We did well at this show, in that we picked up several new members! Welcome to the club.



COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS

Job Description

The Guest Experience Model Train Associate, operates in Alston Overlook at Atlanta Botanical Garden, is responsible for maintaining the integrity of the model train garden, welcoming and directing guests throughout the garden during the Garden Lights, Holiday Nights' exhibition.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Greet guests with a smile and a verbal welcome using an enthusiastic and pleasant manner

Ensure all trains are operating properly and alerting the manager on duty of any issues

Keep tracks clear of debris and clean tracks when needed

Politely monitor guests to ensure the model trains and surrounding scenery are not disturbed

Provide guests with information regarding activities conducted at the garden

Provide guests with directions to food and merchandise venues, offices, and special events

Communicate correct product information to guests regarding coupons, special offers, and upcoming events

Maintain clean working environment

Maintain a working relationship with other departments to ensure up-to-date garden knowledge

Additional duties may be assigned. Management retains the discretion to change or add to the duties of this position at any time.

The above job duties and responsibilities describe the general nature and level of work for employees in this position, but this is not intended as an exclusive or all-inclusive inventory of all duties required of employees in this job.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job the employee is required to sit and stand for long periods and walk. The employee must be able to reach with hands and arms; and use hands to finger, handle, and feel. The employee is frequently

required to climb or balance and stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. The employee is frequently required to talk and hear. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move carry, push, or pull at least 50lbs. Specific vision requirements for this job include close vision, color vision, depth perception, ability to focus, and night vision. The employee must be able to take directional cues directly or indirectly.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is exposed to outside weather conditions

The employee is regularly exposed to wet/or humid conditions, extreme heat or extreme cold

The noise level of the work environment is usually moderate

The environment can be moderate to fast paced

Required Skills

Must be at least 18 years of age or older

Must be able to maintain a good working relationship with coworkers

Must be able to work days, nights, weekends, and holidays

Must be able to work independently and as part of a team

Previous experience in hospitality or customer service industry preferred

Previous model train experience is required

It is the policy of the Atlanta Botanical Garden to provide equal employment opportunity (EEO) to all persons regardless of age, color, national origin, citizenship status, physical or mental disability, race, religion, creed, gender, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and/or expression, genetic information, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, veteran status, or any other characteristic protected by federal, state or local law. FYI: The pay rate will be \$15-\$18/hr, depending on experience and if the individual will be working part-time or full-time. The daily shifts available will be from 9am-4pm and 5pm-11pm.

We are open on all holidays. On Thanksgiving, Christmas Day and New Year's Day, we will only be open during the nighttime shift.

Shop Foreman

[Russ sent me this a little while back, and he probably thinks I forgot. Didn't. Just wanted to give it a GOOD issue. Here it is. Thanks RussEditor]



Cover the form with plaster cloth. This is used a lot on indoor railroads. If you don't know how to work with this, I suggest writing a "letter to the editor" asking about a tutorial in a future issue.

Empty hoppers look okay, but adding a load can also add a lot of weight. I chose to have "coal" loads and this method is really quite lite.

Cut a piece of standard house insulation just slightly smaller than the hopper bay opening. Then add a reinforcement piece to the top. This is more for contour than strength.





Form covered.

Trim off the excess plaster cloth and add hydrocal as desired. Fit to hopper. The cloth usually adds 1/16" to each side so take that into account when you cut the initial form.

It's really quite lite and doesn't make the cars top heavy.

Once the plaster cloth has dried and been fit to the hopper, you can add the load of your choice. Here I'm using Woodland Scenic Coarse Ballast. This is black, but it comes in a lot of colors. Not really scale coal, but the visual works for me.

Spray the "load" with a diluted alcohol mixture. This helps break up the surface tension. Then liberally coat the load with liquid cement. I'm using Scenic Cement because I like it, but a diluted white glue would work. Note: white glue breaks down easily if it gets wet. My cars won't ever be left outside, but if yours are, the load could come loose.





And that's it.

Technically the load can still be removed. Mine fits tight enough that it would probably do some minor damage to the edges, but easy enough to fix.

The train chase was shot in Adana, a modern city in the agricultural heartland of Turkey, close to the Eastern border. The second unit, directed by Alexander Witt, spent one month setting up the action in Turkey and then filmed for two months.

Working on a speeding train, proved both technically challenging and dangerous. Both

Daniel Craig (James Bond) and Ola Rapace (Patrice) performed their own stunts attached to safety wires while the train was travelling at 40mph.



The climax of the sequence took place on the Varda Bridge, an hour outside of Adana.

2022 Election of Executive Board Members


