Southeastern Region

Invitational Tournament

The Jacksonville Racquetball Club in Jacksonville hosted the biggest tournament as far as player abilities to ever be held in Florida. The top players from six states competed in the 274 participant field.

Florida's own Jim Adkins, Manager and Club Pro of the Racquet Ball in Orlando, came out on top of the broad field. Adkins captured the men's open singles division when Joe Icaza, from Atlanta, suffered an injury in the second game of the best-of-three final match. Adkins won the first game 21-17 and was up at 9-5 when a shot off the backwall by Adkins struck Icaza in the corner of the left eye.


After a 15-minute injury time-out, the fourth-seeded Icaza decided to default.

"I hated to see it end like that," said the sixth-seeded Adkins, a 26-year-old native of Daytona Beach who was the overwhelming crowd favorite in the final against the flamboyant Icaza. "You never like to see any one get hurt and winning this way takes some of the thrill out of it. It's not very satisfying."

"This was certainly the biggest tournament I've ever won though. My game was really on and I played well throughout the three days."

Adkins reached the finals by stopping No. 7 seed Jim Cullen of Memphis 21-12, 21-18, in the semifinals. Earlier he ousted No. 2 seed Keith Dunlap, also of Memphis.

Joe Icaza beat top-seeded John Dunlap 21-19, 21-13 in the semifinals.

Both John and Keith, the topseeds, were upset in the singles, but held true to form to capture the men's open doubles, beating Icaza and Atlantan Bobby Seigel 21-8, 21-6 in the final.

Keith Dunlap is the former pro at the Jacksonville Racquetball Club.

In the women's open singles, Sarasota's unseeded Marilyn Tebbs defeated Nancy Hornack of Fort Lauderdale 21-0, 21-19 in the final while in women's open doubles Gainesville's Diane and Kathy Green stopped Gail Ferguson and Janet Marshall of Memphis, 21-7, 21-14.

Orlando March of Dimes City Championships

The Racquet Ball in Orlando, along with the Winter Park Jaycees, sponsored the Orlando City Championships. The tournament was held for benefit of the March of Dimes. 227 people participated in the 12 divisions.

Jim and Cile Adkins emerged the big winners. Jim Adkins, pro at the Racquet Ball facility, scored a 21-12, 21-4 victory over Errol Potter to capture the men's open singles event, while Cile Adkins won the women's open title with a 21-8, 21-14 triumph over Gail Troxell. Tom Ruffing finished third among the men and Betsy Leedy captured the consolation match in women's action.

The female Adkins also crossed over

to the male bracket and won the 'B' Class doubles with Allen Sobel 20-21, 21-9, 11-9 (T) over Tinker Hewitt and Andy Warden.

Florida's State Ranking System

2
(or is it?)

Last month in the "Sunshine State Racquetball" I described my reasons for attempting to establish a state-wide ranking system. I explained how the system worked and briefly outlined what would constitute a "ranked" tournament. This month I would like to expand upon the qualifications of a "ranked" event and also show you what some of the actual numbers look like.

I alluded to the fact that there were some problems in the system and in order to minimize them, or at least qualify the situation, I established the following parameters:

In order to be ranked a tournament must have been held in an indoor facility in the state of Florida, and it must have been an open invitational. For players to be ranked they must be living in Florida at this time with a Florida mailing address and they must have finished in the top eight of a particular division at least three times since January 1978.

Although I have information on out-of-state tournaments including regionals and the nationals I decided to limit the rankings to only Florida events. This allows everyone to be compared on "even levels" so to speak. You will also notice some obvious "name" players missing from the rankings simply because they don't satisfy the minimum requirements. (Check for some of these "names" in the notes next to the rankings of each division.)

As I mentioned, I started trying to compile records in the beginning of 1978 and as of now I have the results of nine tournaments held in the state this year: The list includes the following events:

Please note that these are the only tournaments that I have information about. I am sure that I am missing some of the tournaments held in the state this year, and in order to make this system reasonably meaningful I would ask all tournament directors and court-clubs to send me a complete copy of the results.

If you notice that I haven't included your tournament on this list please send me these records so I can up-date my files.

Before listing the rankings I want to emphasize that this system is an independent venture on my part and in no way do I claim these to be official numbers; but in lieu of the fact that no one else has bothered to correlate them before, it is probably better than nothing. With this in mind here are the:

Notes from IRA

The first IRA State Doubles is scheduled for December 8 - 10th and may be history by the time this issue of the magazine is received. Many thanks need to go to Fred White and his group in Southern Florida for initiating the first primarily Doubles Tournament to be held in Florida. Our tournaments have gotten so big that we simply will have to have separate tournaments for Singles and Doubles. We will alternate the ends of the State each year so that no one will have to travel any further than the next. The IRA State Singles will be March 2-4, 1979, to correspond with the IRA State Championships throughout the country. It will be held at the Jacksonville Racquetball Club. Next year the Singles will be in the southern part of the State and Doubles in the northern part of the State.

We are trying to interest leaders in different section of the State to act as IRA representatives. Pam Harrison represents the Tampa-Clearwater area, Fred White the southern area, but we need someone to cover the central and the northwestern parts of the State. Hopefully, we can or will have discussed this at the State Doubles Tournament.





