Ferris & Sibell Win Again!

The Minnesota State Singles tournament was put on by the MSRA during the weekend of April 22 through 25 at the Burnsville Racquet, Swim & Health Club. The weather outside was perfect for racquetball--it was a good weekend to be inside, whether you were watching or playing. And, of course, it was wonderful seeing familiar faces again.

About 360 people competed in 36 different singles divisions. Matches began Thursday night for some of the metro players in the larger draws. Men's B had an unbelievable 49 players signed up, with another 41 in Men's A! And as has been the case all year, the women turned out in record numbers also, with 24 in Women's Open (one more than the men), 18 in A, and even an all-time high of 20 in Women's 35+. Not bad, ladies.

Men's Matches

Many agreed with Greg Hayenga when he deemed this "the year of the slump." Several players expected to advance ended up in consolation or were done after two or three matches due to upsets. However, this was not the case with the Men's Open Final.

This featured glass court match was "déjà vu" of last year, with Dan Ferris and Mike Locker battling it out again in front of the packed stadium. Mike remained very composed and relaxed as Dan jumped ahead in both games and won the match with scores of 15-7/15-11. The rallies were long with incredible gets--Mike never let up.

In the Men's A final, Bob Beeman won a tough match over Andy Ginder in two games (15-1/15-9). With the A trophy comes the special honor of moving up to Open. Congratulations, Bob!

Women's Matches

Dana Sibell defeated Carol Kriegler to repeat her title in the Women's Open Final. Carol looked strong despite a knee injury that had kept her from competing for most of the past year, while Dana has continued to dominate the local women's racquetball scene for the past few years. Dana won the first game 15-10, but Carol fired up to come back and win the second game 15-5. Dana took a quick 10-0 lead in the breaker, finishing the match with an 11-2 win.

Jamie Trachsel had a tremendous tournament, even though she had been concentrating on school sports and other activities. She brought home the First

Pro Tournament

The VCI Series Professional Racquetball Championships will be held at the Burnsville Racquet, Swim & Health Club June 23 through 27, 1993. This is the most important professional racquetball event in the last ten years because of the exposure for the players on ESPN.

Volkswagen Credit International (VCI) is the title sponsor of this series of five major tournaments, which concludes with the series final in Burnsville (prior stops have been in Montreal, Baltimore, Atlanta and Los Angeles). During 1992/93 a record total of 19 professional tournaments have been played. VCI has already committed to sponsoring the series again next year. Twenty four tournaments are planned for 1993/94, with the series going international by holding tournaments in Japan and Mexico, as well as Canada.

From the "Pres"

The last month has been a hectic one for the MSRA Board. The addition of the Regional Tournament to our list of responsibilities only four weeks before the State Singles has kept us hopping. Our net income from the Regional was about \$500, so we are a little closer to balancing our budget this year. Entries for the State Tournament were down about 15%. This was not all bad, however, as we were able to keep the tournament more on schedule than in some years. As the pool of certified referees grows, we have less problem getting the matches going when the players are ready. If we can only get those consolation cards at the desk a little sooner, and avoid the twenty minute warmup, we might actually keep the tournament on time.

You, the potential participant, can help us with these major events by only making **absolutely essential** scheduling requests. While we like to do everything possible to help you with your weekend plans and work schedules, we simply cannot start a tournament of 350 to 400 participants at 5:00 on Friday afternoon. Even with 22 courts, 36 to 46 hours of play are necessary to accommodate this number of players. We would need to schedule matches in the middle of the night to get them all played. Using 98th Street is not the most desirable way to deal with the problem. We end up splitting the men from the women and juniors, and still some people have to commute between the clubs. It also requires two tournament staffs, and two hospitality crews. We would need to limit the entries to about 275 to start at 5:00 on Friday and avoid very late or very early match times, and finish by 5:00 on Sunday. Try to think about our dilemma the next time you sign up for these events, would you?

Check this issue for more particulars about the upcoming Star of the North State Games and the VCI Series Professional Championships. The Mens Professional Tour, under the direction of Hank Marcus, has become better organized and more visible. The return of professional racquetball to the Twin Cities market has been six years in the making. The IRT and their major sponsor, VCI, have committed serious financial resources to this event, which will be televised on ESPN. If you can, mark your calendars for June 23-27th, and buy a couple of tickets. Even better, call us about a patron package to demonstrate your support of the sport. We look forward to seeing you at the event. You may also want to keep playing and practicing for the amateur tournament held in conjunction with the professional play. Participants will receive discounted ticket packages.

There are a few other summer tournaments for the diehard racquetball players. The full 1993-94 calendars will be published in late July to mid August. Many of you are concerned about the cost of tournaments, and I have asked Mike Dittrich to do a comparison of our tournaments and formats with other states. I hope he will publish an informational article in the summer issue which has next year's schedule included. Have a great summer, whether you plan to work on your racquetball game or pursue outdoor activities.

In the 10 & Under round robin Jimmy Rodberg of Duluth won First Place with Second Place going to Darrin Hubbard of St. Paul. Darrin is a new tournament player---he's a good player, we hope to see him at more tournaments!

