2007 STATE SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIPS RETURN TO DAVISON ATHLETIC CLUB

The DAC is a world class club, and was a terrific host for the event. Randy Minto and his staff went all out to show the players a great time and a great time was had by all.

Lets get right to the action. For the first time ever, the Juniors competed in both age and skill divisions. This allowed for maximum competition and lots of fun for the kids.

Caylee Brookshire won the Girls Multibounce Division after getting past Caitlin Sparks in the finals. Mariah Titsworth and Kelly Standfast were the semifinalists. Some of the most fun games to watch were among these future stars. Look for them to shoot up the ranks in the years to come.

The Boys 8 and Under Multi-bounce Championship went to Cameron Clolinger who got past Braeden D'Almeida in the finals. David Zeng, Sawyer Lerner and Andy Barnett also competed.

Cory Zeng defeated his sister Mary Zeng to win the 10 and Under Division. That must have been a tough ride home. Connor Cowan and Zachary D'Almeida were the semi-finalists.

The Juniors 12 and Under has been one of the biggest divisions over the past few years, and this year was no exception. A tough final went to **Sam Zeng** who defeated **Mercedes Arias** to win the

Championship. **Nathan Tucker** and **Ines Lecland** were the semi-finalists.

The Juniors 14 and Under Championship went to southpaw **Brad Schopieray** who closed out **Eric Sporer** in the finals. **Trevor Sporer** and **Mike Bowles** rounded out the division.

Although several Juniors have made huge strides this season, **Andrew Price** is clearly in a class by himself. Andrew made his way through the Juniors 16 and Under Division, and defeated **Lucas Arias** to take the title. **Matt Barbusack** and **Bryan Schopieray** were the semifinalists.

2007 BELLE ISLE RACQUETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year was a year of many "firsts" in the more than 25 year history of our Belle Isle Racquetball Championship Tournament. This was the first time our tournament was classified as one of the four WOR (World Outdoor Racquetball) Grand Slam Events, we had a professional singles and doubles divisions, we offered guaranteed prize money, and we played the finals of our tournament at a place other than Belle Isle.

The word tournament doesn't quite describe the Belle Isle experience. You need to include several other words with the word tournament to get the idea of "what we do" — party, event, fantastic, incredible, competition, spectacular, and fun. So in honor of our 2007 Belle Isle Racquetball Championship we are creating a new word *Tournatastic-partacular-funtition-incredivent*! Because "what we do" is all that, and then some -- Webster's be advised.

The tournament began on Saturday, August 18. The weather was 72 degrees and sunny, and that's when it started to get really HOT! The racquetball heated up, and the competition melted away. All that was left at the end of the day were the semi-finalists and finalists. There was our classic Belle Isle hospitality and barbecue, an ice cold keg of beer, and in the afternoon a DJ spinning classic Motown until the lights were turned out on the courts. All this was happening while the best outdoor racquetball was being played.

The Men's Pro Division went as expected. In the round of 16, Ron Barton defeated Paul Stanwick in a long match, that went to the tiebreaker, with "Big Daddy" Barton pulling it out in the end. Paul valiantly chased "Big Daddy's" rocket ceiling balls time after time, but it was to no avail. Ron just used his extensive repertoire of Belle Isle shots to take Paul down. In the second round of 16 match Chris Kelly advanced by beating Brian Berkelhamer. Brian is a top level indoor player, but this was his first time outdoors and that proved to be a disaster for him. Chris' outdoor knowledge and experience, as well as his power, serving, and pin point shooting, was the difference.

