# SWEENEY AND GUDINAS REGIONAL CHAMPIONS

Tim Sweeney of Schaumburg and Cheryl Gudinas of Woodridge showed why they were the top seeds entering this year's Regional Championships at the Charlie Club in Palatine. Sweeney, who finished third in the 1988 National Championships, was upset in last year's Regional semi-finals by Brad Munroe (Kenosha, Wisconsin). This year, he beat Schaumburg's John Negrete in convincing fashion to take the men's title. Neither Negrete nor Sweeney had any trouble advancing through the draw of twenty-four of the area's finest open players to claim their finals berths. They are the likely top seeds for next month's State Singles Championships, and will be seeded at the AARA National Championships in Houston over the Memorial Day Weekend.

Gudinas was also a convincing winner in the Women's Open competition, beating Evanston's Robin Petrini in two games, to better her runner-up finish of a year ago. Cheryl's toughest competitor, Chris Evon, was competing at a Women's Professional Racquetball Association (WPRA) tour stop, and must now qualify for the National Championships out of a different region. Gudinas, Evon and Petrini will be the top seeds at the State Championships. Petrini and Evon will also be high seeds at the National Championships in the 25+ age group, and Gudinas will be a top seed in the 19+ division.

The other championship divisions were also hotly contested. Joe Wirkus of Madison, Wisconsin traveled down for the first time in several years to take the Men's 35+ division, and Laurel Davis of Bloomington, upset long-time nemesis Colleen Shields of Mundeline to capture the Women's 30+ bracket. This year's Regionals was the largest ever held in Region Eight, with over 400 entries from six states. Tournament coordinators Rich Clay and Gloria Lang did an excellent job of managing the overflow crowd, and keeping things running smoothly. Our thanks to Penn, Ektelon, Gatorade, A'ME, Kellogg and Bob Evan's Restaurants for their continued support of the Regional Championships.

# "REF??...WHAT DID YOU CALL?!?"

"Ref??...What Did You Call?!?" How many times have we all heard (or asked) that question? It's a problem that results, not so often from poor judgment by referees, but mainly from misinterpretation or misunderstanding of the rules. Considering the speed at which the ball travels, it is difficult enough to make an instantaneous call concerning a rule infraction. Add in the lack of confidence many players have about refereeing and you begin to understand the dilemma.

To help solve the problem, the ISRA has established a referee certification program in Illinois. Participation at Regionals was high and we are looking forward to even a greater turnout at the State Singles.

There are three steps to become a certified referee:

- 1. Attend a one hour, open discussion.
- 2. Pass a 100 question written exam with a score of 80 or more.
- 3. Referee ten matches, two of quarter-finals or higher. One match must be supervised by either myself or an appointed official.

At the Regionals, a dual referee fee was offered; \$3.00 for uncertified and \$6.00 for certified referees. We hope that this incentive will help inspire more players to become certified referees. So, if you would like to sharpen your refereeing skills or simply have a better understanding of the rules, sign up for the next available referee clinic at State Singles.

# **HEADS OF STATE MEET AT REGION EIGHT!**

1989's first Ektelon/Adult Regional Championship was held February 3, 1989 at the Charlie Club in Palatine, Illinois. A record turnout of over 400 players entered well over 400 events, but posed no problems for repeat tournament director, Geoff Peters. Participants from outside Region Eight traveled from Nebraska, Michigan and Indiana.

Rich Clay, Chairman of the ISRA Referee Certification Program, conducted two clinics during the tournament. In an attempt to increase the number of certified refs, we experimented with paying double fees to all certified refs. Rich believes it is essential to increase the quality of refereeing, not only to build confidence and understanding of the rules, but for safety. A confident referee will better-control a match, possibly avoiding injuries. The ISRA is fully committed to the Referee Certification Program. Many spectators agreed that the match of the tournament was the Men's 45+ final. Marshall Waldo retained his title, defeating Ron Johnson, in an 11-8 tie-breaker. The caliber of play was truly "Open", and you cannot find two classier sportsmen than Ron or Marshall.

