Three from Michigan hed to festival

This year's AARA Nationals held May 22-27 in Houston, Texas, saw two more players from Michigan, Joel Bonnett and Chris Cole, qualify for the United States Olympic Festival. They join Jim Floyd as representatives from our state who will try to bring home the gold from the tournament to be held in Los Angeles, California July 11-18.

At last year's Olympic Festival, the same threesome competed with Floyd/Bonnett taking fourth in doubles and Cole grabbing the silver in singles. This year will be different though, as Floyd teams up with new partner Tim Hansen to try to make it three

national titles in a row. Previously this season, they won the gold at the National Doubles and the Tournament of the Americas. Bonnett will be playing singles in the Festival for the first time while Cole will try to improve on his 11-9 tie breaker loss to 1990 World Champion Egan Inoue. This trip will be Floyd's third to the Olympic Festival, Bonnett's and Cole's second.

Though they qualified, it was a disappointing week for the Michigan trio. All three were looking at realistic shots at making the semifinals. As Houston can be tough, the road was wrought with peril

as all three Michiganians fell in the round of 16.

Cole seeded seventh, lost a gut-wrenching match to Texan Mike Guidry in an 11-10 tie breaker. Floyd never got going, losing to #5 seed Brian Hawkes of California, while Bonnett fell to Hansen in the tie breaker. Therefore, overall finishes for the Michigan team left Cole to take 9th place, Bonnett 10th and Floyd 16th.

"I used up too much energy in the first game," Bonnett said, "and I didn't have anything left for the tie breaker." Floyd, however, had a different assessment: "I felt real slow and couldn't get a lot of his serves. I just never got comfortable with the whole match." And, Cole had this somber reply, "I won't dwell on this loss. So what if it was an 11-10 tie breaker and cost me a spot on the U.S. National Team. No big deal. If you will excuse me, I am going to see just how loud a splat I can make jumping from the 30th floor of the Hyatt."

Besides the three amigos mentioned above, other players from Michigan made the trek to Texas: Troy Hall, Mike Johnston, Stu and Joetta Hastings, Chris Kelly, Leroy Towns, Gary Phipps, Stacey Barbas, Sandy and Jack White, Mark Werthman, Jim Earley, Clair Kruse, Diane and Chuck McCauley, Debbie and Mike Hotra and Rick Vanderlind all represented our state well.

Congrats to Stu Hastings who took the bronze in Men's 35+.

Next up on the National scene for Floyd will be the Pacific Rim International Championships in Hawaii on June 22. Then comes the Festival in July where hopefully all three qualifiers from our state

will be successful.

The Road to the Gold is arduous and taxing on the mind, body and soul. One thing, however is certain: to get there you must pass through Michigan and our boys to get there.

Outdoor racquetball offers fun in the sun

It's summer and time to take it easy: play some golf, go on a few picnics, hit the beach and get a tan or try some watersports. Whatever you chose for summer enjoyment, it is definitely time to put away all the racquetball equipment

until next Fall — after all, who wants to be cooped up inside, when there is great weather outside, right? Maybe, but who says that racquetball has to be played inside?

It may be summer, but it is actually a great time to grab a racquet (usually an old one) and head for the outdoor

courts. If you have not tried racquetball outside, then you don't know what you are missing. The rules are basically the same as indoor racquetball, but the outdoor game is unique in itself. Let me explain.

First, there isn't a backwall in outdoor racquetball and a passing shot literally goes right past you. Secondly, you cannot just cream the ball — shots past the 40 foot mark on the fly are considered out and result in either a point or a side out. You might think this could never happen to you, but just spend a few minutes on an outdoor court and my

point will be proven. Balls that hit just before the end line are still in play and one must go and return them — therefore it is expected that one has to hit a 50 foot kill shot at

many times throughout the game.

The equipment necessary in outdoor racquetball can be found in most of our closets: old racquets (because concrete walls are tough on new ones), sun glasses, wide brim hats, suntan lotion and old racquetballs are just about all that you will need.

Courts are located at Council Park in Warren, Civic Arena in St. Clair Shores, Belle Isle in Detroit and the Civic Center in Southfield with some of the aforementioned even holding tournaments.

Outdoor racquetball is great mostly because it is played outdoors: you can work on your tan, have a picnic and avoid cutting the grass. It is a fun and unique game and a great way to keep your interest in racquetball over the summer.

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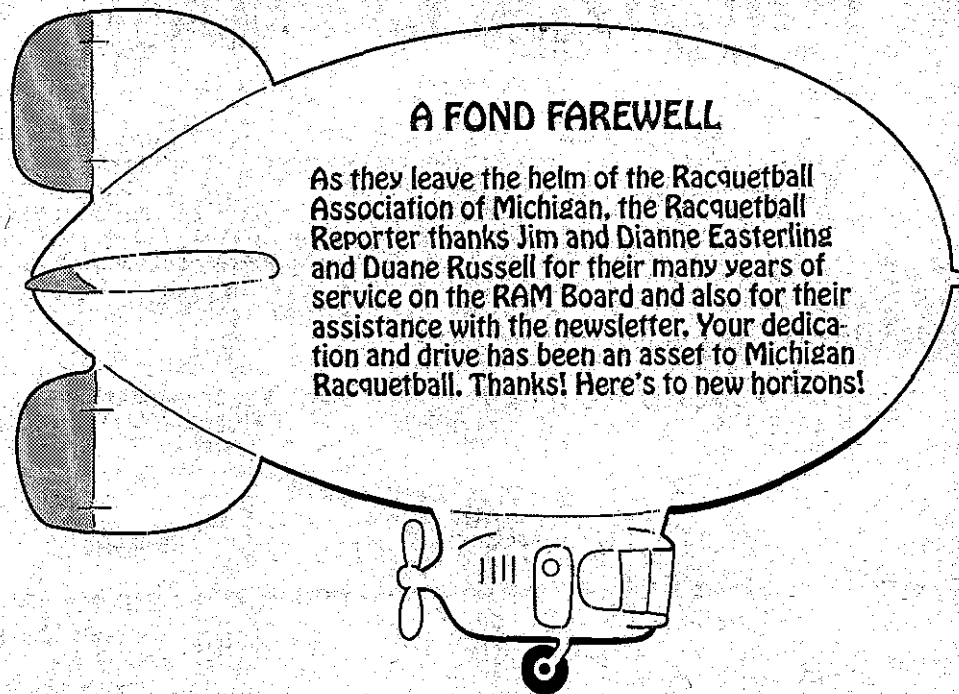

Next meeting to be May 6th at the Easterling's at 7 p.m.

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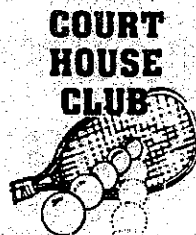
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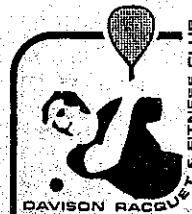
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