Chris Kelly took his win and went up against **Jeff Mullins** in the first quarterfinal match. Chris did his best, but was no match for Jeff's speed, power and youth. Jeff Mullins advanced in two games. The second quarterfinal match pitted "Big Daddy" **Greg Lewerenz** against the #53 ranked player on the IRT Tour, **Shannon Kohl**. This was also Shannon's first outdoor tournament, and "Big Daddy" Greg was

set to take advantage. It was time to see how Shannon's power and skill would stack up against Greg's Belle Isle experience. It was time for Shannon's lesson in Belle Isle Racquetball 101. Unfortunately for "Big Daddy", Shannon was a very quick student. Shannon's power, skill, fitness and youth bested Greg in two competitive games. In the last quarterfinal of the day was "Big Daddy" Ron Barton against the #10 player on the IRT Tour, **Andy** Hawthorne. Andy was another of the outdoor newbies, having never smelled the fresh air of the outdoors while playing racquetball. "Big Daddy" Ron was ready, his game face was on, and it was time to see how a top indoor pro would do against one of Belle Isle's best. "Big Daddy" Ron indoctrinated Andy at Belle Isle with one photon ceiling ball after another, but Andy chased each down with his cat-like speed and reflexes. Andy even used some of his indoor diving skill to keep rallies alive. In the end it was Andy's power, speed, skill, and youth, that overcame "Big Daddy" Ron in two long competitive games.

The first semifinal saw the World's #1 player, **Jack Huczek** against Jeff Mullins. Jeff fought for his life with dives, gets, and everything in his bag of tricks, but it wasn't enough to overcome Jack's awesome ability. Jack advanced to the finals in two games. The second semifinal saw Andy Hawthorne against Shannon Kohl. This was youth against youth, speed against speed, and power against power. Their collective combination of speed, skill, and power, made for incredible rallies as they went shot for shot, kill for kill and ace for ace. They had the crowd on the edge of their seats for the entire match. In the end, Andy prevailed with a little more of everything that Shannon.

The stage was set for a great final. The two top seeds, Jack Huczek and Andy Hawthorne, were geared up for a war! The venue was changed to Total Sports, due to a total rain out on Sunday, which changed the dynamics of the match. Andy made it clear that he would have preferred to face Jack outdoors at Belle Isle, because he had never beaten Jack indoors. Having said this, the venue change didn't faze either competitor, and they brought everything they had to win the money and title of 2007 Belle Isle Racquetball Pro Champion. It was truly a pleasure for all those in attendance to watch two of the world's best racquetball players duke it out. Andy kept each game competitive and extended many rallies with his incredible diving gets, and superhuman athleticism, but Jack would not be denied. The World's #1 player took the match in three straight games to become the 2007 Belle Isle


RAM HALL OF FAME WELCOMES INDUCTEES CRAIG FINGER AND FRED WIEGAND IN 2007

The Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame welcomed its 28th and 29th Inductees in March of 2007. Honored at the Hall of Fame Banquet held in conjunction with the State Singles Championships at the Davison Athletic Club and Banquet Facility were **Craig Finger** (Michigan) and **Fred Wiegand** (Texas). Both Craig and Fred were very active in racquetball in its early years in Michigan and will be outstanding additions to the Hall of Fame. The 2007 Hall of Fame Banquet also honored the 2006 inductees of Chris Cole and Jimmy Floyd.

Craig currently lives in East Lansing, Michigan; is married and has three children. He was born in 1945 and retired as a psychologist from the State of Michigan.

Craig has won many racquetball, and paddleball, tournaments over the years. He is best known for winning the IRA National Singles Championships in 1970; defeating Charlie Brumfield. In 1971, he finished in second place in the IRA National Singles Championships, losing only to Bill Schmitke.

Fred Wiegand currently lives in Pharr, Texas. In his Michigan heyday, he lived in the metro Detroit area. Fred is married and has four children. He was born in 1931 and retired in 1992 from General Moters.

Fred is best known in Michigan for his running battle with Lynn Hahn, another Hall of Famer, in the 1970's and 80's. He has recently won the 2006 U. S. Open Championship in the 75+ division in Mempis, Tennessee and along the way had to beat the #1 and #2 seeds to claim the title.

Both of these people have been excellent players over the years and it is an honor to welcome both of them into the RAM Hall of Fame. When you get to the MAC Club in East Lansing the next time, take a moment and look for Craig's and Fred's placques as the new Inductees to the Michigan Racqueball Hall of Fame.

Now to our players' finishes as told by Tom Ford.

