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Hope Rises For '87 Pan-Am Games

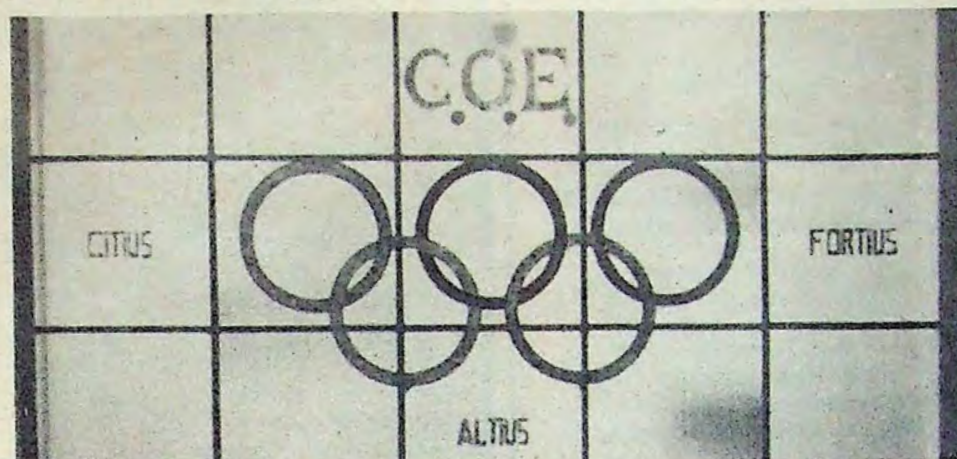
In one of the most historical moments in the young sport of racquetball the Ecuadorian Olympic Committee, headed by President Dr. Sabino Hernandez, met with Luke St. Onge, Executive Director of the International Amateur Racquetball Federation, and Al Walker, Regional Vice President of the I.A.R.F. and South American Commissioner for the I.A.R.F., in Guayaquil, Ecuador to discuss plans for the inclusion of racquetball as a demonstration sport in the 1987 Pan American Games.

St. Onge hand-carried a personal letter from Colonel F. Don Miller, Executive Director of the United States Olympic Committee, which endorses racquetball for the Games. He met with Dr. Sabino Hernandez and Bruno Frixone, President of Provincial Sports in Quito, along with Al Walker who in addition to his involvement with the I.A.R.F. introduced racquetball to Ecuador in 1979 and own the Quito Racquetball Club where the Competition will be held.

The meeting, held in the Olympic Headquarters in Guayaquil, was extremely positive toward the participation of racquetball in the Games. Presi-

dent Hernandez referred to racquetball as a "domestic sport" and was most complimentary concerning the growth of racquetball in Ecuador.

There are six International sports vying for the Pan Am Games as demonstration sports, but racquetball definitely has the inside track. With the full support of Ecuador as well as the United States, racquetball's accep-

tance is assured — but final approval will take place at the meeting of Pan American Sports Federations May 1st in Cuba.

To accommodate the anticipated 500 press reporters and television coverage, the Quito Racquetball Club has agreed to build two glass exhibition courts which will meet the needs of some 1,000 persons during the finals. Ten countries will compete and will qualify through Regional and World Championship Competition.

The overall impact of this most historic development will go far in accelerating racquetball's quest to become an Olympic Sport. The net results in grassroots development will be tremendous, as racquetball's image and reputation will be equal to that of such sports as baseball, swimming, track and field, volleyball, etc.

In the past several months we have seen dramatic developments in our sport that could not have been predicted last year at this time. It is alarming how many in our industry are not aware, or do not take the time to find out exactly what is going on. The dooms-dayers are still around and amazingly enough, many still hold positions of influence within the industry.

Although the overwhelming atmosphere at this year's International Racquet Sports Convention was once again optimistic for the future, little emphasis was placed on racquetball. Once again there were numerous new ideas of how to convert your courts to squash, volleyball, box soccer, etc. There was little emphasis on programming for racquetball or how racquetball itself is changing as a new type of player is attracted to the sport.

Some of our magazines deal in superfluous articles concerning celebrities or editorials that have little to do with the sport.

