

Five Illinois Juniors participated in the 2001 HEAD Junior Olympic Championships this past June. Ben Croft, Krystal Csuk, Brandon Ritschard, Mike DeGonia and Andy Hawthorne all made the trek out to Lakewood, Colorado to compete against over 250 of the finest junior athletes in the country for one of 18 spots on the US Junior National Team. With Ben and Andy receiving third seeds and Krystal holding a second, it looked like a good week would push one or more of our juniors over the top. Unfortunately, none of our Illinois juniors were able to make it to a finals berth. Andy Hawthorne and Ben Croft both recovered, however, to win first place spots in the Blue division for 18 and under and 16 and under, respectively. For Krystal, the news was even better. Her performance at the tournament and throughout the season earned her an appointment on the US Junior National Team. We look forward to seeing her represent Illinois and the country in this upcoming season. She will also join Andy Hawthorne as a student and member of the Baldwin-Wallace racquetball team. She promises to come back and continue to give our Illinois women some top competition.





Brandon Ritschard does "The Rumble"


The 12th Annual "RUMBLE", a USRA-sanctioned lite camp for juniors, was held at the University of Alabama in mid-June, 2001. At this invitation-only camp, 52 of the finest junior racquetball players from all over the country and Mexico hone their skills against one another for an entire week.

Brandon Ritschard of Glen Ellyn became the first junior racquet-ball player ever from the state of Illinois to participate in the grueling "RUMBLE" camp. Ritschard is an *Elite Team* member of the ISRA-sponsored *Junior Team Illinois* and plays in the Boys 12 & under and Boys 14 & under age divisions. He is the current Illinois State Champion in the Boys 12 & under division.

The "RUMBLE" Camp Director, Jim Garner, states that he "would like to invite more players from Illinois to his camp," and has his eye on one player in particular! Garner, along with his associate directors, Natalie and Bud Crockett and Marcia Lee, spends a great deal of time, one-on-one, with the "RUMBLERS" and calls them "my kids." The camp is wall-to-wall racquetball, from early morning to late at night, for five days.

Started in 1990 by the late Jack Sorenson, the "RUMBLE" camp emphasizes skills improvement, aerobic conditioning, respect of self and others, and sportsmanship in the game of racquetball. Several guest coaches contribute to help the campers with everything from good nutritional habits to advanced skills. This year, **Sudsy Monchik** spoke with the players and even held short games with some of them. He managed to eke out a hard-fought 7-2 win over Brandon Ritschard in their game! Last year, **Cheryl Gundinas** made a camp appearance to share some of her vast skills with the campers, and was a big hit with the kids.

With the Closing Ceremony featuring skits put on by the "RUMBLERS," it was not all work and no play at the camp. Brandon, who made many friends, says "the 'RUMBLE' is just awesome," and hopes to be invited back in 2002. While most of the camp session is intensive racquetball instruction, the kids have the chance to form lifetime friendships with one another as they battle together in the "RUMBLE" of their lives!

ISRA Forms Junior Team Illinois

The Illinois State Racquetball Association is beginning a full court effort to bring more Illinois juniors to the game of racquetball. As part of this effort, the ISRA is forming Junior Team Illinois (JTI) in an effort to get more kids playing racquetball. In the past few years the ISRA has had a series of junior clinics at various locations around the city. We have had hundreds of kids run through these clinics but frankly, at most clubs, there was little follow-through for those interested in continuing to play the game.

In this effort we intend to begin by providing several Junior Camps for JTI team members and more tournament events geared to

Junior level play. (See the advertisement on page 11 regarding the first camp.) We are highlighting on the ISRA calendar and website those tournaments that will offer a wider variety of Junior events at half price entry fees. We are also creating a Junior D division for tournament play which will allow kids a second division to play, after their age group division. This new division will create an intermediate step between the large skill gap separating Junior divisions and Men's D. At present, you will not receive national points for Junior D play, however, if successful, the ISRA will introduce the concept to the USRA for future consideration. Lastly, we will be looking for opportunities to play

against other Junior Team programs in nearby Midwestern states.

Details for Junior Team Illinois are still being finalized at press time. If you know of any interested Juniors who would like to participate please contact Fred Ritschard, Junior Team Membership Chairman at the number listed on page 11.

Tournament Wins Bring New Challenges

It's 10-10 in the tiebreaker...she serves, an ACE! She wins her division in the tournament and it feels great! A trophy and more...she realizes that next year, it's on to the next level. This was a full draw tournament win!

A full draw is a division of 12 entries in a men's event and 8 in a women's event. A mixed doubles full draw is 8 teams. In Illinois, if you win one full draw tournament, you move up next season. Win twice in the same division (or win a full draw State tournament) and your move to the next level is immediate.

The only exception to these rules are the Regionals. You are still be eligible to compete at your initial tournament level at the Regionals since this gives you a chance to play at the Nationals at your original tournament level.



I am now returning control of the ISRA back to Laurel and I thank her for her tardiness. Hope to see you all at an upcoming tournament. –Mike Davern


