## New Faces, New Titles Highlight AARA Doubles

The 1984 U.S. National Doubles Championships, presented by Lite Beer and sponsored by DP Athletic Products and Wilson Sporting Goods will be remembered as a year of new faces and teams in one of the most exciting doubles championships on record.

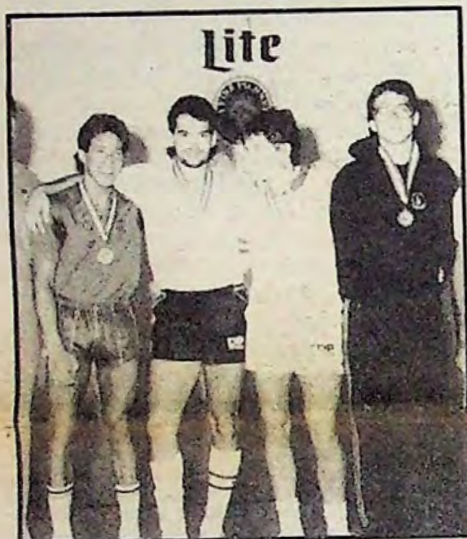
Representatives from almost every state attended, including 12 of the 18 U.S. National Team Members. The party atmosphere created by Lite Beer and The Court House Racquetball Club of Boise, Idaho, made this championship most exciting and enjoyable.

The excitement began on Wednesday evening when the draw sheets were posted during tournament registration. With more power than was ever seen in a national doubles tournament, the Men's Open draw had the top-seeded teams of Stan Wright/Steve Trent, San Diego, two-time defending national champions, and past national champions of five occasions, Mark Malowitz/Jeff Kwartler, Texas.

The other teams to be watched carefully were two outstanding teams from Florida — Sergio Gonzales/Joe Icaza and Tim Hanson/Bubba Gautier.

New teams to be considered in the Open draw were Doug Ganim, OH/Hugh Klein, PA, gold and silver medalists in the 18 & Under Junior Singles Championships this past June; Dan Obremski, PA/Kelvin Vantrease, OH, their states' singles champs; Andy Roberts, National Intercollegiate Singles Champion and his partner Scott Reid.

The Women's Open draw was just as impressive. Defending champions of Malia Kamahoahoa and Carol Frenck, VA, and Mary Lyons and Susan Morgan, 1983's third place team, were

among those to keep an eye on.

Other teams to be watched were the local Boise team of Elaine (Lee) Riley/Cheryl Ambler, two retired professionals now turned amateur players; Mona Mook/Trina Rasmussen, CA; Cindy Baxter, PA and Kathy Gluvna, TN; and Diane Bullard/Julia Pinnell, FL. Diane was the 1983 Women's Open Single Champion.

The Mixed Open Doubles teams had half the championship and runner-up teams of 1983 return. Dan Obremski had a new partner, Cindy Baxter, this year and Malia Kamahoahoa paired up with Kelvin Vantrease. The unique feature here is the split of the Men's Open team of Dan Obremski and Kelvin Van-



trease. As fate would have it, these two teams would meet in the finals.

The Courthouse in Boise was an excellent site for the 1984 National Championship, which had the second largest doubles draw in AARA history. The hospitality and friendliness displayed by the staff and volunteers was very much appreciated by the national entrants.

Bob Petersen, owner/manager of the Court House put on a Low Down Hoe Down party on Friday nite for the players which was a good time and added a new twist to the tournament festivities. The social activities for Saturday evening was the banquet highlighted by Jim Hiser, Michigan, one of the AARA Board of Directors, with another outstanding slide presentation. The evening was then capped off by a "Vegas Night" full of fun and money raising for the U.S. National Team.

One new team that made AARA history makes us want to flash back to the Idaho Territory of the 1880's during the Gold Rush Era. Two of our Golden Masters players from back East, like their early forefathers, teamed up to search for gold.

