US SINGLES PLAYERS CAPTURE GOLD MEDALS AT THE XIV PAN AMERICAN GAMES

The XIV Pan American Games took place on August 1-17, 2003 in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic with 7,700 athletes and officials from 42 countries participaing in 38 sports. This event has grown in stature throughout the years. The first Pan American Games opened in Buenos Aires, Argentina with 2,500 athletes from 22 countries. The sport of racquetball first entered the games in 1995.

Representation for a sport in the Pan American games is critical. It is one of many hurdles for any sport bidding for an Olympic position. A brand new 8-court racquetball facility, with 6 glass back wall courts and 2 back and side wall glass courts was specifically built for the games in order for racquetball to ensure a spot in this year's event. The racquetball venue was centered in the main park, the Olympic Park, which hosted 16 other sports. Each day the park was packed with spectators, many of which visited the racquetball venue raising the visiablity of the sport.

One of the highlights of the event was Jack Huczek (MI) defeating Canada's Mike Green in straight games 15-12, 15-7 to earn his first Pan American gold medal. Jack made his way with relative ease through the draw until reaching the semifinals. His semifinal match with Rocky Carson (CA) was marred with emotional outbursts due to inaccurate referee scoring. Unfortunately, the linesmen and coaches failed to correct a point error and Jack was penalized with a technical foul. With a determined mindset, Jack took the victory with a decisive 11-6 tiebreaker win.

Cheryl Gudinas (IL) earned a gold medal for the US by defeating fellow US team member Laura Fenton (KY) with scores of 15-9, 11-15, 11-5. Cheryl also won the gold medal in 1999 and a silver medal in 1995 in this event.

The US doubles team of Ruben Gonzales (NY) and Mike Guidry (TX) earned a silver medal after being outgunned by the Mexican team of Alvaro Beltran and Javier Moreno, 15-9, 15-7. The US team had problems finding effective serves against their determined opponents.

In one of the biggest upsets in international racquetball, Mexico defeated the US in women's doubles in an exciting match that went the distance, 8-15, 15-7,11-9. The US team of Jackie Rice (CA) and Kim Russell (TX) had not lost a game internationally prior to the upset. Susy Acosta and Rosy Torres were bursting with energy from a loud, dynamic crowd who cheered them to victory.



racquetball program. We have racquetball leagues for every skill level from USRA Open level to the Beginner level. We also run three non-USRA tournaments each racquetball season. We have a small but steady Juniors program also.

We run our racquetball leagues yearround, and although participation drops off in the summer months, during the fall and winter we usually have 100 players in 10 + leagues. The majority of our leagues run weekday evenings, but we also have a lunchtime league and a Friday morning league. Our racquetball leagues are for YMCA members only.

We hold three tournaments each racquetball season. They are held the first weekend of December, the first weekend of February and the first weekend of April. This year will be the 17th year we've been hosting tournaments. They are non-USRA tournaments with a round-robin for each division on Saturday to determine who comes back on Sunday for the semi-finals and finals. They have been fairly small tournaments with 30-50 participants. Everyone gets a t-shirt, food, drinks, and plenty of competitive racquetball for their \$20 entry fee. Non-members of the YMCA are welcome to play in our tournaments, but they must also pay \$20 for a one year Program Membership. Since their Program Membership is good for one year from the date of purchase, it amounts to an additional \$7 per tournnament, if they play in all three tournaments we hold during that year.

We hold challenge courts on every Saturday and Sunday morning. Since it's very popular, most of the time it's cutthroat on the courts. This keeps as many players as possible on the courts and not standing in the hall waiting. Saturday's challenge court is from 8:00 am until 10:30 am and Sunday's challenge court is from 10:00 am until 12:30 pm. Our challenge court time is open to non-YMCA players as long as they buy a \$10 one-day pass. The one-day pass allows the person access to the entire YMCA facilities for that day.

In addition to our scheduled racquetball activities, we have a regular group of racquetball players using the courts each morning from 5:30 am until 7:30 am, and also a group of players each lunchtime in addition to those in our lunchtime leagues. In addition to evening leagues, usually every free court is also reserved. Any YMCA member can reserve any available court up to two days in advance.

In addition to being enthusiastic racquetball players, our YMCA members are also very generous when it comes to the Y's Partner's with Youth Charity program. The last several years racquetball players have been the largest group of contributors.
