## From The President

Have you ever been confronted with a situation and wished you could just pretend it didn't exist? Or, maybe something happened and you wished that you would wake up and find out it was just a dream?

That's the kind of situation I recently experienced in my role as ISRA president. I was out of town during the final weekend of July, during the Summerfest Tournament at Glass Court. Upon returning, I found my voice mail full of messages concerning an incident that occurred during the tournament. It seems that some physical contact occurred during a semifinal open match, contact that was allegedly NOT part of regular play.

Boy! I wished I could have erased those messages or heard a later message saying it was "April Fool's!". Instead, I had to review the USRA rules regarding "Due Process" and start the formal process for handling disciplinary issues. The ISRA, by virtue of its affiliation with the USRA, is subject to the United States Olympic Committee's (USOC) rules regarding discipline and due process. When an incident occurs at a tournament, the disciplinary process must be invoked by the governing organization, regardless of whether or not the alleged "victim" files a formal complaint.

So, what does the process entail? It is very structured, and designed to ensure that the person charged in the incident receives a fair and impartial hearing. First, the USRA is notified of the incident and the impending disciplinary hearing. Then a Grievance Committee must be formed. The Committee is comprised of ISRA members and includes a Chairperson and an odd number of people who listen to testimony and determine if and what discipline will be handed down. Notification must be sent to the accused via certified mail at least 30 days prior to the hearing date. Care must be taken to ensure that the hearing will be fair and impartial. The composition of the grievance committee is critical. The individuals serving on the committee must not be predisposed to think of the player being charged either positively or negatively. The Executive Committee of the ISRA Board spent many hours discussing the composition of this

committee in an effort to ensure that diverse views were represented and that the individuals serving would be impartial.

A hearing is held, structured similarly to a jury trial. The Grievance Committee Chairperson conducts the hearing, testimony is heard, witnesses are cross-examined, and the Grievance Committee comes to a conclusion; if appropriate, a penalty is decided upon. Prior to this hearing we consulted an attorney to ensure we were following proper procedure. We also hired a court reporter to ensure that events were recorded accurately and impartially.

I'm sure you're wondering what happened. The Grievance Committee spent several long hours hearing and discussing the testimony and recommended, among other things, that Eugene Coyle be suspended from competitive play for a full year, then placed on permanent probation. They read their decision and the hearing was adjourned. But, it's not over yet. Eugene had 30 days in which to appeal the sanctions to the USRA National Rules Committee, and he did so just before we went to press with this issue. During the appeal process, he may continue to participate in sanctioned events just as any other ISRA/USRA member. When the USRA hears his appeal and renders a final decision, the results will be published in the ISRA newsletter and tournament directors will be notified if the decision impacts them. We expect that this will happen sometime before the end of November.





Now you can understand why I would have liked to erase my messages. The racquetball community is small and closeknit. The members consider each other to be family and everyone is passionate about our sport. Having to protect the integrity of the game by disciplining one of our family members is difficult, but it is the right thing to do. Serving on the Grievance Committee is not the same as jury duty. When you serve on a jury, you don't know the accused or the witnesses. Everyone present at this hearing knew each other well. The ISRA and the USRA are volunteer organizations. A great deal of time and energy was expended by many volunteers to ensure a fair hearing. Monetary resources are limited, but funds were sacrificed to hire a court reporter.

Although this was an unpleasant experience, I was proud of how it was handled. Everyone involved in the hearing took

their responsibilities seriously. The Grievance Committee members accepted their duty without complaint. Individuals who witnessed the incident were willing to testify, whether by phone or in person. I would like to thank them all publicly here (you know who you are).

As we get into the heart of the tournament season, I would like to request three things of our ISRA membership:

- 1) Don't speculate about the Grievance Committee. It is not important who sat in on the hearing, and they will not discuss the proceedings. We have promised them that we will not publish their names, and I have assured them that nobody needs to know what happened in their closed meeting. None of us needs to know any more than the ultimate result.
- 2) Please don't ever put your ISRA family members through this. When you are on the court, remember why you're there.

We all want good, fair competition and we want to have fun.

3) Understand that this has been a difficult process for all involved. When all is said and done, the USRA will either uphold, adjust or overturn the Grievance Committee's recommendation regarding Eugene. Whatever the result, the ISRA, USRA and Eugene have handled this professionally and appropriately. The result will be, frankly, whatever the result is when the USRA completes the appeal process. Rehashing it will only divert attention from the competition, camaraderie and joy of the sport. Let's not fall into that trap!

I know this has been lengthy, but the topic is important. We'll publish the outcome on the website and in the next newsletter. Until then, focus on having a great season playing this sport we all love so much.



## 2003 USRA 36th National Doubles Championships

October 1-5, 2003 Presented by Penn Racquet Sports

The Northwest Athletic Club in Minneapolis — a beautiful facility with 14 courts (2 with stadium viewing) — once again hosted National Doubles. With the leaves just starting to turn and lots of sun (vs. miserable weather last year), it was a really nice weekend for a tournament. The turnout was lower than expected, with 439 players signing up for the event; a record 801 was posted two years ago in Las Vegas. Next year's location, Tempe, Arizona, promises to draw more participants; it will appeal to many who want to experience that last bit of warmth before the winter months.

Team Illinois had 19 players in attendance (12 men and 7 women: five more than last year!) who partnered with each other and with 9 players from other states. Adrian Martinez, Howard Weisbart, and Chris Evon's mom were among those who cheered on Team Illinois competitors.





On October 18, 2003, Frank E. Clay was inducted into the Illinois Bowling Hall of Fame. Frank is the father of Rich Clay, ISRA Executive Board Member and Treasurer.

Frank began his bowling career in 1945 in youth leagues, and he is still active, currently bowling in three leagues. His bowling averages of 199-206 are astonishing for two reasons. First, these are outstanding accomplishments for both amateurs and pros, especially before recent changes in lanes and equipment that spiked averages

even higher. Second, at 73 years old, Frank shows no signs of slowing down. He bowled a perfect 300 game in 1980 and has logged two games of 299 and two of 298. His highest three-game series is 770. Frank has been active in tournament competition over these many years. His accomplishments include being a member of the Illinois State tournament first place scratch team in 1974 and 1975, the only team to win scratch team titles two consecutive years; state doubles champion in 1968; and he has bowled in 49

consecutive ABC National tournaments, a feat few have achieved.

Clay explains, "Bowling has been a major

part of my life for over 50 years and I have enjoyed the rivalries and especially the lasting friendships that I've developed from this wonderful sport. Bowling with and against some of the top notch bowlers was inspiring. They taught me good sportsmanship, teamwork and fair play."

Clay has set two goals for himself. One is to bowl in his 50th

consecutive ABC tournament in Reno, Nevada in 2004 and the other is to eventually knock down a total of 100,000 pins at the ABC!