There was one particular article that dealt with eyeguards. We are not going

to attract many players or supporters outside our industry by displaying a player lying prone on the floor with a ball protruding out of his eye. This certainly is an overkill to convincing players to wear eyeguards, or to a new player who walks on the court. As our sport matures, those in an influential position must use good common sense when publishing.

Ours is a unique sport, for other than a limited number of municipal courts our sport is played without the support of federal, state and local government spending. Racquetball courts are not included in Parks and Recreation, and our sport does not benefit from these programs as do soccer, baseball, tennis, basketball, swimming, etc.

Racquetball must rely on itself to perpetuate itself. The only organization that is promoting the sport on a grassroots level to the International expansion is the A.A.R.A. One hundred percent of its efforts and emphasis is devoted to the promotion, development, retention of players and expansion of the sport — which directly affects the

activity in every fitness club in the United States.

How many club owners or managers are aware of the National, Regional and State Rankings, the Junior Camps, Junior Leagues, Age Competition from the age of eight to 70, membership packages, dollars returned to the field for local development, the U.S. Team, Olympic affiliation, Pan American Games, Referee Certification, Racquetball Manufacturer's Association, World Masters Competition, and on and on...?

I don't mean to sound like associations in the past, but times have changed and our industry leaders must change, too. It is time we get behind these programs and see them through: not sit back and say "nothing's going on" or "why isn't the sport doing this or that?" It's time that those who continue to be negative stand aside and allow those who have a genuine, caring attitude and knowledge of the sport to assume control and bring racquetball to its rightful place in the sporting industry.

As the 1984 United States National Singles Championship dates grow closer, please be aware that as stated in previous issues of **RACQUETBALL IN REVIEW**, players may not participate in the National Singles if they did not enter a regional championship.

The election of new board members takes place in Houston, Texas, at the Singles and if you are not planning to attend, the only way your voice can be heard regarding the leadership of our

association is to cast your ballot as published in **RACQUETBALL IN REVIEW** (March issue).

We have put together what we consider to be an extremely qualified list of candidates from which to choose. Those who are elected will direct association policy for the next three years.

The proposed rule changes that were outlined in the January issue of **RACQUETBALL IN REVIEW** will come under consideration of the Na-

tional Board at the May meeting in Houston. If you have not already voiced your opinion regarding these proposed rule changes, I urge you to do so.

Several players will be named to our National Team as first, second, and third place in both men's and women's open divisions the upcoming season following the National Singles. This aspect alone will surely heighten the interest and expand the draw in these two divisions.

As election of new members to the National Board of the A.A.R.A. draws near, it is regrettable that no women candidates will be on the ballot.

Two women members of the board will have their terms expire this May and will be replaced by men as there are no women candidates. The remaining two women members currently on the National Board, will have their terms expire a year from May.

So although we currently have four women on the National Board, it is pos-

sible that we could be without female representation in this most important national position.

If you are interested in becoming involved at the national level in the administrative aspect of our sport, please contact me. We are currently forming a list of potential women candidates that can be presented prior to next year's election.

Since all 16 regional commissioners for the A.A.R.A. are male, women do not have a voice at the regional level at

this time. If we on the national board leave, we will have no representative other than the three female state directors that we currently have in our organization. As you can see, this is a serious problem that has developed over the past few years and the trend should be changed as soon as possible if we are to make progress in our attempts to expand and develop the woman racquetball player as an integral part of the AARA.

World Championships scheduled for Gleneagles

The International Amateur Racquetball Federation announced that the Gleneagles Racquetball and Health Club of Sacramento, California will be the site of the 1984 World Championships this summer.

Gleneagles was selected from over five competing locales because of its excellent accommodations — 10 racquetball courts (two glass-viewing courts), gymnasium, lounge, Nautilus, swimming pool, etc., — plus an outstanding Organizing Committee headed by Dave Anderson of Spare Time Incorporated.

These 1984 World Championship Games will be the second in the history of World Championships for racquetball. The first was held at the Decathlon Club in Santa Clara, California in 1981 and boasted six countries participating: the United States, Mexico, Japan, Ireland, Germany and Holland, with the United States victorious, Mexico in second place and Holland taking the third place medal.

