Grievance procedure works

McDonald can play

JACKSONVILLE — A nasty legal battle was thwarted when the rules committee of the American Amateur Racquetball Association (AARA) allowed the entry of Gainesville's Martha McDonald and her husband, Greg, in the AARA National Doubles Championship.

The McDonalds won the state title in the 30+ category and finished second in the Southeast Regional Championships last month, but Martha was informed after the match by Southeastern AARA Commissioner and AARA National President Van Dubolsky that a complaint had been filed and that she might not be allowed to compete in the nationals.

"I was told because the AARA provided a division for women, that I wasn't allowed to participate in the men's division," McDonald said.

Dubolsky, who personally sided with McDonald, had to ride the diplomatic fence and allow the rules committee to render a judgement. McDonald was told the fact she competed in the state and regional AARA championships had no bearing on the nationals because one didn't have to qualify for the nationals and all three tournaments are independent of each other. However, the results of the states and regionals affect the seedings for the nationals.

McDonald hired a lawyer, Gary Raven, who ironically was her husband's former doubles partner before a knee injury shortened his tournament career.

The battle didn't reach the courts when the AARA's National Rules Committee allowed her to play. "I was pulling for Martha all the way and can't imagine why someone would make an issue of it," Dubolsky said. "But someone did and it had to go through the proper channels."

If the rules committee had denied her application, McDonald would have been able to appeal to the AARA's Board of Directors. If an unfavorable decision had been made, McDonald said her lawyer would have sought an injunction to prevent the tournament from taking place.

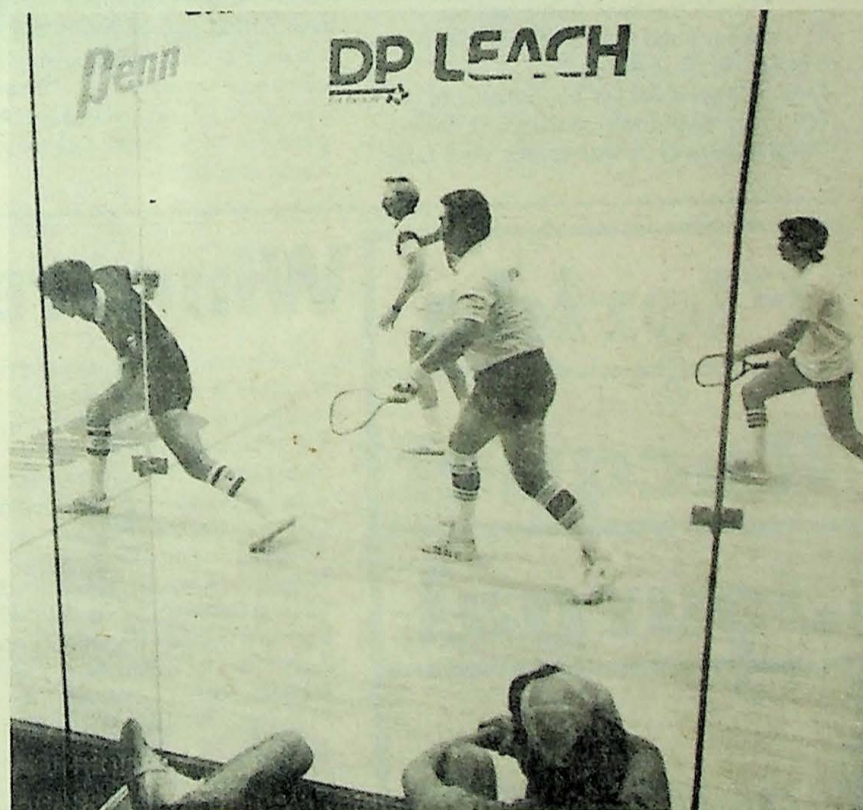
McDonald vehemently disagrees with the notion that women shouldn't be allowed to play in men's divisions. "At the regionals there wasn't even a

draw of eight women's teams. While the AARA provides equal divisions, it doesn't provide competition. It's a fact of the game, there is very little competition and no depth in women's racquetball. When I played in three-wall indoor tournaments, no one would enter the division if word leaked out that I was entering the tournament. That's the way society is.

"Greg and I plan to play until we are 70."

While Dubolsky sides with McDonald, he says the issue still might be tested. "The AARA has to protect itself. What if a man wants to enter a women's division and we refuse. He then sues us. Therefore, this issue, while I can't understand it, has to be settled."

Yellen exhibitions set

Mike Yellen, the No. 1 ranked player in the world the last five years, will be putting on a couple of exhibitions in conjunction with Florida Racquet Journal Tournaments.

People want to see him play and if we have him on the court a couple of hours, they'll have the opportunity to see why he's been the most consistent player in the sport the last five years. He'll be around the club to answer any questions, take pictures and sign autographs after the exhibition."

Yellen, 26, is sponsored by Ektelon, the nation's leading racquetball manufacturer. Three years ago he became the first player in racquetball history to sign a million dollar contract.

