

Junior Nationals to be Held in New York

George Washington really slept here. Lafayette passed through. And during a critical point in the Revolutionary War it was a life-line for the American Army at West Point.

This June, Fishkill, New York will again make history as more than 400 young racquetball players from all over the country bring the 1983 United States Junior National Racquetball Championships to All Sport Fitness and Racquetball Club, June 25-29th.

A five minute walk from the club takes you down Fishkill's picturesque Main Street and residential area, which were placed on the National Historic Register in 1978. Reflecting the spirit of preservation, All Sport's exterior is painted white and features a peaked facade with Colonial pillars.

The name Fishkill comes from "Vas Kill," which is Dutch for "stream full of fish." It refers to a major stream that flows from the nearby Hudson River where the Dutch settles in the early 17th century.

The Hudson River has spawned an array of tourist attractions that will delight tournament participants and their families who choose to extend their stay in the Mid-Hudson area.

Many famous sites are within a 90-minute drive or less, including the United States Military Academy at West Point; the Franklin D. Roosevelt Home and Presidential Library in Hyde Park; the fabulous Vanderbilt Mansion and Estate, also in Hyde Park; the Rhinebeck Aerodome featuring Red Baron "dog fights" in authentic World War I planes; and the beautiful Catskill Mountains with its breath-taking trails.

The area is also renowned for its acres and acres of apple orchards and some of the country's finest wineries, with most offering tours to the public. The Mid-Hudson area also prides itself as a major development and manufacturing center for International Business Machines, with IBM installations in East Fishkill, Poughkeepsie and Kingston.

Opened in November 1979, All Sport is a multi-activity club with 15 racquetball courts, one of the largest Nautilus fitness centers in the Northeast, an aerobic conditioning center, aerobic dance and exercise rooms, swimming

pool, restaurant, pro shop, tanning solarium and uni-sex hairstylist. Each locker area has a sauna and whirlpool. All Sport has a sister club in nearby Poughkeepsie, which opened in August 1978 and has been the home of the Dave Peck Racquetball Camps for four consecutive years.

Tournaments have always been a

part of All Sport, with the New York club regularly hosting club, charity and regional tournaments, as well as three Women's Professional Racquetball Association (WPRA) national pro stops and AARA New York State Championships in 1982 and 1983.

Bill Austin, All Sport's owner-manager, and his energetic staff look forward to extending a warm "Hudson Valley Welcome" to all U.S. Junior Championship players. Says Bill enthusiastically, "Come to New York and make your own history!"

Long Island Open

The Sixth Annual Long Island OPEN, sponsored by Lite Beer from Miller, Coral House Restaurant and Catering House and Seamco, continued to be the premier tournament in the Northeast by drawing 893 entries to the Sportset Clubs.

The tournament continued its commitment to ensuring that every player and spectator goes home feeling like a winner. 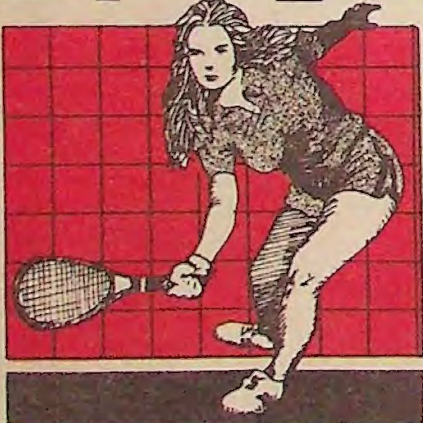
fans who got to see their favorite stars in action.