In three brief years the competition has grown from six to 19 countries committed for this summer's competition. Expected to compete this year are



Canada, the United States, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Holland, Belgium, England, France, Germany, Spain, Guatemala, Honduras, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Peru, Venezuela, Chile and Ecuador.

Competition will be held in both men's and women's singles divisions

as well as doubles. World titles will be awarded in men's and women's singles and doubles, and team championships in men's, women's and combined.

Also at stake are points toward qualification for the World Games II scheduled for the summer of 1985 in London, England.

If the United States wins the World Championships in Sacramento they must travel to the Regional Competition in Quito, Ecuador in December in order to ensure a berth for the 1985 World Games II in London.

The World Games II will feature 23 non-Olympic sports in International competition. The United States Team will be selected from the qualifying events: the top three men and women from the Open Division of the U.S. National Singles Championships, and 18 and under winner of the boy's and girl's divisions of the U.S. National Junior Championships, the number one man and number one woman players from the U.S. National Intercollegiate Championships, and the Men's and Women's Open Doubles teams from the 1983 United States National Doubles Championships. The doubles teams of Steve Trent/Stam Wright and Carol Frenck/Malia Kamahoa qualified to represent the United States in Doubles at the U.S. National Doubles Championships in 1983. The United States Team is sponsored by Lite Beer from Miller, DP Leach, and Penn Athletic Products Company.

United States Olympic Training

Selection Process Announced for Training

The A.A.R.A. recently announced the selection process to be used for the National Elite Training Camp to be held at the United States Olympic Training Center July 29 — August 25, 1984.

The first week, July 29—August 4, will be devoted to Open Players, August 5-11 to Junior Players, and August 12-18, August 19-25 will be geared toward training Age Group athletes. Athletes will be selected on

the basis of first finish in the 1984 U.S. National Singles Championships presented by Lite Beer, and the U.S. National Junior Championships, 16 and over. The balance of selection will be based upon qualifications taken from National Rankings in each age group as of results received prior to June 1, 1984 for adults, and the finish of the

U.S. National Junior Championships held June 27, 1984.

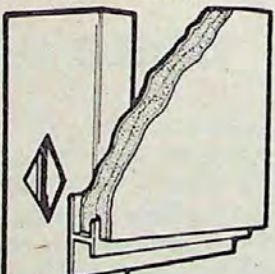
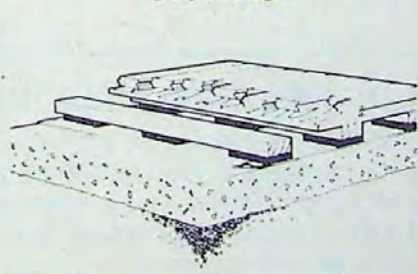

Invitations will be sent out June 1st for adults and June 26th for Juniors. Acceptance will be on a first come, first serve basis, and the total cost for the week, including instruction, housing, lodging and court time, is \$150.00.

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Refereeing

"Kill the ref!" as the ol' baseball chant begins ... We don't really mean it, but we're showing our anger over an obvious error on his or her part. Although we don't normally yell at racquetball referees — IF LOOKS COULD KILL!

Refereeing racquetball matches is very, very difficult! First, you have probably just finished playing a match (winners usually get to ref the next game), you're hot, tired and mentally exhausted. If you're lucky it will be two easy-going players in a very sportsmanlike match. However, occasionally you'll get two turkeys who'll argue each point.

My point is let's be more courteous to our refs. Let's all take the time to review periodically the rules of racquetball and when we get the opportunity to ref, let's be as professional as possible. Tournament directors should be aware of the schedule and allow ample time for winners to "get it together" before assigning them to ref. Maybe a tournament referee schedule could be developed ... how about a Referee Clinic before a tournament?

Now, for the players ... we said it's a tough job to ref, so don't you make it worse. The ref doesn't care who wins — he or she are only looking to keep the match fair, remember who's serving, and recording the score. So help them out. Help with the skips, the hinders and keep the match moving.

So the next time you're playing, look back at the ref and give him a "thumbs up" and smile. It will do him — and you — a lot of good! Plus, he'll wonder what you're up to!