The first was Ike Gumer of Louisville, Kentucky, whose partner Irv Zeitman was injured, needed a partner. Ike put in a call to his buddy, Allan Shepherd, Rockville, MD. "Hey, Allan,

why don't you join me in Boise, Idaho, and go for some gold." Allan, a young 70-year old, replied, "Sure, Ike, let's go for it." These two young 70-year-old gentlemen teamed up for the first time, played in two divisions, 60+ and 65+, and found a "gold mine" of a team going undefeated through both divisions and becoming double national champions.

#### Men's Open

The quarter-finals in the upper bracket had defending champions Stan Wright/Steve Trent defeating Doug Zirkle/Mark Hegg, 15-11, 15-7. The other quarter final was Dan Obremski, PA/Kelvin Vantrease, OH, upsetting Bubba Gautier/Tim Hanson, FL, in a very close match, 12-15, 15-12, 11-9.

In one of the most exciting matches of the tournament, the lower bracket had Joe Icaza/Sergio Gonzales, FL, defeating Cliff Swain/Don Costeleigh, MA, 12-15, 15-9, 11-9. The last quarter-final had a major upset by Andy Roberts/Scott Reid shocking Jeff Kwartler/Mark Malowitz 15-7, 15-8. This was only one of the many surprises to come.

The semi-finals had the defending champions Stan Wright/Steve Trent playing the new team of Dan Obremski/Kelvin Vantrease. The team of Obremski/Vantrease matured as a team under a baptism of fire and

victories from Gary Mazaroff/Jim Owen, NM, and Bubba Gautier/Tim Hanson 12-15, 15-12, 11-9.

In a discussion before the semi-finals, the new team was very confident and, according to Obremski, "We had a game plan for the champs." He said, "they are lefty-righty, so we will try to keep the ball in the middle instead of passing shots. We will shoot right at their bodies. When the ball is right at your body, it's hard to crease the ball, so they can't give us as many difficult shots."

Vantrease commented, "We know they have a reputation. We know Steve is quick as lightning and Stan doesn't hit many ceiling shots: he just drives it. So we will try to keep them deep in court and make it almost impossible for them to get kills."

The young team of Obremski and Vantrease did their homework exceptionally well, applying their theories almost without a flaw. They kept their shots either low or in the back court. Trent and Wright had few opportunities to set up their forehands and backhands.

"It was," Obremski said, "the best we ever played."

And that was an understatement. Obremski's serves and consistent returns were very trying on the defending champs. The clincher was Vantrease's super powerful backhand pinches and returns which had the champs' heads spinning.

The score was 5-5 when Obremski/Vantrease took control in the first game, taking an 8-5 lead before Trent/Wright called their first time out. After the time out, Obremski/Vantrease ran off three more points to make it 11-5. It was just a matter of a few moments before the score was 14-7 and another time out was called. When play resumed, Obremski/Vantrease quickly scored and finished the first game, 15-7.

The second game was even more intense. It was 3-3, then 6-6, and then 9-9. Wright/Trent complemented one another exceptionally well, alternating scores and making what looked like a great comeback.

The emotions of Vantrease started to explode. Even cool and calm Obremski started to get fired up.

Obremski/Vantrease soon exploded with the force of a nuclear bomb, unloading for six points in an anticlimatic finish to what started out as a very intense match.

They dethroned the champions in two games, 15-7, 15-9. After a small victory celebration at center court, Obremski and Vantrease began to look forward to Sunday's championship match.

The second semi-final match was another thriller. The veteran team and last year's semi-finalists, Joe Icaza/Sergio Gonzalez were pitted against Andy Roberts/Scott Reid. The first game was a one in which both team felt each other out.

Gonzales's speed and power and Icaza's control and court savvy kept them even with Roberts/Reid through the start of the match. Then Andy Roberts, the dominating force of their team, got down to some heavy hitting expanding his team's lead, finishing the first game in their favor, 15-10.

