

History

The Jefferson City Art Club was organized in September of 1903 by Miss Ada Oldham and several young ladies in Jefferson City, Missouri, who wished to share with each other the joys of the art world. After attending the art museum at the 1904 Worlds Fair in St. Louis MO, they knew they wanted to share the joy of art with their community back home.

In the beginning, they met in the members' homes and brought artists to Jefferson City from St. Louis, Kansas City, and Chicago to share their work with the community. Over the past 119 years, the club has been stable in the Jefferson City, MO art world.

In celebration of the Jefferson City Art Clubs 100th Anniversary, the 2003-2004 Art Club presented a monetary gift to **The City of Jefferson Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Task Force** to have **Sabra Tull Meyer**, sculptor, create the "Corps of Discovery" Marquette in bronze. The Marquette was used to promote the Task Forces' fundraising program for construction of the "Corps of Discovery" monument to be placed in the Lewis and Clark Trailhead Plaza located on the Missouri State Capitol grounds. The monument is a reminder of the importance of the expedition to our country's history.

Today, JCAC provides programs to members that promote a broad range of visual arts including artist presentations. The Jefferson City Art Club also sponsors adult and student art shows throughout the year providing opportunities for members and other artists to exhibit their work in public venues.