The Men's Open division was contested for a first place prize of \$100.00. Like last year, it was played in a round robin format. Nineteen year-old phenom, **Alex Ackerman** from Indianapolis, put on a clinic as he lost only one game enroute to his first place finish. After losing to Ackerman in his first round match, **Shannon Kohl** heated up and won second place. Bob Wright from Mishawaka, IN, Mark Widman and veteran player Mike Anderson rounded out the field. Mark had a solid showing in his first attempt in the open division. It's just a matter of time and Mark will really take off. And Mike played great only THREE weeks after knee surgery.

Congratulations to **Mark Widman** who won the Men's A division. Mark won his first match in dramatic fashion by beating **Dave "3-wall" Bushen** with six drive serve aces in the tiebreaker. He then faced some tough drive serves himself as he played lefty Mike Cambon in the semis. Mark prevailed in that one in 2 games. Dan Hahaj from Mishawaka, IN was the other finalist. He first beat Dan Mullin in a tight 3-game match and then Joe Budzynski in the quarters and finally Rick Vrosh in the semis. Dan was not able to play in finals against Mark and had to forfeit the match.

The finals of the Men's B division consisted of a battle between two local players, **Brian Criswell** and **Jay**

Hoinville. Criswell met Bryan Galloway in the semis. Galloway played a great match but in the end, Criswell rolled out too many forehands and won the match. On the other side of the draw, Jay Hoinville played three matches, each going to three games. After edging out Paula Saad in the quarters, Jay won a hard-fought match against Barry Dennis in the semis. All those tough matches may have worn Jay down a bit as Brian rode that big forehand to victory in two games. Congratulations, Brian, on your first tournament win!

The finals of the Men's C division featured a fun match-up between **Jerry Gathright** of St. Joseph and **Dan Deitrich** of Baroda. Jerry showed great touch in the front court and precise pinch shots throughout the tournament. At 55, folks said Jerry looked like a "young Art Murphy." Although Dan played well, Jerry rolled out too many Murphy-like pinches and won the title.

In a marathon match that lasted nearly two hours, newcomer **Bryan Burkey** of Kalamazoo outlasted **Stephen Price** to win the Men's D division. Enroute to the finals, Burkey beat Matt Anderson and Levi Hazen of Mishawaka. Stephen Price beat two other local players in Larry Vestal and James Pike.

The finals of the Men's 30+ A division drew the largest crowd of spectators and featured perhaps the most entertaining match of the tournament. Great matches are often the result of contrasting styles of the players, and there could not have been a greater contrast in styles than there was between **Dave "4-wall" Bushen** and **Rick Vrosh**.

The match, lasting over an hour, showcased Rick's drive serves, powerful forehand, and smart offensive passes and pinches. For Dave's part, the crowd frequently erupted in "hoops and hollers" as he rolled out shots from between the legs at the back wall and kept Rick off balance with his unconventional 3-wall game. In the second game, Vrosh played great "conventional" racquetball to overcome a 12 to 2 deficit and take the lead. Now down 13 to 12, Bushen showed no sign of nerves or concern as he stepped into the service box. Rather, he laughed, flashed his patented pirate's smile, hit his z-serves and rolled off 3 straight points to win the match. The crowd goes wild!

Zachary and younger brother Braeden D'Almeida came from Harrison Township to play in the juniors division that featured four local tournament first timers in Landen Wood, Tristan Wood, Alex Hoinville and Tyler Ford. Each of the boys had a blast and played well. In the end though, Zachary


While most of us were taking the summer off, Sharon Huczek was touring the country, taking on stiff competition, and raking in the Gold Medals.

Drag one out, put it on and go out in public. State Singles and the Aloha Open give out some really cool Dri-Fit shirts. They are perfect for racquetball or any other form of exercise. Lansing, Davison, Kalamazoo and Players all give out great shirts. The West Michigan Open even gives out a polo shirt with an embroidered logo.

The change took place effective February 20, 2007, but will not be applied retroactively. So, after February 19, 2007, anyone who wins two tournaments in the same division must move up to the next higher division immediately. They can return to the lower division for the State Singles Championship only, before returning to the higher division thereafter.

So far, the feedback has been positive. We feel this was a very important move for the growth of racquetball in Michigan.