After a brief intermission between the first two games, Icaza/Gonzales came back in, ready to play. Their strategy was to keep the ball away from Roberts and put pressure on young Reid. Their strategy worked effectively keeping Reid off balance and refusing Roberts the chance to regain the momentum he had from the first game. Roberts did have his moments and

kept the game close, but Gonzales/Icaza caught fire and finished the second game in their favor 15-9.

During the tiebreaker Roberts/Reid countered with keeping the ball away from Gonzales. Gonzales/Icaza played the third game like the second and kept the ball away from Roberts. Roberts denied them the satisfaction of spoiling his game and came on like gangbusters. Reid came to the front and scored some key returns in the front right corner and then passed in the left to effectively keep his team's momentum alive. They controlled the third game and were victorious, 11-5, looking ahead to Sunday for their match with Obremski/Vantrease.

Two hundred spectators spent much of Sunday afternoon sitting on the edge of their seats and jumping up to watch the final shots of the long intense rallies of the finals. Obremski/Vantrease planned their strategy effectively. According to Obremski, "We were going to play to Scott Reid, place the ball off the glass into their bodies and keep the ball away from Roberts."

The first game went quickly to Obremski/Vantrease, 15-8.

Roberts/Reid came back in the second game and held their own. With the score 6-5, in favor of Obremski/Vantrease, Roberts served a high lob to Vantrease's backhand. Vantrease came up hard and fast with an aggressive forehand smash that floored Roberts when it hit him in the back of the head.

A doctor was called to the court to check Roberts. After an okay to play was given, Roberts rallied, miraculously returning to his best form.

Vantrease, who was visibly upset, crept into a shell for the remainder of the second game. Roberts/Reid dominated and finished scoring nine of the last 10 points making it 15-7.

In the tiebreaker, Obremski took charge and countered Roberts keeping the score close, 6-6. Obremski called a time out to fire up his partner yelling at him "C'mon Kel!" Finally, snapping the spell, Vantrease started pounding the wall, screaming, "Come on!" and "Yeah, let's go". The sleeping giant was awakened! Vantrease played a large part in scoring five of the next six points, capturing the National Doubles Championships and a very prestigious position on the U.S. National Team. The new team should do very well in Ecuador next month.

**Women's Open**

While the Women's draw was just as impressive as the Men's, the competition was even tighter.

The games during the quarter-finals were very intense. In the upper bracket, top seed Malia Kamahoahoa/Carol French defeated Michele Gilman/Annette Anderson, OR, 15-13, 15-12.

Mary Lyons/Susan Morgan, FL, overcame Marci Drexler, (Women's Open Singles Champ)/Theresa Nunn, CA, 15-14, 15-12.

The lower bracket had Mona Mook/Trina Rasmussen, WA, struggling with Cindy Baxter, PA/Cathy Gluvna, TN, 2-15, 15-9, 11-0.

The last match-up had the local favorites Elaine Riley/Cheryl Ambler, ID, going up against Diane Bullard/Julia Pinnell, FL. Three out of four of these ladies played on the pro circuit at one time or another. The young team of Bullard/Pinnell demonstrated their power by defeating Riley/Ambler decisively 15-4, 15-11.

Saturday afternoon's 4 p.m. match-up had Kamahoahoa/French the defending champs, playing Lyons/Morgan, last year's third place team. The challengers, with their cool, calm, collected personalities, went to work in the first game and in a very close, hard-fought contest, defeated the champs 15-13.

The second game had Kamahoahoa/French come back early, but Lyons and Morgan stayed cool and played their game. Never showing fear of faltering in the second game, they overcame and upset the defending champions, 15-20. They congratulated one another and promptly went to scout the other semi-final match.

The 5 p.m. match had Mona Mook, CA/Trina Rasmussen, WA, meeting Diane Bullard/Julia Pinnell. Mook/Rasmussen, a lefty-righty team, covered the court very well. In the first game Bullard/Pinnell jumped off to an early lead 11-7, maintaining it for a victory of 15-13.

