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MICHIGAN CROWNS TWO NATIONAL CHAMPIONS IN HOUSTON

Nationals. "The Road to the Finals". Houston, Texas. Every year, this Memorial Day tradition calls the best racquetball players from across the US to play for the title of National Champion. This year nearly 600 plyaers signed on to face the challenge including fifteen members of Team Michigan. When all was said and done, the members earned eight medals, and Michigan welcomed two new National Champions to its storied history.

Making a return trip, back by popular demand. Paula Saad returned to Houston for the first time in roughly a decade to test her game against some of the best. After surviving an 11-10 tiebreaker scare in the first round of the Women's 35+A division, Paula posted a solid 15-7, 15-5 victory in the semis. This set up a tough final against an athletic opponent, who might have been a few years younger. In the Final, her challenger put up a great fight, but Paula and her crack coaching staff put together a game plan that could not fail. In the end. Paula's shot-making was too much and she claimed her first National Championship.

Jack Huczek. The name is enough to inspire fear in his opponents, and a certain feeling that, "Well, I didn't want to win this one, anyway". Jack had a spectacular year dating back to a Pan Am Gold playing for TEAM USA last summer. He won several pro stops and held the #1 position for several months until the very

last match of the season. Next on his agenda was to regain the title of National Champion. As the second seed, Jack cruised into the Finals to once again face Rocky Carson. This tournament has seen this match up several times in recent years, each an epic battle. This time was not any different. After a grueling two and a half hours, Jack emerged victorious and earned his second Men's Open National Championship.

In other action at Houston....

One of the most improved ladies in Michigan in the past few seasons has been **Karen Green**. Karen came to Houston looking to add Singles Gold to her Doubles National Championship. In the Women's 45+A division, Karen survived two tiebreakers to advance to the Finals. Karen fell just short as she couldn't drag this one to the third game. Karen earned a Silver medal in this division and a Bronze in the Women's 40+A division to become Michigan's only double-medalist. Congratulations to Karen for a great finish to a great season.

Last season **Tim Couch** was playing in the C division back home. This season he pounded his way to several tournament wins in the Men's B including a State Championship. He brought his power and

In August, Felicia Mann hosted Michigan's first World Outdoor Racquetball event at Belle Isle. Anyone who has had the opportunity to play 3-wall knows how much fun it is and W.O.R. hopes to take it to a whole new level.

The West Michigan Open Pro Am is bringing Professional Racquetball to Michigan for the first time in a decade. Our own Jack Huczek has agreed to play and will take on all challengers in this IRT sanctioned event.

Beginning this season, USA Racquetball will have a completely new ranking system. The system is based not on points, but on actual head-to-head competition. If one player beats another, the winner gets ranked higher. Over the next year or so, enough results will be entered to generate a more reliable ranking source. It will help directors with seeding, and should help prevent misclassification of players at tournaments. This is a big benefit to everyone!

Reigning National Champion Jack Huczek spent much of the last season ranked #1 before ending up at #2. This season will see Jack make a run at the top spot. I, for one, wouldn't bet against him.



Most would hang their heads, Mr. Russell proudly wore

his Silver medal the rest of the weekend and kept up the great demeanor for which he is so well known to all players and spectators alike.

Charles Kaiser was looking for his first National Championship while competing in the Men's 70+ division. This was a brutally difficult twelve-man division, where the athleticism was almost as impressive as the camaraderie. A tough loss in the semis put Mr. Kaiser up against top seeded Don Alt, who was upset in his semi. Mr. Kaiser made it difficult, but in the end could not hold off the former National Champion. Mr. Kaiser added a fourth place medal to his trophy case.

Also medaling was **Twayne M. Howard**. The 2003 National Champion in the 25+C/D division came into the 2004 tournament fighting back problems, but still holding high hopes. It was not to be as

Twayne went a disappointing 1 win and 6 losses (including three tiebreakers) on the week. The one win was a revenge win and enough to make it to the medal round of the 30+B division. Twayne salvaged the fourth place medal and vowed to do better next year.

Also competing from Michigan were Michael Anderson, Anthnita Dickerson, Lewis Forrest, Pete Harvey, Sharon Huczek, and Andrew Nierman. Unable to make the trip this year due to injuries were Tom Blakeslee and Melody Gorno.