(Jacksonville, Florida—September 17, 1986)***Over 500 top amateur racquetball players from the US and Canada will vie for national titles in the 1986 US National Doubles Racquetball Championships, October 23-26 at the Racquetpower Club in Jacksonville, Florida.

Scheduled to compete in the men's open division are the 1985 national defending champions, Andy Roberts of Memphis Tennessee and his partner Tim Anthony of Columbus, Ohio.

Malia Kamahoahoa of Norfolk, Virginia and Toni Bevelock of Memphis, Tennessee, the women's open 1985 national champions, will also be returning to defend their title.

A major highlight of this national event is that the mens and womens

open divisional winners receive automatic berths on the United States National Racquetball Team. The US Team will compete in the Tournament of the Americas, in Venezuela April, 1987 and the Pan American Championships in 1987.

The AARA is recognized by the United States Olympic Committee as the national governing body of racquetball in the United States. 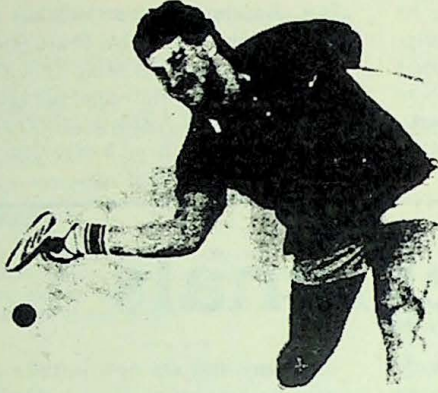

During my stint as a copy boy at the New York Daily News where I was a gopher, sports columnist Dick Young told me: "when they don't talk about you, you're not writing a very good column."

The Passing Shots column on page one with my five year old picture, has generated the most reaction. It's amazing how a one liner will get people bent out of shape. Yes, I'm sure there are some things we've said over the years that have been irresponsible and some readers will never forgive us. But despite all the critics, publishing the Journal has been lots of fun.

The most ridiculous court case I've ever heard was when a fellow sued a ladder manufacturer. The fellow planted his ladder in some horse manure and it didn't hold. He then sued the manufacturer because there was no warning label on the ladder.

The court system almost had to listen to another absurd case. All Martha McDonald wants to do is compete in doubles tournaments with her husband. Some males, with fragile egos, feel she shouldn't play in the men's division when a women's division is offered. They threatened to enter the women's division. The AARA, which has enough to do with its limited staff, doesn't need the legal hassles of such a trivial matter. The rules committee of the AARA said Martha and her husband could play in the tournament, but the issue will surely come up in the future.

In Georgia, Caryn McKinney, the world's No. 2 ranked female player, isn't allowed to

play in the men's open division. Because she was winning too many open tournaments, they created a new rule preventing women from playing against men. Before the rule she entered a men's open division and was given three options: 1) to tank the match, 2) to forfeit, or 3) play and the rest of the field would drop out.

Doesn't the sport of racquetball have other things to deal with instead of making women playing in mens divisions a crucial issue? If a 30-year old man enters a women's age group division, what is he exactly proving? The whole subject is ridiculous.

As a tournament promoter, the AARA needs to find other means to increase its membership. Relying on tournament players to sustain the organization simply won't work. Take Florida, as an example. There are 2,000 members yet close to 250,000 participants. It doesn't take a Rhodes Scholar to

figure that something is amiss. Solutions to this problem should be brought up at national tournaments. I'm not saying we have the solution, but somehow club owners have to feel they benefit if their club members join the AARA.

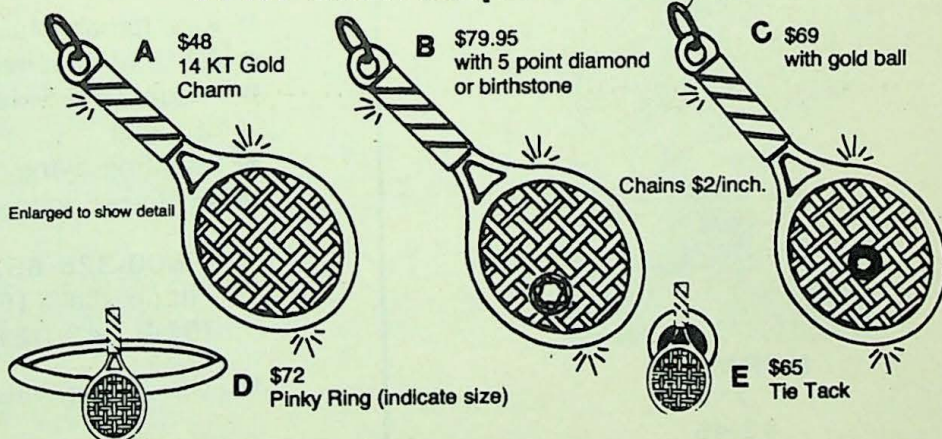