In the second game Mook/Rasmussen adjusted their position, developing a new game plan. They got off to an early lead and moved the ball very well, keeping it away from Bullard's power, coming out ahead 15-11.

In the tie breaker Bullard/Pinnell, with excellent position and outstanding quickness, jumped out to an early uncatchable lead. Julia Pinnell had some excellent returns from the right side keeping the challengers at bay. Bullard/Pinnell won easily 11-6.

The Women's Open final appeared to be an all Florida competition. More interesting than that — Mary Lyons and Susan Morgan had played Diane Bullard and Julia Pinnell in the Women's

## PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

During the past several months, much controversy has arisen over the position of the American Amateur Racquetball Association in reference to the oversized racquet. I have personally read in recent publications that the racquet was approved by the AARA; that the AARA National Rules committee has approved it; and even that the rules have been changed to accommodate use of the racquet. None of these statements are in fact correct.

The AARA has allowed a one-year waiver to the rule on racquet specification, with the exception of use in national and regional tournaments. In other words, the oversized racquet may be used at the state level, in sanctioned events, on a one year experimental basis. The rule regarding racquet specifications has not been changed and the oversized racquet will not be allowed in regional and national tournament play. The following is the official rule regarding racquet specifications:

**Rule 2D.1 Racquet specifications** — The total length and width of the racquet may not exceed 27 inches. The length of the racquet may not

exceed 20½ inches and the head width may not exceed nine inches. These measurements are computed from the outer edge of the rim, not including bumper guard, and from the farthest solid part of the handle. The AARA has a standard procedure for rule changes:

"Proposed rules are submitted to the national board prior to the October meeting, then they are published in the January issue of *Racquetball in Review*. Taking into consideration the views of the membership, the board votes on the proposed changes at its May meeting. Rules that are approved then become effective in September."

This procedure for changing rules is strictly adhered to, and there can be no rule changes acted upon by the AARA National Board unless the procedure has been followed.

We can definitely use the help of our membership to clarify this situation when speaking to non-members, club owners, club pros, club managers, as well as members of the media regarding the AARA's official position on the oversized racquet.

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## To Play Or Not To Play (The Ball's In Your Court!)

How many times have you had to choose between two tournaments, one sanctioned and one not?

How many times have you made the wrong choice and have gone to the non-sanctioned tournament?

Mistakes can be corrected!

How many times have you played the best game of your life (at the top of your form, blew away the competition, and won the division) but no one will ever know; it doesn't count because it wasn't a sanctioned tournament.

How many times have you played in a tournament where a B player is suddenly playing against you in the D's?

This wouldn't happen if your tournament was sanctioned. Directors of sanctioned tournaments check the CARA/AARA Rankings when making the draw.

How many times have you had a question about the rules or a gripe and have had no one to hear your complaint! At sanctioned tournaments there is a CARA representative at the CARA check-in desk (and they always have AARA Rule Books). You can always have the representative page a member of the Board of Directors (there are 15 of them just in Northern California, so there is bound to be one nearby).

Tired of sandbagging?

Tired of results that don't count!

Tired of no one listening to you!

... Then you should be tired of playing non-sanctioned tournaments!

Commit yourself!

Commit yourself to playing only CARA/AARA Sanctioned tournaments!

By sanctioning a tournament, the Manager and Director have made the commitment to support the organization that supports the players. They've committed to providing a fair draw (which makes for tough, equal competition and isn't that why you're playing in a tournament in the first place?)

Now it's your turn, as a player, to make the commitment to play only Sanctioned Tournaments.

Don't undermine the organization that's here for you. Remember, the more sanctioned tournaments you play, the more sanctioned tournaments there will be.

Play with the motto "If it ain't sanctioned, It ain't Racquetball."

That's my opinion; what's yours?

25+ division and, in a real thriller, Lyons and Morgan came out on top 4-15, 15-13, 11-8.

The first game appeared to be Bullard and Pinnell's revenge. They started out in control and finished completely in command by a score of 15-5.

