PLAYER OF THE MONTH — Our Player of the Month award goes to Lantana's Cindy Watson. Cindy captured the B singles title and the B Doubles division in last month's tournament at the Harbour Pines Racquet Club in Melbourne. She edged Orlando's Rob-Kulp who upset Oscar Gonzalez in the junior division. Our Sportsman of the Month Award goes to New Port Richey's Steve Moss. Moss, playing in his first tournament, entered the beginning and D divisions. He advanced to the finals in both divisions and voluntarily dropped out of the beginning division, realizing that although he had played less than six months, the prerequisite for playing in the lowest division, he didn't belong in that category.

REMEMBER WHEN — It was a year ago when the doubles team of Joe Icaza and Sergio Gonzalez wondered if there was a team around that could give them a game, much less beat them. Those days appear to be over. In St. Petersburg, the unheralded doubles team of John Scargle and Randy Godwin defeated the Icaza/Gonzalez tandem 11-9 in the tiebreaker.

UPSETS — There have a couple of big upsets that have gone unreported. In February, James Lorello upset the state's top-ranked player, Tim Hansen and last month in New Port Richey, Sergio Gonzalez, playing with the old spark, revenged his loss to Charlie Nichols in the semifinals of the state championship. Sergio defeated Charlie 15-10, 15-0 to win the tournament. In the Captain Crunch Classic in Alabama, Mike Ray easily defeated Hansen to take the \$1,200 first-place prize. Ray defeated Memphis State's Andy Roberts in the semifinals. Roberts edged Gonzalez in two close games in the quarter finals.

THUMBS UP — Laurels to clubs that have tamper proof lockers... Laurels to 10-year-old Joanne Laney, daughter of Libby Laney. We could use more workers like her. She did a fantastic job at the Melbourne tournament.

THUMBS DOWN — Darts to spectators who tell their friends to "pour it on" when they are leading 10-0. Come on, be a little more sensitive. . . And how can a tournament director not allow a person to play in the B division when he is ranked 52nd in the B's and the tournament is open to everyone. He was forced to play in the A's and lost in the first round. . . A big dart inbetween the eyes to sponsored players who another company's equipment. They sign a contract and should adhere to it. It's that simple.

POTPOURRI — Biggest disappointment of the year — the absence of several of the state's top players in the racquetball pro/am in Melbourne. It

MELBOURNE — It was spring break and Doug Cohen learned to mix business with pleasure last month at the Jim Rathmann Chevrolet-Cadillac Racquetball Pro/Am at the Harbour Pines Racquet Club.

Cohen, who was abruptly eliminated in the quarter finals during his last visit to Melbourne, was an impressive 15-9, 15-5 winner over Ruben Gonzalez to take the \$1,000 first place prize.

The Florida sunshine and \$2,300 in prize money attracted one of the best fields. Five players ranked in the top 20, Cohen, Gonzalez, Chicago's Jack Newman, California's Cory Brysman and Atlanta's Mike Ray displayed their talents.

Only two of Florida's top players, Tim Hansen, the state's No. 1-ranked player and Mark Morrison entered the tournament. State champ Charlie Nichols and semifinalist Sergio Gonzalez cited "fatigue" while Mitch Campbell and Bubba Gautier haven't been playing on a regular basis.

"For this time of year and the amount of prize money, it's surprising the tournament attracted so many good players," Cohen said. "With the major tournaments coming up (Ektelon, DP Nationals), most players tend to concentrate on those.

Cohen's victory was anything but easy. He methodically thumped Jacksonville's Curtis Winter 15-10, 15-4 in the first round and ran into Morrison in the quarter finals. Cohen took the first game 15-7 but had to come back from a 13-9 deficit to prevent the match from going into a tiebreaker. Cohen, who had advanced to the semifinals in the last pro stop in Beaverton, Oregon, his best performance on the tour, edged Newman in a controversial match.

Newman took the first game 15-12 and led 11-4 in the second contest when the Chicago youngster got into a verbal battle with official Ed Vlock. Newman, who had never defeated Cohen, lost his concentration, dropped the second game and the tiebreaker 11-6. "Your lucky my father isn't here," Newman shouted to Vlock after arguing a hinder call. "I understand it's a judgment call," Newman. "The trouble is your judgment is lousy. This isn't funny any more." Newman questioned 10 calls and said he couldn't contend with both the official and a "hot player." "It was very frustrating," Newman said.

Cohen's opponent in the final, Gonzalez, struggled the entire tournament. The sixth-ranked player in the world, nearly lost in the first round. Lantana's Tico Fernandez, who isn't ranked among Florida's top 15 open players, gave Gonzalez the scare of the tournament. Fernandez was rolling the ball out from back court and became more determined after winning a point. Fernandez, with the crowd urging him on, pumped himself up and defeated Gonzalez in the first game 15-14. "There was nothing I could do. He was just hot," Ruben said. Ruben regained the tempo in the second game, taking it 15-5, but the first five points in the tiebreaker went back and forth before Ruben emerged an 11-5 winner.

Gonzalez, the top seed, advanced to the semifinals against Brysman, who is considered one of the top young players in the game and has a win over world champ Mike Yellen.

Brysman defeated Mike Ray in the quarterfinals and had beaten Gonzalez before. Ruben thumped Brysman 15-3 in the first game, lost the second game 15-10, but won the tiebreaker 11-3. The two-hour match had its impact on Ruben, who couldn't muster any energy for the finals against Cohen.

In what proved to be an anti-climactic final, Cohen was an easy winner.

"In my last four tournaments I've reached the quarters twice, the semis once and now this one," Cohen said. "I look at this type of tournament as a recreational one. I had a relaxing weekend without tournament pressures of a pro stop and

was able to spend time with my friends here. Jack was a real tough match. I was down 11-4 after losing the first game and was ready to pack it up when I got the serve back. I had a couple of good serves and felt I got into a groove.

Cohen's recent performances have moved him from 16th to ninth on the pro tour. "When I was stuck in the 14th, 15th and 16th slot, I had to meet the top three seeds each time. Now I've moved out of the slot. I just turned 23 and have been playing on the tour since I was 17. I know I have the ability to play with anyone in the world. I'm applying myself and still learning a lot about the game. It's a never-ending process."
