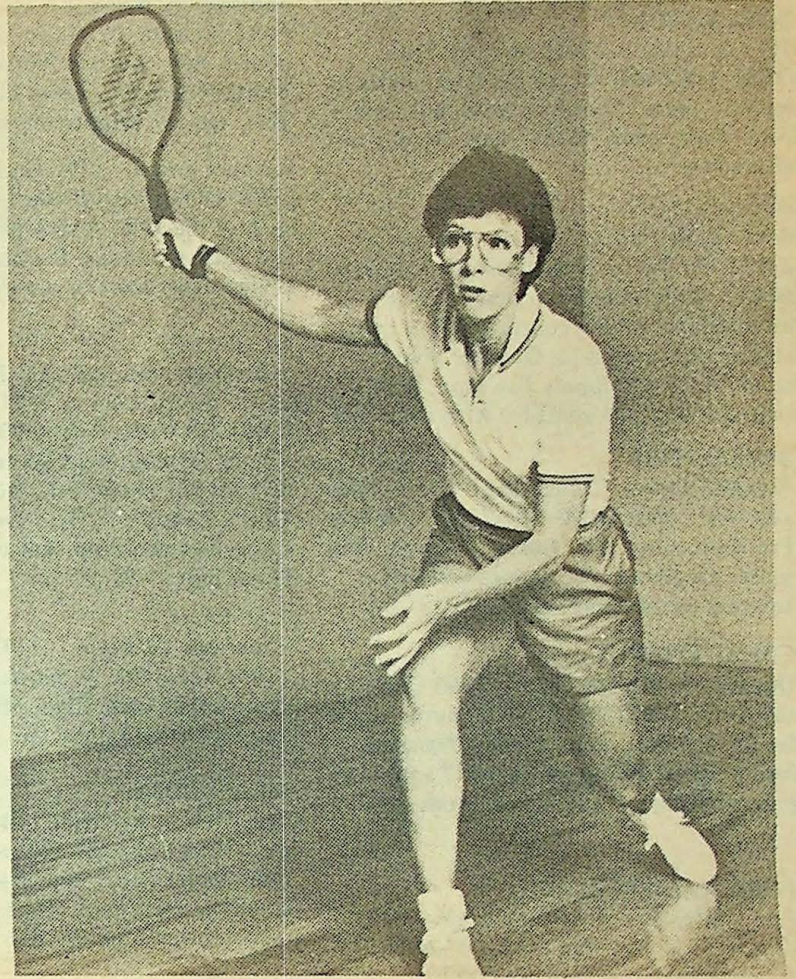

JACKSONVILLE — Lynn Adams, the greatest female racquetball player of all time, will be the guest instructor at the Florida Racquet Journal Racquetball Academy September 5-7 at Racquetpower in Jacksonville.

"We've toyed with the concept of an Academy for the past few months and feel we've put together a first-class package," said racquetball promoter Norm Blum. "We've been associated with week-long ventures and feel the weekend setup is the best format. The week-long camps were just too expensive and time consuming. A person who has two weeks off during the year didn't earn any points at home when he or she spent half the time at a racquetball camp. We plan on having academies at different sites during the winter months. In addition to the Florida players, we will try and attract the vacationer."

Tuition is \$150 and includes an academy outfit from Ektelon, videotape analysis and a Saturday night banquet. Lodging will be made available and roommates will be provided in order to keep down the costs.

The Academy is limited to the first 30 players to assure personal instruction from Adams. Unlike other sports where the superstar makes a brief appearance, Adams will be at the Academy the entire time. "I'll be there every minute of

every hour. They'll get sick of my face," Adams quipped.

Who is the Academy designed for? "It's for players of all abilities — men, women, boys and girls. We divide the players according to their abilities so we can work with them. It's good for someone just learning because I get the chance to develop their foundation. The Academy is also good for the higher level players who feel their game isn't improving. We can break down their game so they can see what they are doing wrong."

The Academy will begin Friday at 6 p.m. and a full day is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday. "We'll cover basic strokes, defensive shots, backwall play, strategy and percentage racquetball. When you complete the Academy, you will have the knowledge to become a better player," Adams added.

Adams, 29, has been the dominant player in women's racquetball the last five years. Sponsored by Ektelon, Nike and Versa Climber, she won the prestigious "Grand Slam of Racquetball" the last years with championships in the WPRA Nationals, DP Nationals and Ektelon Nationals. She didn't lose a match the entire season.

"We've had a good working relationship with Lynn and we're glad to bring her to Florida," Blum said. "Not only is Lynn a great player, but she works well with people. I don't have to sell anyone on that. Anyone who has been to one of her exhibitions knows she is a great mingler."