The second game saw Lyons/Morgan getting together and planning their strategy as they did the first time they beat Bullard/Pinnell. They started out very confident and stuck with their game plan point for point. Bullard/Pinnell had match point, but Lyons/Morgan pulled it out and won 15-14.

The tiebreaker, with a position on the U.S. National team at stake, began close and stayed close. Both teams went back and forth point for point, exuding confidence and very cool dispositions for all the pressure. The match finally came down to 10-10 and Lyons/Morgan had the serve. A forehand drive serve which looked like an ace was spectacularly returned by a leaping Julia Pinnell who threw everything she had into the return. Her partner, Diane Bullard commented afterwards, "When the ball came off the wall, I was saying, 'Please, get the ball!'" Julia Pinnell said "I would have broken my knee to get to that one." It was then side out and on their first serve Pinnell and Bullard captured the U.S. National Women's Open Doubles title in the closest match of the entire tournament.

**Men's 19+**

This, the youngest and newest division, was a round robin competition. The top-seeded team of Tim Hanson/Bubba Gautier, FL, went undefeated winning the gold 4-0. The runner-up team of Rory Harkless and John Latimer, CO, the silver medal winners, finished with a 3-1 record. The bronze medal winners were Ben Doniego and Eric Hagelin, OR, ending with a 2-2 record.

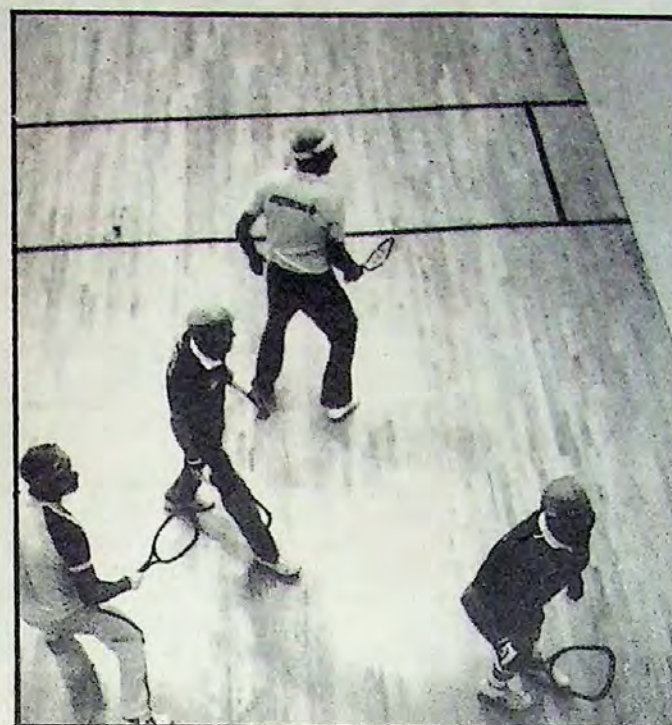
**Women's 19+**

This division was a small draw. The finalists were Kim Mays/Carrie Trettell, CA, and Nancy Rogers/Sue Hill, ID. Mays Trettell were victorious 15-14, 15-6.

**Men's 25+**

The semi-finals had in the upper bracket Jay McGurran/Chip Lien, ND, up against Dan Factor/Marshall Greenman. McGurran/Lien who had just upset top-seed Jeff Kwartler/Marc Averbach in the previous round looked good; but Factor/Greenman made short work of them 15-9, 15-11.

The other semi-final had Bob Krout/Bob Buruck, NY, facing Gary Mazzaroff/Jim Owen, NM. This match was a real knock-down, drag-out fight

with Mazzaroff/Owen taking the first 15-5, losing the second 13-15, and winning the tiebreaker 11-5.

The finals were very evenly played with Mazzaroff/Owen winning the first game 15-11. Factor/Greenman came back in the second 15-11, and continued with their momentum, capturing the title 11-3. Third place went to McGurran/Lien, ND.