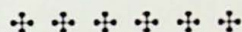

By the time you read this, the Junior Regional will be finished---the kids will start preparing for the Junior Olympics. This year the Junior Olympics are being held at Gaithersburg, Maryland at the Athletic Express Racquet & Health Club.

The official tournament hotel is The Gaithersburg Marriott, which has been recently remodeled. 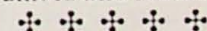

Hall of Fame Inductees

The 1993 Hall of Fame Tournament this year was held at the Northeast Racquetball Club. The tournament highlight was the Friday night banquet, which was held at Leon's Supper Club. During the banquet two racquetball players were inducted into the Minnesota Racquetball Hall of Fame---Dick Carpenter of Rochester and Steve Singer of Minnetonka.

Steve Singer.....began his racquetball career playing paddleball at the age of 12. His father taught Steve at the Duluth YMCA in his early years.

In the early 1970's the Twin Cities had a traveling racquetball league, which featured many of the games notable players at that time. Held at clubs with outstanding tradition, such as The Court House, Kings Court, St. Anthony Athletic Club and the Jewish Community Center, the sport took it's roots in this area.

As Steve moved up the racquetball hill to become one of the best in the region, Bill Schmidtke and Paul Ikier not only gave him instruction, but provided strong competition as Bill was a national champion and Paul a regional champion who both played on the Pro Tour.

Steve went on to win three state singles titles in 1976, 1978 and 1980. He won the state doubles titles four times with partners Paul Ikier (twice), Mike Beugen and Hank Weiss. He also won the regional doubles with partner Bill Schmidtke. Steve was sponsored by Ektelon and conducted numerous clinics and promoted the sport in racquetball's early years.

Steve always had a strong will to win and, coupled with his precision shot making ability, made him only tougher to beat. He would take a shot, as well as give one back as needed, and was always quick to point out where you made your mistake, as he always capitalized on it.

Steve worked hard to master the game. He was very willing to put in the extra time and effort to practice to make himself a champion.

In the 1970's racquetball matches were played 2 out of 3 games to 21 points and some of the tournaments were double elimination. Steve said that after a tournament you would crawl into your car and hope you wouldn't cramp up on the way home.

Steve is currently living in Minnetonka with his wife, Heidi, daughter, Samantha age 12 and son, Jim age 9. He works at Pipeline Supply. He says he really misses the game and competition, but still manages to play when he can.

Dick Carpenter.....was inducted into the Hall of Fame in recognition of his achievements and contributions to racquetball.

Dick is originally from Fort Francis, Ontario, Canada. In his early athletic career, he was a hockey player. He came up through the Canadian Junior Leagues, later spent six years playing in the Detroit Redwings farm system and had a brief (very) stint with the parent club.

In 1968, he came to Rochester with the semi-pro Rochester Mustang Hockey Club and played with them for several years. He has been active in radio sales

and as a radio and TV sportscaster. He and his wife, (Saint) Mary, have an adult son, Damien.

Dick has been playing competitive racquetball since the early 1970's. As a left-hander he has been in great demand as a double's partner and has won many championships with Mike Gorman, Fred Banfield and Les Dittrich. Dick is unique as he is the only southpaw ever seen with a two-handed backhand.

He has won 37 city titles in both singles and doubles, 13 state titles in both singles and doubles, as well as six regional titles. He has competed very successfully on the national level with two Second Place trophies in the National Invitational Master's doubles and he also was a member of the United State Gold Medal winning team in the first international double's tournament held in Phoenix in 1992.

Congratulations Dick and Steve!

Entry materials for the 1993 Star of the North Summer Games are now available for individuals and teams that wish to participate in Minnesota's largest annual amateur multi-sport festival in the Twin Cities north metro area.

Among the competitions spotlighted in the 1993 Summer Games are archery, badminton, ballroom dance, baseball, basketball, canoeing, cycling, disc golf, diving, golf, gymnastics, horseshoes, in-line skating, judo, karate, powerlifting, **RACQUETBALL**, shooting, soccer, softball, swimming, synchronized swimming, taekwondo, tennis, track and field, volleyball, weightlifting and wrestling.

The racquetball tournament will be held at the Hiway 100 North France Club in

Brooklyn Center June 18th through 20th. Almost everyone in Midwest racquetball knows Dana Sibell. They probably know that she has been a top local and national amateur competitor and that she's been giving lessons since she was a kid. And, of course, they might know that she just won State Singles. But, she's done that before.

What people probably don't know is that Dana recently flew with Becky Shirk-Osier to Syracuse, New York, to play in her first WPRA (Women's Professional Racquetball Association) tournament. When asked, she had several comments about her experiences.

"I hadn't been able to afford to go in the past. One of the reasons I am able to go is because Pro Kennex is helping me financially. I was very excited to play the top players.

"Overall the other women players were nice and glad to see a new face on the tour. The very top players were totally confident, but some of the others seemed a little threatened to be getting extra competition. All were very intense on the court."

After playing for so many years, Dana had to think a second when asked if she learned anything new, but she observed that there were several upsets and they gave her confidence that "anyone can beat anyone else at any time." Dana noted that the key to a successful pro career would have to be the serve. "You've got to get your serve in and return theirs; after the serve, everything else is the same."