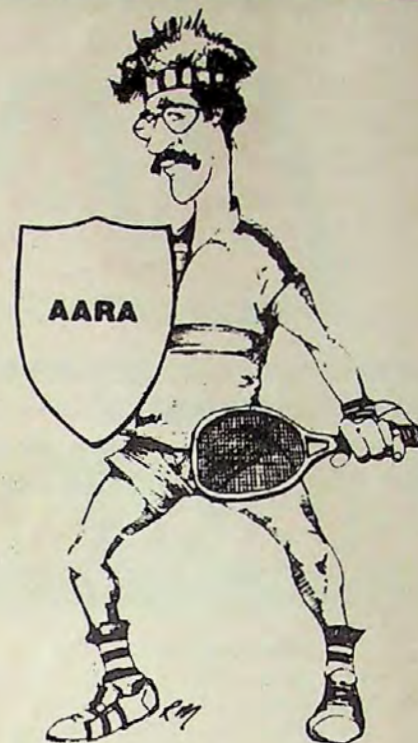
National Golden Masters Tournament scheduled for Sports Barn, Chattanooga, Tennessee, April 8, 9, 10

SHARPENING YOUR SPORTS VISION

Doctors of optometry point out that almost everyone can improve their game if they practice systematically visualizing their goal in their minds while using their eyes to concentrate on the ball.

Visualization—The ability "to see with the mind's eye" is usually a mark of champions but it is a technique any sports participant can develop with experience and practice once the basic principles are taught.

Visualization is the ability to visualize something in the mind while the eyes are seeing and concentrating on something else—usually the ball. For example, a golfer's visual attention must be on the ball itself. Therefore, he or she must visualize in the mind the part of the fairway or green where he or she wants to hit the ball. If the golfer is thinking about the sand trap to be avoided, the ball is likely to go right in the trap, since body movements tend to tune in to that on which you are concentrating. Similarly, the tennis player who thinks about his or her opponent's position is likely to hit the ball right to the opponent rather than to an advantageous spot on the court. The same is true for the racquetball player, the quarterback, place kicker, or the baseball hitter.

Visual Concentration—Sports participants should work at developing each vision skill separately during practices. Once a game or match is underway, visual concentration can be centered on only one thing at a time and the other skills must react together rapidly and automatically, without succumbing to the physical and mental fatigue of play.

Visual concentration does not necessarily mean concentrating on what the eyes are seeing centrally. For example, a basketball player can keep his or her eyes directed to the opposing guard but visually concentrate on a teammate, seen with peripheral vision, when passing the ball.

Likewise, the racquetball player's eyes can be focused on the ball as it approaches but concentration can be on the target—the spot to which the ball will be hit—that is being visualized "in the mind's eye."

Of course, visual concentration can rapidly progress from one thing to another. As the ball gets close to the racket, for instance, the player switches visual concentration from the target to the ball. Then, as soon as the racket strikes the ball, visual concentration is switched to the opponent, as the player gets ready for the next play.

Doctors of optometry specializing in sports vision have found that the shorter the period of time a person visually concentrates on something, the more intense the concentration is. When an outfielder or football receiver misses an "easy catch" or a basketball player misses an "easy shot," it may be that he or she had too much time to concentrate and was not concentrating intently enough at the right moment.

Optometric sports vision specialists also point out that the smaller the target of visual concentration, the more accurate the player's performance will be.

Examples of practicing good visual

concentration are the pitcher who throws to the center of the catcher's glove; the hitter who tries to hit the bottom half of the ball; the gymnast who gauges every move precisely; or the racquetball player who targets a mark on the wall.

Sports enthusiasts who sharpen their skills of visual concentration usually find that they actually seem to have more time to react and thus play better.

How To Improve Your Vision Skills

Clues You Can Use—It is not always easy for athletes to recognize that they could benefit from some attention to their eyes and vision.

Many people are remarkably adept at adapting to their vision problems or their level of vision skills. They assume everyone sees the way they do. Others may have good vision skills that enable them to play well but, if sharpened, could help them to play even better. It is a matter of "what you are compared to what you could be."

Arthur Ashe, for example, was a senior in college and well on his way to being a tennis pro before he realized his vision needed help. His clue? He could not read a road sign from a distance that a teammate could. Today, Ashe wears contact lenses.

Billie Jean King was 13 when her tennis game reached a level that no amount of practice seemed to improve. Yet that was not enough to send her running to a doctor of optometry. It was not until she noticed she was copying math problems off the chalkboard incorrectly that she sought help and found that, with glasses, she could do math and play tennis better.

While Ashe and King were both off the court when they first suspected they had vision problems, doctors of optometry say there are sports performance clues to vision needs that can be spotted by alert players, coaches and spectators.