**Women's 25+**

This division was a round robin competition, but it was dynamite. The first round of play had the same two teams who appeared in the Women's Open finals. This time Mary Lyons/Sue Morgan, FL, had the edge and won 4-15, 15-13, 11-8 over Diane Bullard/Julia Pinnell, the opposite outcome of the Women's Open Finals! Lyons/Morgan won the 25+ crown with Bullard/Pinnell, FL, placing second, and Lou Fuzzard/Robin Rodriguez, AL, taking third place.

**Men's 30+**

The semi-finals had defending champions Bruce Radford/Mark Morrow, CA, overcoming Dan Allen/John Lockridge, WA, 15-8, 15-9.

The second semi-final had Bob Banuck/Steve Dunn, CA, meeting Bob Kraut, CA, and Gene Gibbs, ID, in a thriller. With two very evenly matched teams, the first game was won by Burruck/Dunn 15-11; Kraut/Gibbs came back in the second game, 15-13; and in one of the longest matches of the tournament, Barruck/Dunn defeated Gibbs/Kraut 11-9 in the tiebreaker.

The finals has Radford/Morrow and Barruck/Dunn in a showdown. The de-

fending champs, Radford/Morrow, won the first 15-14; Barruck/Dunn came storming back in the second game, 15-5; and continued their domination through the tiebreaker 11-3. Netting third place was Dan Allen and John Lockridge, WA.

**Women's 30+**

In the semi-final action Carol Frenck/Vicki Bone, a new team, defeated a local team of Elaine Egerman and Marcia Roberts, ID, 15-7, 15-9. The other semi-final had Bella Gutierrez and Teri Twombly upsetting the local team of Theresa Silva/Barb Smith 7-15, 15-14, 11-2. The finals matched up Frenck/Bone against Gutierrez/Twombly with Frenck/Bone coming out on top 15-6, 15-5. Third place honors were won by Theresa Silva/Barb Smith.

**Men's 35+**

The semi-finals had Henry Lopez/Tom Price, CA up against Eric Barkley/Bill Thurman, CA. Barkley/Thurman dominated play, winning by scores of 15-6, 15-5. The other semi-final had Bill Dunn/Joe Sullivan, CA meeting Joe Icaza/Van Dubolsky, FL. This was an extremely exciting match with Icaza/Dubolsky coming out on top, 15-4, 10-15, 11-10.

The finals were very evenly matched with Eric Burkley/Bill Thurman, CA facing Icaza/Dubolsky. Dubolsky and Icaza took the first, 15-11, let the second game slip by at match point 14-15, and made a strong comeback in the tiebreaker, 11-5. Third place went to Lopez/Thomas.

**Women's 35+**

The semi-finals had Mimi Kelly/Vicki Edelman, MA, defeating Bella Gutierrez/Cathy Rishel, CA, 15-10, 15-8.

The other semi-final had Suzie Bates/Barb Smith, ID, dominating Colleen Sloan/Teri Twombly, 15-10, 15-0.

## PRODUCT SAFETY NOTICE

## State Report

## New Mexico: No Passport or Visa Necessary!

We in New Mexico would like to extend a standing invitation to racquetball players throughout the United States. If you want to have a good time, nice weather, delicious food, outstanding hospitality, meet some of the best people in the world and play excellent racquetball, come to the Land of Enchantment — New Mexico. Where else in the winter can you play racquetball, outdoor tennis, golf and be forty minutes away from snow skiing?

Great strides have been made in racquetball in the state of New Mexico. We would like to share them with the rest of the racquetball world.

We feel our state Association is one of the hardest-working and most progressive state organizations in the country.

Two and one-half years ago the NMRS Board of Directors made the decision to become a permanent association. We wrote our by-laws, became incorporated by our state government and were recognized by the national organization (AARA) as the authority for racquetball in the state of New Mexico. At this time the decision was made to make most of our state sanctioned tournaments AARA sanctioned as well. In doing this, our membership and AARA membership went up by about 550 members.

