From the President

On June 14th the ISRA held its Annual Meeting. This is the meeting where officers and board members are elected for two-year terms begining the following July 1st. Positions are staggered so that half of the positions come due for election each year. This year, the positions up for election included: Vice President, Treasurer, Southern Zone Vice President, Western Zone Vice President and three Governing Board positions. The results appear on page 15 of this newsletter.

As a follow-up to the Annual Meeting, this seems like the appropriate time to provide a "State of the ISRA" address.

1. President's Term

I am in the middle of my fifth term as President. I have had this job for nine years, much longer than many people have had their primary job. It is my intention to hand over the reins to someone else at the end of this term and assume a position we haven't used for a long time – that of Immediate Past President. Organizations need new leadership periodically to keep them vital and relevant.

2. Membership

Our membership is pretty stable at about 640 members. It has dropped over the years, but probably by a lower percentage than many other states have experienced. USA Racquetball can provide lists of expired members. A couple of years ago we sent a letter to all members who had expired in the previous five years (about 500 letters) hoping we could generate some new members. I am sorry to say the campaign success was very low – less than 10 new members. I am puzzled by how difficult it is to get people who love this sport to support it financially.

3. Tournaments

We've got tournaments - lots of tournaments. We often discuss whether we have too many, whether there are too many scheduled too closely together, etc. etc. It is a discussion that can and does go on ad nauseum. The ISRA has tried to provide quality State Tournaments. We upgraded State Singles by adding a banquet which makes the Annual Awards presentation an "event" rather than a "time out" in the middle of matches. We consistently try to provide great hospitality and a nice souvenir, without asking for more from your pocketbooks. The Motorola IRT Pro Nationals has been a great addition to the Illinois tournament scene.

Sometimes it's easy to do the same thing as

last year for a tournament. I think our members would probably like some change...we'd like to know what kind of change. Ideas we have discussed include: a. Skill divisions on one day, age divisions on another day and mixed divisions on the third day (then you'd know exactly what day you could expect to play). b. A "series" of events whereby people receive incentives based on the number of events they play.

4. Travel League

Every time I attend a national conference, I tell people about our Travel League. I noticed in the national magazine that New Hampshire is starting a travel league (hmm...wonder where they got that idea!). Our Travel League play continues to be strong — I just wish more people would come out for the party at the end!

5. Junior Racquetball

Through the efforts of many dedicated parents and coaches, our junior program has expanded greatly over the last few years. It takes a lot of involvement from the parents to keep this going. Some of our strong players are now in high school, so we're going to need another crop of younger players and parents to keep things going!

6. Newsletter and Website

Our newsletter is now published four times a year, rather than six. The content is greatly improved and we have received many compliments. We also have a new website that is visually appealing and provides a great place to check the tournament calendar and download entry forms. Our biggest challenge is keeping the website information current.

7. Illinois on the National Front We should be proud of how well repre-





The Chalet, Willow Springs March 31-April 2, 2006 Tournament Director – Laurel Davis


Keith Minor and Liz Molitor were crowned the Men's and Women's Open Champions respectively at the 2006 Illinois State Singles Championships over the "time change" weekend (always interesting). In the Men's draw, Minor avenged last year's

finals loss to Eugene Coyle and claimed his second title in three years, while in the Women's draw, Liz Molitor made it a three-peat with her third consecutive win by besting Ellen Somberg in the finals. This year's Championships crowned 37 division winners who capped a great season of racquetball by proving to all that they were the best in their brackets!







2006 Hall of Fame Inductees – Lola Markus and John O'Donnell, Jr.

Lola Markus began playing racquetball at the Park Ridge YMCA in 1968. She reminisced, "Three of my girlfriends and I went onto the court with borrowed racquets in hand and just laughed at each other trying to hit the ball. Finally someone taught us the rules and we began to play more seriously."

Lola played on the YMCA women's travel team in the '80's and in many local tournaments as well. She was named 1992 ISRA Female Player of the Year accepting the award from then-ISRA President Tom Street. She earned the Al Wetherill Award for sportsmanship in Albuquerque in 2001.

To commemorate their 50th wedding anniversary, Lola and her charming husband Ray began funding a youth racquetball instruction program at the Lattof YMCA – the program is still going strong today.

Lola has competed in 16 of the 18 WS/ MRA (Women's Senior/Masters Racquetball Association) Women's tournaments held annually each January and has medaled in each and every one!

On July 23, 2004, Lola was inducted into

the NMRA Hall of Fame at the Masters tournament in West Allis, Wisconsin. The following May, she received the 2005 Peggy Steding Award for Outstanding Age Group Achievement at National Singles in Houston.

"I feel so humbled by it all and at the age of 74, I am so lucky to still be able to play this game that I love so much!"

John O'Donnell, Jr., a former Air Force pilot, served one tour of duty in Korea and two tours in Vietnam. Although he took enemy fire a few times, thankfully he was never shot down. John was named ISRA Male Player of the Year in 1995. Last year, he placed first in Men's 75+ at National Singles, NMRA singles and doubles (w/Phil Dziuk), Midwest Senior Masters and the US Open.

Retired from his job as director of facilities at the U of I Division of Intercollegiate Athletics in 1994, John conducts numerous free clinics each year at the facility. He has run two tournaments sponsored by the NMRA and currently serves as a member of the Ektelon Collegiate Advisory Staff. John and his lovely wife/typist Arlene live in Champaign.

Olympic Women


