Joann Russell, age 69, and husband Duane, 71, paired up at the 1997 United States Racquetball Association (USRA) Doubles Championships and captured gold in the Mixed 65+ division

Duane, is a veteran player of 41 years, while Joann just began playing last summer in their hometown of Lansing The couple comprised the only team in the 65+ division and had to "play down" into a three-team 60+ division on a round-robin format where they captured the bronze medal.

Duane topped off the championship weekend by also taking the bronze medal along with his partner, Marvin Schinagle of Cleveland, Ohio in the Men's 70+ division

The event celebrated its 30th anniversary and was co-sponsored by Ektelon and ProPENN

In Michigan, this year has started out great with some exciting tournaments. Ken Bonnett's One on One Series had some good draws at the January tournament at the Jewish Community Center and also in February at the Grand Rapids MAC. The Player's Club event in Warren also saw some stiff competition.

The re-opening of the Total Sports Athletic Club in Mt. Clemens drew over 130 participants. It reminded me of old-time racquetball as play ran from Friday night right through Sunday at 6:00 p.m. Augie, Bob and Dianna invited the Canadians to participate and it turned out to be the biggest non-championship event in Michigan in the last few years.

In January, I was also busy with the yearly Leadership Conference, entitled this year as "The Business of Racquetball" Also, representing Michigan were Jim Easterling (Refereeing) and Ron Pudduck (National Masters). Ron was still sky high over the University of Michigan Rose Bowl win and spent several minutes during his presentation showing his true maize and blue colors.

RAM membership has been under 400 for a year now and I would like to reach 500 once again. We are in the bottom half of the states in total memberships