These include playing worse rather than better even after much practice; frequently missing easy plays; squinting; inconsistent performance from game to game; difficulty playing under lights indoors or outdoors.

Racquetball players may need help from a doctor of optometry if they consistently have difficulty being set when returning balls and serves; hit on the rim of the racquet excessively rather than on the center strings; or consistently swing too early or too late.

Doctors of optometry, however, point out that a person's sports performance does not always give clues to a vision

problem or to the need to hone vision skills. Many professional athletes and U.S. Olympic contenders are examples of persons who are performing well above average but who could do better with sharper vision skills.

For this reason, doctors of optometry recommend that professional athletes, young people aiming for the Olympics or a career in sports and anyone who enjoys playing his or her best have a thorough optometric examination regularly, with an emphasis on sports vision skills. Regularly means once a year for those age 5 through 25 and for those over 35. Once every two years may be sufficient for those between 25 and 35, although some persons may need care more often.

The Vision Specialist To See—Two health professionals examine eyes—optometrists (O.D.) and ophthalmologists (M.D. or D.O.).

The latter concentrate on treating eye disease with drugs or surgery and are the ones to see promptly if a serious eye injury should happen. Although their specialty training is centered in these areas, most also prescribe glasses and contact lenses.

Optometrists are the major providers of vision care in the United States. A growing number specialize in sports vision. They hold the doctor of optometry (O.D.) degree, which requires a minimum of six or seven years of college- and professional-level education, although 75 percent of last year's entering class in the four-year professional optometry course had bachelor's degrees or higher.

Licensed in all states and the District of Columbia, doctors of optometry diagnose vision problems and detect eye diseases and symptoms of certain general health problems, such as high blood pressure or diabetes, that often show up first in the eyes. At this writing, 35 states permit doctors of optometry to use ocular pharmaceutical agents for diagnostic and/or therapeutic purposes.

In the course of treating diagnosed vision problems, doctors of optometry may prescribe glasses or contact lenses. They may also use vision therapy to help patients develop and enhance vision skills.

Optometric patients with disease signs are referred to the proper health professional for care. This might be a family practitioner, internist, sports medicine specialist, neurologist, ophthalmologist or others.

The Vision Care To Get—Because sports participants call upon their bodies to function at peak levels, they need thorough health care, including thorough vision care.

A thorough optometric examination takes from 30 to 60 minutes on the first visit and includes a battery of tests. While the specific tests given will vary with each patient's individual needs, all examinations should cover:

- a review of the patient's and family's general health and eye health history;
- examination of the eye's exterior and interior for signs of eye disease or general health problems, such as high blood pres-

The Sands National Open

The First National Invitational OPEN Racquetball Tournament held at the Sands Hotel and Casino December 17-19, 1982, was an unqualified success by any definition. Every player walked away from the tournament feeling like a winner.

The supporting sponsor of this event was LITE Beer from Miller. The official ball was the PENN ball.

Racquetball's best competed on the five home courts of the Sand's Superb Racquetball and Health Club. The Sands National Invitational Open marked the first time the U.S. National Team competed in a domestic event, as well as the first state champions from New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania competed in a championship against the best players from the U.S.A. and Canada.

This event was a milestone in the development of the sport in that a major resort hosted a tournament of this magnitude for the first time.

One hundred top players competed in eight divisions. Divisions included Men's Open, Women's Open, Men's 30-34, Men's 35-44, Men's B, Women's B, Women's 30+, and Men's 45+.

Players were selected on the basis of their national ranking and qualifying in either the National Championships, Northeast Regional Championships, Long Island Open, the New York, New Jersey, or Pennsylvania State Championships.

Larry Fox of Cincinnati, Ohio, the #1 seed, emerged triumphant over Dan Obremski of N. Huntington, Pennsylvania by the scores of 21-19, 21-14. Larry's years of experience and ability

to control the pace of the game was too much to overcome for Dan Obremski. Larry proved why he has been considered one of the top 4 players in the country for the last three years. Tom Montalbano of Brentwood, Long Island, New York, finished third.