Our goal is to raise the skill level and awareness of the rules of the game among our junior players, as well as to increase the total number of junior players in Michigan. Whenever junior players go to a tournament, they will notice other players who have earned the Tshirts representing the higher achievement levels. QUALIFICATIONS FOR TEAM MICHIGAN JUNIOR RACQUETBALL

Team Michigan Junior Racquetball consists of four levels-White, Red, Blue and Gold. To qualify as a member of Team Michigan, all junior participants must demonstrate excellent sportsmanship both on and off the court. In addition, junior players must pass the requirements outlined below. To qualify for a higher level, players must demonstrate the skills and knowledge listed below to their racquetball director. Players may test throughout the year, with the first test

in each division at no charge. If a player does not pass into the next level after the first test, he or she may test again for a charge of \$10.00, with a maximum of testing two times per year for any one level. Once a player moves to the next level, he or she will be given a free shirt that will match the color of the achieved level. Players do not have to test for each level in succession, however it is recommended for most junior players to follow this progression. It is understood, however, that players testing for higher divisions will be able to demonstrate any and all skills and knowledge listed under lower divisions.

White Level

Players must either participate in the State Singles Tournament to qualify or they must demonstrate the following skills and knowledge:

- 1. Hit five forehand shots off the front wall.
- 2. Hit five backhand shots off the front wall.
- 3. Hit three out of five serves.
- Be able to explain the following: skip ball, fault serve types, hinders, side outs and scoring format.

Red Level

- 1. Hit five out of ten forehand shots down the line.
- Hit five out of ten forehand shots crosscourt.
- 3. Hit five out of ten backhand shots down the line.
- 4. Hit five out of ten backhand shots crosscourt.
- 5. Hit three different types of serves (i.e. drive, z and lob). Five out ten attempts to pass. Some serves may be repeated.

TEAM MICHIGAN

JUNIOR RACQUETBALL

Blue Level

- 1. Hit seven out of ten forehand shots down the line.
- 2. Hit seven out of ten forehand shots crosscourt.
- 3. Hit seven out of ten backhand shots down the line.
- 4. Hit seven out of ten backhand shots crosscourt.
- Hit seven out of ten serves to the right side of the court using at least three different types of serves.
- Hit seven out of ten serves to the left side of the court using at least three different types of serves.
- Racquetball director will hit a set up to the junior player whereby the ball will come off the back wall and the junior player must return the ball to the front wall (five out of ten attempts using either forehand or backhand).
- Racquetball director will hit a blast shot (one that hits the front wall and travels to the back wall without bouncing) and the junior player must return the ball to the front wall (five out of ten attempts using either forehand or backhand.)
- 9. Hit two consecutive ceiling balls to the forehand side (four attempts).
- 10. Hit two consecutive ceiling balls to the backhand side (five attempts).
- 11. Hit three out of ten forehand pinch shots.
- 12. Explain or describe a situation where a replay would occur.
- 13. Explain or describe the encroachment line.
- 14. Explain or describe a screen serve.

Gold Level

The gold division is the highest level that a junior player may achieve. It is understood that at this level, racquetball directors may ask the junior player to demonstrate some of the skills listed in other levels. The purpose of this suggestion is to insure that before awarding a gold level to a player, that he or she will be proficient in every aspect of the prior levels.

All gold level players must pass the referee certification test before even attempting (cont. page 7)

any skills tests. All gold level players must mentor another junior player and have this process verified by the player, his or her parents and or their racquetball director.

- 1. Hit five out of ten forehand pinch shots.
- 2. Hit three out of ten backhand pinch shots.
- 3. Hit two out of ten forehand reverse pinch shots.
- 4. Hit two out of ten backhand reverse pinch shots.
- Hit five out of ten lob serves to the forehand side that do not come off the backwall.
- Hit five out of ten lob serves to the backhand side that do not come off the backwall.
- Racquetball director will hit a fore hand or backhand ceiling ball and the junior player will execute an offensive shot from that ceiling ball (five out of ten attempts each).
- 8. Hit three out of five drive Z serves to the forehand.
- 9. Hit three out of five drive Z serves to the backhand.
- 10. Hit three out of five lob Z serves to the forehand
- 11. Hit three out of five lob Z serves to the backhand.

Players must also choose one of the following shots and execute two out of six attempts:

- 1. A Z shot.
- 2. A splat.
- 3. An around-the-world ball that doesn't come off the back wall.

- 4. A shot between the legs (from a set up either by the player or the director).
- 5. A behind the back shot (from a set up either by the player or the director.)
- 6. An overhead pinch, reverse pinch or kill shot.


Finally, and maybe most importantly, the Racquetball Association of Michigan Board is the most active board we've had in years. Ron Barton was added as our eleventh member and several more are


