The reason people feel so at ease with leaving to play elsewhere is that they can at this time, still play in a Michigan tournament while going away. People are now starting to notice that with three main clubs hosting events, they can almost pick and choose when to play here in the state. Well, that is somewhat true, but the problem is that the draws are getting smaller and smaller at these tournaments and the day may arrive when all tourneys on a state-wide level are extinct.

Case in point, the Livonia doubles tournament that had to be quickly cancelled when they had only one entry by the deadline. One bloody entry! To think for two years I had heard many complaints that the state never ran any doubles tournaments besides State Doubles. Well those same people that moaned and complained for a doubles event ended up playing in a tournament in Windsor that same weekend rather than support an event that they themselves had been clamoring for. That's not cool.

In the future, it would probably be a decent idea for the Michigan racquetball player to look at the entire picture when deciding on whether to play in an out of state tourney. One day there may not be that many to choose from.

Juniors, juniors, juniors, where are all the up and coming lads and girls that used to flourish when I was a teenager? It is high time that juniors became an important goal for all of us who love this game since once we are all gone, the iuniors will be the ones carrying on our sport. I urge any interested in junior development to contact Tom Blakeslee or myself and we will aid you in your effort to promote junior participation.

All in all, this has been a good season for Michigan racquetball and as the months go by, I get more and more comfortable with my job as the President of your state association. If there is any one out there with a comment, concern, or idea please feel free to contact me and I will let you know when the next Board of Directors meeting is. Currently only five people sit on the RAM-Board, hardly enough to adequately care for the needs of all Michigan racquetball players, but we are

doing our best.

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

RULES: AARA Official Rules will govern competition. Two games to 15, tiebreaker to 11.

AGE REQUIREMENT: For age division competition, players must meet the proper age requirement as of 1/1/92.

MEMBERSHIP: AARA memberahip is required of all participants. At the time of registration entrants must present a current membership card, a receipt, or a cancelled check as proof of membership. Non-members will be required to purchase a \$15.00 competitive license memberahip on site.

TRAINING CAMPS: All quarterfinalists in the champsionship divisions will receive an invitation to the U.S. National Junior Elite Training Camp. Be sure to pick up your application at the tournament deak if you reach the qualifying round.

AWARDS: Placques will be given out in each division.

EYEWEAR: Lensed eyewear manufactured for racquet sports is mandatory. AME and Gargoyles are not approved eyewear. Lensed eyewear must be worn over the eyes.

RACQUETS: Racquets that exceed 21 inches in length cannot be used in Regional or National events.

PRIMARY GOAL: The tournament is designed to establish a feeder system to encourage younger athletes to learn and enjoy playing racquetball a sport they can compete in and play for recreation throughout their lives.

OLYMPIC FORMAT: A revised Olympic format will be used in the Junior events. Each participant will be guaranteed two matches.

JUNIOR CODE OF CONDUCT

All participants and chaperones will be asked to sign an official Code of Conduct upon registering for the tournament.

In brief, the Junior Code of Conduct states:

A nightly "in room" curfew of 11 pm unless accompanied by chaperone

There will be no possession or use of prescription drugs unless you are currently under a physician's care (Documentation required)

There will be no possession or use of alcoholic beverages at the tournament sites or host motel.

Any physical damage to a room or loss of nonperishable items in the room (i.e. towels, lamps, etc.) will be paid for by those participants assigned to the room in which the damage or loss occurs.

Unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated:
(a) Any act considered to be an offense under federal, state, local and AARA laws/rules.

- (b) Gross misconduct (i.e. inappropriate horseplay, stealing, etc.)
- (c) Unsportsmanlike Conduct.

PENALTIES:

Violation of the Code of Conduct my result in:

- (1) Full or partial restriction of movement at the tournament;
- (2) Written report to the Executive and Disciplinary Committees for further action;
- (3) Loss of opportunity to participate in future AARA programs;
- (4) Expulsion from tournament will result in being sent home at the player's own expense.