The Women's Open Division as the site for a ferocious battle for the title with three present and former National Champions competing. Cindy Baxter of Lewistown, Pennsylvania bested Dot Fischl of Allentown, Pennsylvania by scores of 18-21, 21-16, 11-10. Malea Kamahoa finished third.

levels provided fierce action in all categories from Novice to Open. Over 30 categories of play were offered. Over 180 women proved they constitute a meaningful force in tournament racquetball. Over 40 percent of the participants played in the Novice, CC, C and Vet C divisions, and they exhibited every bit as much enthusiasm and competitive spirit as the more seasoned tourney veterans.

The S. I. OPEN title continues to be the most prestigious championship to be held in the Northeast while continuing to attract and satisfy the beginning player. For over 20% of the players this was their first tournament.

Historically, the interest in any tournament focuses on the Open division. This interest was well deserved at this year's Long Island Open.

The Men's OPEN Category

All sports enjoy the thrill of classic rivalries that develop between protagonists over a period of time. Some of the famous rivalries include the Yankees vs. Boston in baseball, the Islanders vs. Rangers in hockey, Bjorn Borg vs. Jimmy Connors in tennis, Army vs. Navy in college football, Russel vs. Chamberlain in basketball, Ali vs. Frazier in boxing. Racquetball in the Northeast is developing its own classic confrontation — Ruben Gonzalez vs. Jimmy Cascio. Ruben Gonzalez was on the scene first, quickly becoming a crowd favorite with his trademarked incredible "gets" and "dives". Just as it looked like Ruben would totally dominate the sport, a player burst out from the Novice, C category to issue challenge. This player, Jimmy Cascio, rose from losing in the first round of the Novice category to winning Open division titles within two years. The battle of these two goliaths of racquetball has raged in arenas spanning the US, from East to West.

The L I OPEN has served as a major stop in this series of contests. Would Jimmy's premier shooting ability, combined with his Niederhoffer-like passes and pinches, Hogan splats and Yellen's coolness, be enough to defeat Ruben's anticipation, quickness, backhand pinchers, overhead drives and ability to control a match? In the two tournaments previous to the L I OPEN, Jimmy had vanquished Ruben. The questions everybody asked were: would Jimmy keep his streak of victories going; was the slight edge that means victory starting to slide towards Jimmy; would Jim be able to win the title that has eluded him in his own backyard or would Ruben win the title he claimed two years ago?

A full crowd of more than 750 people was on hand to witness another saga in the continuing story of Ruben Gonzalez vs. Jimmy Cascio. Ruben served notice that he was still a force to contend with by winning the Championship in two games. The momentum gained in this match carried Ruben into the semifinals of the Men's Pro Tour the following weekend.

The Women's OPEN Category

The Women's Open was the battle-

field for Bonnie Stoll vs. Tammy Hajjar in the finals. Bonnie proved to be the better player by besting Tammy Hajjar in close games. The Women's Open Doubles division ended in a 3 way tie for 1st place necessitating a playoff. Tammy Hajjar and her partner Val Paese obtained retribution for her loss in the singles by beating out Bonnie Stoll and Cira Nickerson for the Women's Open Doubles title.

The L. I. Open Men's Open Doubles title has, since its inception belonged to one man — Artie Diemar. Mr. Diemar has won every L. I. Open Doubles title from the first to the sixth with different partners each time. Teams have traveled from far (Chicago, Texas, Rochester) and wide (Massachusetts, Florida) to challenge his run. Artie has managed

to beat off all challengers and solidify his reputation as one of the best doubles players in this country.

sure or hardening of the arteries that may manifest themselves in the eyes;

- tests of the current ability to see sharply and clearly at near and far distances;

- tests to determine nearsightedness, farsightedness or astigmatism—all common problems that can blur vision, sometimes cause visual discomfort and usually interfere with maximum sports performance;

- a check of eye coordination and eye muscle function to be certain the eyes are working together as a team;

- a test of the ability to change focus easily from near to far and vice versa; and
- a glaucoma test for patients over 35 or for those whose health history or other findings indicate a need.

Persons who participate in sports professionally, at the amateur level, on a school team or for recreation should be certain to discuss their sports performance with the doctor of optometry at the time of the examination.
