

Illinois. The NMRA format has competitors 45 + and better playing multiple
matches in a round robin format with one
game to 21 points. The matches are quick
and played with three or four games
scheduled back-to-back. This is a
great way to play and recover quickly.

Matches are well spread out over the course of three or four days.

Still, competitors have to be in excellent shape to

survive. The amazing thing is that many competitors play in two divisions, which could easily give them 15-20 matches over the course of the week. Believe me, that is a lot of punishment for any "body", no matter the age, to take! Illinois competitors did quite well over high

# "Junior Team Illinois" Jumps to a 4th Place Finish in the 2002 Junior Nationals!

For the first time since 1986, the 'HEAD Junior Olympic National Racquetball Championships', were held in Chicago at The Athletic Club of Bloomingdale and the B.R. Ryall YMCA in Glen Ellyn! This five-day junior racquetball extravaganza began on June 26th and went well into the late afternoon of June 30th.

Over 260 of this country's finest junior racquetball players, representing 38 states, competed in this major national tournament. This was the largest Junior Nationals tournament in at least four years. Junior Team Illinois (The JTI) led all states in player entries (40), topping perennial entries leader lunior Team Oregon (33) and national powerhouse Junior Team Ohio (28). Last year, prior to the formation of Junior Team Illinois, our entry total at the Denver Junior Nationals was 5.

Proving the quality, as well as the quantity, of our efforts, Junior Team Illinois placed 4th in the 2002 Chicago Junior Nationals! Many Illinois juniors advanced to the quarterfinal and/or medal rounds. Finishing ahead of Junior Team Illinois were Oregon, Ohio and California. Junior Team

Florida finished fifth, 14 1/2 points behind our 4th place standing. Last year, Illinois placed in the middle of the pack in points, grouped with New Mexico and Texas.


Since so many of these top Junior Team Illinois players were competing in their firstever Junior National Championship tournament, it seems all the more remarkable that the kids were able to compete so well, so soon, at such a high level! Thanks to JTI

Head Coach

TJ Ferro and his Coaching Staff of Bill Lyman, Liz Molitor, Krystal Csuk, and Dennis Negrete for getting the kids ready to play and for keeping them focused during their matches.

Adding to the fun at this 29th annual tournament was the announcement that JTI's Ben Croft was named an All-American in U.S. junior racquetball! By virtue of his silver medals in both the Boys' 16 & Under and Boys' 18 & Under Gold Divisions, Ben was a double qualifier for the U.S. Junior National Team. He made a fine showing in the finals against Dan Sheppick (OR) in 16's and Jack Huczek (MI) in 18's. Nicely done, Ben!