In general, Dana was impressed by how serious the women pros were, especially compared to recent visits to men's pro stops. But just like Minnesotans, the

New York racquetball people loved to be social. "It was a good experience and I'd definitely recommend it to other ladies thinking of playing a pro tournament. Playing the top competition really improves your game."

The WPRA has had some trouble getting a full schedule of tournaments and raising all of the prize money they would like to offer this year. They believe they will be able to offer more tournaments next year.

Dana made it to the finals in Pro Consolation, but lost to fellow Midwesterner Laura Fenton in a tough match. Would she go again? "Yes! And I'm looking for a roommate if any women are interested in joining me. I hope to make all of the WPRA tournaments next year."

We wish her all the luck in the world.

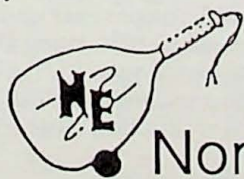

"If Rock & Roll Were a Machine"

Book review of *If Rock and Roll Were a Machine* by Terry Davis. New York: Delacorte Press, 1992. \$15.00.



If Rock and Roll Were a Machine, Terry Davis' newest novel, is a book that must be read and passed around in racquetball circles. Davis is best known for his wrestling story *Vision Quest* and the major motion picture based on it. His latest novel was chosen as a "Best Book for Young Readers" in 1992 by the American Library Association.

Through Bert Bowden, the main character of *Rock and Roll*, Davis again shows his powerful insight into the struggle of growing up. Whether we have survived the growing up process or whether we're still struggling through it, all of us can identify with Bert.

When we meet Bert Bowden during his junior year of high school, he has nearly "disappeared" inside himself and become, as he overhears his father say, "this zero. A nothing."

His sixth grade teacher had found Bert to be not only a smart-mouth kid, but also smarter and more well-read than he was. This teacher enlisted the support of the entire class in intentionally humiliating Bert every day in school. Not only did the experience eliminate Bert's cockiness, but it destroyed every shred of his confidence.

By the time Bert has reached high school, his natural athletic ability is crippled by self-consciousness and a complete lack of confidence. He drops out of every high school sport and is desperate to find a way to feel like a person again.

A last-ditch effort to gain his own respect leads Bert to a classic motorcycle shop because Bert wants to believe that he would look at himself differently if the guy in the mirror rode a Harley Davidson Sportster. He buys the bike, but he gets

more than he bargained for--an unlikely friendship. Scott Shepard, the rugged owner of the classic cycle shop, an ex-agent for the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms who listens to Public Radio in his shop, offers Bert a part-time job. This mentorship and that of Bert's English teacher, who also sees Bert's potential as a person and as a writer, begin to crack the shell in which Bert is hiding.

Scott brings Bert to the local athletic club and teaches him to play racquetball. Bert suffers adolescent agony watching beautiful bodies in aerobic classes and humiliation being trounced in every game of his first league. In one of his early matches, he plays a man "three times Bert's age, uncoordinated, fat and slow."

Bert was thinking how friendly his opponent was and hoping that losing wouldn't make him feel too bad when the man's first serve arced off the wall. It hit on the receiving line and bounced high into the side wall above Bert's head. Bert swung his backhand but all he hit was wall.

"One serves zero," his opponent said.

He hit three more excellent lob serves, and Bert couldn't get a decent return on any of them. One made it to the front wall, but the guy was right there to kill it. Like a fat, hungry bird after a little blueberry.

In spite of it all, Bert is committed to being a good racquetball player. "[Bert] had desire. That was one thing [his sixth grade teacher] hadn't taken from him." His desire is fueled even more when he discovers that same teacher's name on a league list at the athletic club. Bert has a new goal in striving to excel at the sport: to beat the teacher who beat him down.

It's obvious that Davis plays a lot of racquetball; everything rings true, from the frustrating lob serves arcing out of Bert's reach to the rifle sounds of killshots and the long hours of practice required to produce either one with any skill. The writing is rich but easy to read; the little sensory details "force the reader to experience what's happening." The story is as honest and real-to-life as story-telling can be. Veteran players will chuckle, and prospective young players will be captivated and inspired to give the sport an honest try.

Scott and his English teacher, adults who know that one of their jobs in life is to be good to kids who need it, help Bert along the way. As Bert moves through the story, he slowly shapes a new image of himself. He gets solace from riding his motorcycle, and although the "Harley guy" image never quite fits, Bert's motorcycle symbolizes all he is learning about life. He says, "The power gets inside you. It's the only sensation I know like listening to good rock and roll. If rock and roll were a machine, it would be a motorcycle."

Far more important, Bert knows he has become somebody with an identity when one classmate asks, "Are you the racquetball guy?" Another comments, "He used to be a really good athlete when we were kids. I guess he's found his sport."

Racquetball Season Continues

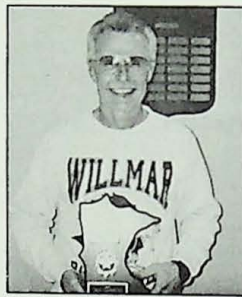
