smoky Mountain trains are steam powered (could be diesel depending on date selected). Hoptown Station - Staircase Renovation Update

The staircase renovation is well under way, but not quite finished. The paint stirrers turned out to be too much for the mini table saw and the blade on the table saw did not make a wide enough cut to accommodate the steps.

A lunch date and a trip to Miniature Designs (a Doll House store in Lawrenceville) with Ginny & Terry Manning provided Roy with an idea for a different design.

The idea was to cut a ¾" piece of pine at a 45-degree angle. The wood was then cut into 3" lengths that were first glued and then nailed to a 3" X 15" piece of beadboard. The staircase facia boards, made from small paint stirrers, were nailed to the sides of the steps.

When we went to install the completed staircase, we noticed the upper-level patio of the station is also in need of repair or a possible redesign, so the renovation is not quite finished.

Santa Clara 2021 NMRA National Convention and National Train Show cancelled!

The NMRA has cancelled the NMRA 2021 Santa Clara "Rails By the Bay"

Convention, scheduled for the Santa Clara Marriott Hotel & Conference Center on July 4-11, 2021.

We did not reach this decision lightly but felt it was the best for anyone who would want to attend given the current status of the pandemic, disbursement of vaccine, and the fact that people were waiting to see what would happen before they registered. Moreover, local prototype facilities were not open and, understandably, home owners were reluctant to allow people in their homes.

However, St. Louis <u>will</u> host the 2022 convention and it is expected that all contracts for that convention will be signed shortly, if not by the time you read this. See you all in St. Louis **August 7 - 14, 2022**.

From Air Force One to Amtrak One: Joe Biden can accelerate economic recovery by renewing America's rails

President Joe Biden has an answer for all our pressing problems, and it's waiting for him at the station. When Biden and his running mate, Sen. Kamala Harris, won the 2020 election, Summit Foundation member Darryl Young tweeted an image of Amtrak's brand new Acela train, photoshopped to include the presidential seal, and captioned it "There ought to be an Amtrak One."

Biden could send a powerful message by switching from Air Force One to Amtrak One for presidential travel between cities a few hundred miles apart. That's the so-called "sweet spot" where rail travel is more convenient and environmentally sound than driving or flying.

Remember, he rode the same Amtrak train to and from Delaware for 30 years as a senator. "Amtrak Joe" traveled more than two million miles by train between Washington and Wilmington. As president, Biden can make Amtrak One a regular part of his travel, reassuring a pandemic-wary public that transit is safe.



In September, President Biden will travel to New York for the U.N. General Assembly. The current trip involves a flight on Marine One from the White House to Joint Base Andrews, followed by a flight on Air Force One to JFK Airport, another helicopter flight on Marine One to the Wall Street Heliport, and finally a motorcade from downtown to midtown Manhattan.

If President Biden could motorcade a few blocks from the White House to Union Station, take Amtrak One directly to New York Penn Station in midtown Manhattan, and finish the trip with a short motorcade eight blocks east and six blocks north to the U.N. how much money could be saved? Would it be safe? Would presidential trips on busy lines like the Northeast Corridor cause delays for daily rail riders? Possibly, but think how motorcades for dignitaries in Atlanta have impacted our driving. How have flights into Dobbins AFB affected flight patterns? Think about anyone suggesting the federal government save money. Would Amtrak One work, or am I just a train nut? Or maybe both.



2021 Convention Car

They received numerous inquiries whether there will be a new convention car produced for the 2021 National Garden Railroad Convention. The Nashville Garden Railway Society is pleased to announce we have made arrangements with USA Trains to have 150 convention cars produced. As a world, we have endured unprecedented challenges during the past year. During the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic, two items were in short supply; toilet paper and hand sanitizer. When one went to the stores, the shelves were bare of these two essential items. Shown below is the mockup of the 2021 National Garden Railroad Convention car.



The CSX bulkhead flat car will be available with two road number options; 2020 or 2021. Your choice of the road number or road numbers you want. We will only have cars produced IF 150 cars are pre-ordered and paid for in full to minimize the financial risks to our club. If the demand exceeds 150 cars, we will increase the size of our order to match the number of cars ordered. The cars can be ordered using the 2021 National Garden Railroad Convention website: www.ngrc2021.com. Each car will sell for \$85. The convention cars will be shipped to Nashville for pick up during the convention. If you want to purchase a convention cars drop shipped to your house for a \$12 charge per person whether you purchase 1, 2 or 4 cars. For international orders, we will determine the actual cost to ship your order to your home and notify you. We have to place our order with USA Trains by February 26, 2021. Our deadline for receiving your convention car order and full payment is February 22. We hope this car will be a reminder of your attendance at the 36th National Garden Railroad Convention and how this wonderful hobby has helped each one of us find a bright spot during the challenges of this past year.

The number 1472

Steam locomotives are complex pieces of machinery. Steam locomotives have boilers. If boilers develop defects, they may explode. Just as an automobile requires certain inspections at certain mileage intervals, so do steam locomotives, except their inspections are based on service days, not mileage. For steam locomotives, those service intervals are daily, 31-day, 92-day, annual, 5th annual, and the "big one" – 1,472 "service days" (the number of days in four years) of operation, or every fifteen years. The inspection includes ultrasonic measurements of boiler shell thicknesses and visual inspection of the boiler and firebox. This inspection requires an almost complete disassembly of the locomotive so every nut and bolt (literally) can be checked. These regulations were rewritten to take effect in 2000.

The other important part of the 1472 day inspection is checking the frame and running gear of the steam locomotive for stress cracks or components that could be damaged by metal fatigue, so it is an extremely important procedure that keeps steam locomotives safe to operate.