Three and one-half years ago the Board implemented an officiating program. Board members went throughout the state giving clinics on rules and officiating. From this program developed a new rules interpretation test. All New Mexico residents must now take and pass the test before they

can play in a sanctioned tournament. We allow "C" players and above to take the test, but they must score 80% or higher. If they don't, they must go through the three-hour rules interpretation clinic and take the test again. "D" and "Novice" players must go through the entire clinic.

This went into effect September 1, 1984. So far to date, 550 have taken and passed the test. It is amazing how nice the game and tournaments can be when everyone has a good working knowledge of the rules.

For over two years New Mexico has required that eyeguards be worn in all doubles play. We have several rules that apply only to mixed doubles, and we feel that they enhance the game of mixed doubles. The first one is that you

only get one serve, to either the man or woman. We also have an encroachment rule which keeps the dominant player from taking over the court (one stands in back court while the other plays the whole court). This rule is handled just like an avoidable hinder.

Our juniors have been slow in developing racquetball skills. We hope some new programs will close the gap with other states. We are working with the high schools to bring the P.E. classes to club racquetball courts twice a week. We have several high schools in this program and several more are looking at the program. Juniors clinics are also given throughout the state.

With its educational involvement, the Board decided that a non-profit status from IRS was warranted. After many

letters, telephone conversations with Washington, NMRA was granted non-profit status under 1501(c)(3); the first state to receive this stature. A lot of benefits may be derived from non-profit status, but, on the other hand, it takes a lot of work not only to receive it but to keep it.

We are fortunate to have a computer at our disposal. With the computer, we can keep our list of players who have passed the rules test up to date. We also have a rankings system which moves players up to the next higher division when they have received the required number of points. This is also kept in the computer. NMRA sends the updated division rankings and list of players who have passed the rules test to the tournament director. This is a big help in doing the seedings and draws.

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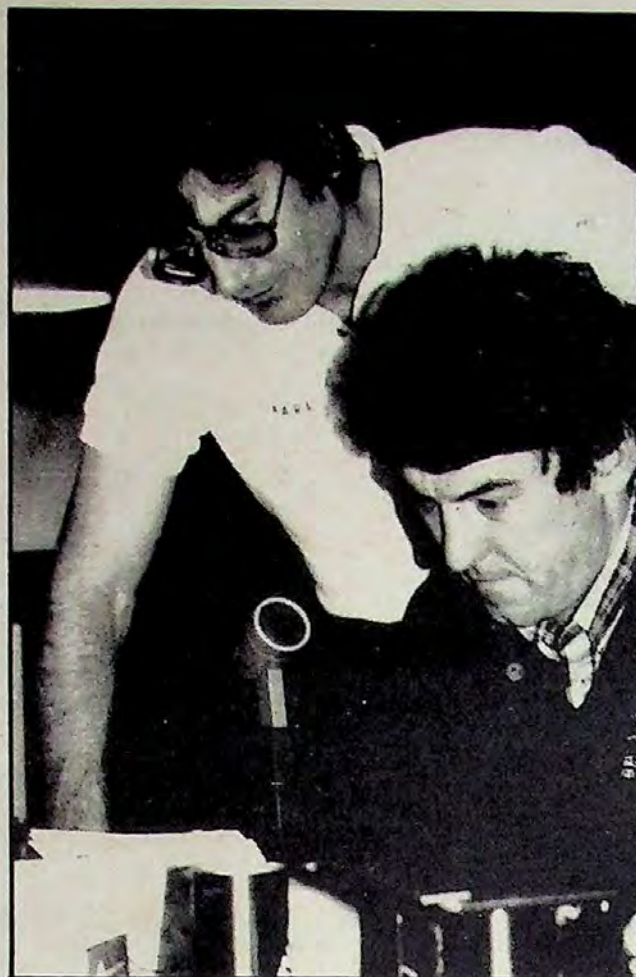