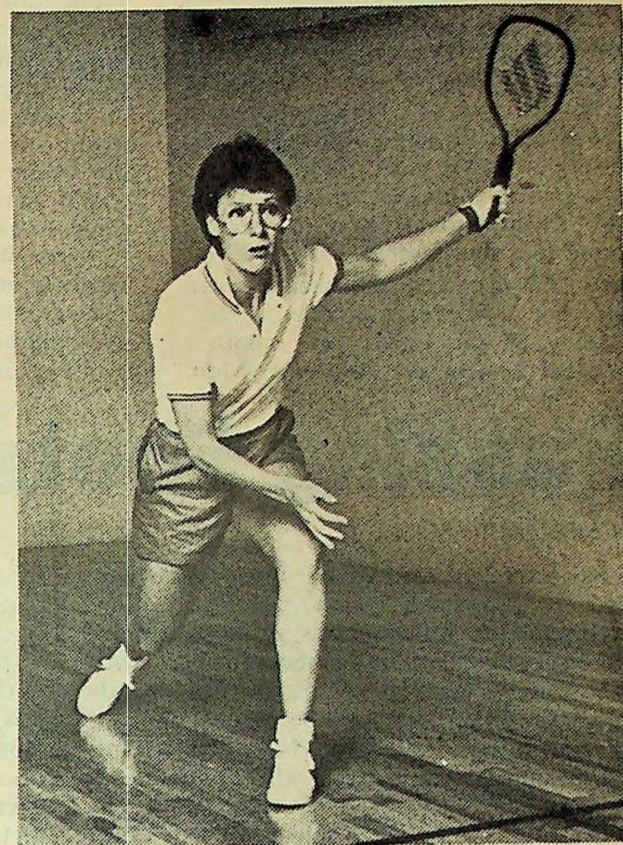

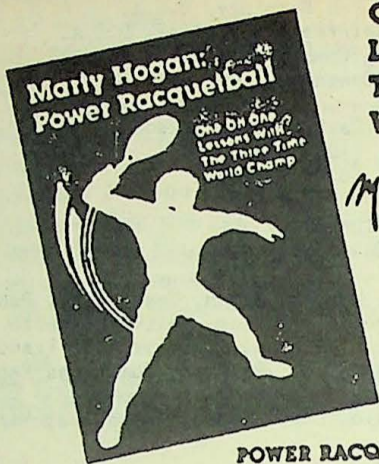

AARA Notes

By Linda Mojer

This summer brings a number of administrative and format changes that promise to affect Florida players in the months to come.

First, congratulations to two FRA board members who have accepted increased levels of responsibility within the AARA.

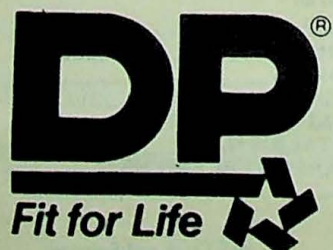
Van Dubolsky has been elected President of the national organization, transforming his years of experience on the board into a leadership position we can all be proud of. You can be sure that the national spotlight will follow Van to Florida and make the Florida Racquetball Association an even more influential body when it comes to policymaking. Congratulations to Van and Judi Schmidt who won her bid for a seat on the national board of directors.

A new ranking system was put into effect in June that eliminates the old level 1 designation (Club tournaments) and replaces it with "Closed State Tournament" (previously Level 2). This shift was in response to the very low number of point reports submitted by clubs. The change makes possible the inclusion (at Level 5) of a point schedule for the results of national invitational tournaments, further substantiating special interest groups who have organized at this level. So, all ranking points earned from now on will be awarded in the following manner: Level 1—Closed State Tournament; Level 2—Open Tournament; Level 3—State Championship; Level 4—Regionals; Level 5—National Invitational; Level 6

— Nationals. FRA will prepare a handout of the new schedule that will be available at upcoming tournaments.

Under consideration are three possible rule changes at the national level which should be of special concern to Florida players. The oversized racquet experiment will be put to the test and a final decision reached as to the safety of the equipment. The proposed specification, which would allow the use of these racquets, would limit only the racquet length (including bumper guard) to 21 inches. A second ruling under investigation by the national board concerns the use of screen serves. Increased practical application of the 'screen' without penalty has led to a movement to have the serve designated a fault. A very difficult infraction for a referee to call at present, the screen serve debate is sure to become a heated one. The third issue to be addressed by the rules committee will be a change that would allow the server to leave the service zone immediately after the ball is struck, thereby negating the recently instituted safety zone violation. This could conceivably allow the server more time to clear the anticipated path of the serve return and ensure good court positioning. Again, this should turn into a spirited debate as voting time grows nearer. Be on the lookout for further announcements from the national rules commission in your Racquetball in Review.