Talk about going a long way for a match! Penny Missirlian, the Pied Piper of Nebraska's racquetball, brought three juniors; Todd Criger age 12, Troy Shramek 14, Mark Crouse, age 14 and her husband, Art. Troy made it to the semis in the C Division, quarters in B's and Todd gained the quarters in the D Division. Not too shabby for 12-14 year-olds. After talking with Todd, I got the feeling that our adult regional was just a warm-up for his Junior Regionals, and then down to Indiana for the Junior Nationals. From a Junior Commissioner's point of view, these kids were a delight to have around. There was nothing they would not do to help and nothing they could not do, except keep a straight face in the middle of a rally! There was no question that these juniors were having a ball. Two other juniors, Dale Johnson from Illinois and Jim Ellenburger of Wisconsin both finished in the quarterfinals of the Open Division.

This year's regionals brought a special event, one that I thought would never happen. All the Heads Of State did meet at Region Eight. Sharing the meeting was Rich Clay, newly appointed Illinois AARA and ISRA Junior Director, Bill Roberts, ISRA President & State AARA Director, Jay and Jean Hansen from Iowa and Carol Pellowski of Wisconsin, all AARA Adult and Junior State Directors. There was no question in my mind, that when Juniors Racquetball enthusiasts get together, only positive things happen...and they did! We unanimously agreed that rotating the Junior Regional Championship location each year would greatly benefit the growth of juniors. Two years ago Wisconsin hosted the tournament, 1988 was Illinois' year, and Waterloo, Iowa is the site for 1989. Entries for our Junior Regionals have tripled in the last five years, and we expect a record turnout on April 28. To encourage education, a Region Eight Scholarship Fund has been established. Each state will award to a junior player, a \$500 scholarship, this honor to be bestowed at the Adult Regional Championships. One important criteria of this award will be the continuation of racquetball at the collegiate level.

In addition to the championship divisions, we will be experimenting with extra events in order to reach the novice junior player. We are planning for juniors teams from Illinois, Iowa and Wisconsin to compete for a Regional Team Title; the beginning of Team Region Eight. Grass roots is the key to racquetball's continued growth, and juniors development is the most important aspect of grass roots. State Directors will continue to promote junior's divisions for all tournaments in their state. However, even with all the competition typical of racquetball, our primary goal is that the KIDS HAVE FUN. In that spirit, with the team concept in mind, I feel great to have a TEAM IN REGION EIGHT and it is all thanks to these fabulous "HEADS OF STATE".

The following article appeared in the December, 1988 issue of <u>National Racquetball Magazine</u>, as a letter to the editor. We thought it was well-worth re-printing in the ISRA Newsletter.

## MAKE JUNIORS HAPPEN

I read with interest the article in the July issue of *National Racquetball*, "Where have all the racquetball players gone" as written by a California court club owner.

It is high time that club owners take the responsibility for racquetball growth in their own hands and begin to search for ways to help the sport become self-propagating. For too long, the owners rode the crest of the wave of enthusiasm generated by the stupendous growth of the sport in the late 70's and early 80's.

Yes, the balls are faster now, the racquets larger, but as in the Olympic motto - faster, higher, stronger - the manufacturers have been enticed to modern technology to assist the athlete in reaching their greatest potential.

It is time that club owners stop pointing their smoking guns and work together with their state amateur associations and the Racquetball Manufacturers Association to publicize and promote the sport to the youth of America.

In Illinois, we are starting programs, on the cue from surrounding states (Iowa and Wisconsin), along with other progressive states such as Florida, which are geared for Juniors. The only way we will continue to increase participation in racquetball is with Juniors programs. This is an area where club owners can be very helpful by offering Juniors half price memberships in non-prime time hours, setting up Junior leagues, again in non-prime time hours, and soliciting the grade schools, YMCA's and youth clubs for interested participants.

We have started a youth racquetball class at the Lattof YMCA in DesPlaines, Illinois. We had eight youths in our first class and we have grown to over 25 just by word of mouth. The sport, with its excitement and natural ease of learning catches on like brush-fire only if the wood is kindled.

Racquetball manufacturers could help in these areas as well by sponsoring Junior programs with equipment. Their efforts would be rewarded by the increase of players using their equipment time after time. Lastly, the state associations are capable of sharing their expertise in publicity, organizing tournaments and helping to structure programs for youth racquetball. Most states have a newsletter to inform the entire membership of happenings in their state.

If the club owners, Racquetball Manufacturers Association, and state associations would all work together, we could help the growth and future existence of this great sport.
