THOUGHTS FROM THE PRESIDENT . .

So, how is racquetball doing in Michigan?

That is the question my friend Tom Ford asked me the other day. We were chatting on racquetball and other topics; how the pro tour is, relative merits of racquets, strings, grips and gloves. The usual topics between Tom and myself. Then, Tom askes the big one: "So how is racquetball doing in Michigan?"

It is a topic I find myself discussing quite a bit, but seldom in this explicit a fashion. I thought about it for a moment and said I thought racquetball in Michigan was doing very well and I gave him several reasons why I felt that way.

Several hours later and I decided, what with it being New Year's Day, what an excellent time to write this piece, and that was an excellent topic. So, if you will indulge me, I will attempt to give my views on that topic and allow you to judge for yourself.

As I type, we have 489 members in the Racquetball Association of Michigan. We haven't been this close to 500 members in about three years, and then it was only a brief flirtation. I must admit this is an extraordinarily unexpected, but pleasant surprise. About 18 months ago, we were actually well below 400 members, and there was a quite a bit of concern. Since then, there has been a slow, steady climb as we see an overall resurgence of the sport.

One factor in this growth is the number of tremendous tournaments being held around Michigan. The directors knock themselves out to provide the best tournament experience possible, and the players get to be the beneficiaries. We have more, and better tournaments than we have in decades. Local groups come up every year and put their own spin on

tournaments. In turn, we each get to learn from their innovation, and we all get to play in their fantastic events. There is no experience quite like a local racquetball tournament. Fun, play, and socialization unlike any other events you will find.

I'd also like to mention your dedicated and hard working RAM Board of Directors. It is a tremendous group of people and a lot of the positive changes you see are due directly to their efforts.

Around Michigan, Juniors programs have become well established helping to teach our great sport to a new generation. As I always say, we need to introduce racquetball to as many kids as possible, so that we have someone to play against in 30 years. These local programs have done an excellent job of this and continue to add tournament-ready players. Their participants are making their mark throughout the "Adult" Divisions.

This is just a short list, as space allows, but I've got to say, I am quite pleased with the state of racquetball. But , I promised to state my case and let you decide. One last plug: It is truly an embarrassment of riches and I, for one, couldn't be happier.

See you on the courts, if there's enough room.

EATING, SOCIALIZING, and a WHOLE LOT OF RACQUETBALL IN TEMPE, AZ AT THE USAR NATIONAL DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP

We all arrived at the Sky Harbour Airport in Scottsdale, Arizona to take a short trip to the home of Arizona State University in Tempe for the 2005 USAR National Doubles Championship. We were there to meet up with some of the world's best athletes to knock a little green ball around. Sure the "pros" are impressive to watch, but do not count out the other divisions. The determination in the other levels that most of "us" play in to win a gold medal and a national title can be just as intense.

One hundred degrees and sunny. That was the weather report every day we were at the tournament. Yes, EVERY DAY!! The Michigan contingent consisted of Faye Cobb (yes, she is still considered a Michigander no matter where she lives!), Mike and Diana Easthope, Melody Gorno, Jack Huczek, Lorna Rose, and John and Debbie Wilson. Faye Cobb and Lorna Rose entered the 55B division. When they arrived at the tournament, their division was combined with all the 25, 35 and 45B players. We nicknamed this division the triple decade division. Lorna and Fave were awarded the Gold Medal uncontested for the 55B division and then were allowed to compete with all those 25, 35 and 45 year olds in the 25/35/45/55 B division. Their division was a round robin and they played each scheduled match. This Grandma (Lorna) and Grandma-tobe (Faye) played hard and continued to improve their play throughout the tournament. This tournament got Faye pumped up to compete in future racquetball events!

Melody Gorno was without her previous partner, Stephanie Winfrey. Stephanie was due to deliver her baby any day and was not able to play in the tournament. Melody re-

cruited a partner from Alaska, Katie Wood. Even though they had never played together previously, they were definitely a force to be reckoned with on the court. They played in the Women's 35A division, which ended up being a round robin division. Melody was giving her husband a heart attack as he watched the match to determine if they would win the silver medal. Melody and Katie won the first game 15-5, but then lost the second game 5-15. They were down in the tiebreaker 0-9 and came back to win the match at 11-10! What an exciting match to watch and to be the game to win the silver medal at a National event.

Mike Easthope and John Wilson entered the Men's 25B/35B division. You would think that entering 35B you would play someone about the same age. As Faye and Lorna experienced, John and Mike stepped into a court looking at a seventeen and a twenty-year-old. The only advantage they had was that their competitors had never played together before. They dropped the first game 12-15, won the second 15-13, and then ended up winning the tie breaker 11-8. As a celebratory dinner the Easthope's and the Wilson's went to Pinnacle Peaks Patio in Scottsdale, AZ for, what else, steak and beer. Man, what a steak!!

Jack Huczek teamed up with Rocky Carson to defend their title. They quietly took care of business match after match. They let their opponents get three points here four points there. One game someone actually got six points on them. Then came the finals but I will save that for the end.

Deb Wilson and Diana Easthope started play in the Women's triple decade division (25/35/45/55B) and the Women's B division. On Thursday night Head Racquet Sports had a bowling, pizza, and (cont. on page 10)

US National Junior Olympic Championships is an opportunity of a lifetime for many kids, and here it is right in Michigan's backyard June 21-25, 2006, at the Michigan Athletic Club East Lansing! A chance to play the top players from around the country, of course, but also a rare occasion to develop friendships and rivalries, some that may last well into adulthood.

Obviously the main reason for the tournament is the quality competition that is drawn from across the country, yet we are striving to make this event better than well run, enjoyable and memorable; we want to be the standard on which future tournaments are judged. 
Sharon Huczek also earned two more US Open medals. This great champion earned the Silver in the Women's 55+A division and was a semi-finalist in the Women's 55+ division.

BYE MAKES THE HALL OF FAME

In an unprecedented move, the Hall of Fame Committee for the Racquetball Association of Michigan (RAM) named Stanley Bye to the Hall of Fame. Via a Special Session on November 20, 2005, the RAM Board approved the recommendation from the Hall of Fame Committee. "We decided that, due to the very unusual circumstances of Bye's participation in racquetball since its inception, we would proceed with this most deserving honor," said Jim Easterling, in the wake of the Board's vote. Easterling, head of the Hall of Fame Committee in both Michigan and at the national level, went on to note that while Bye may have been a consistent first-round loser in every event he played, the sheer number of events which he participated in was a major factor in this surprise announcement. It was also pointed out by Easterling that the Committee considered two other important factors in this decision. First, Bye faced the top seeds in every event he played, so his early departure was certainly no shame. Also, Bye often provided balance to any draw within which he entered. In those events he didn't enter, imbalance in the draw was often observed. In such cases, a negative pall was cast over the draw, such that the early matches were nicknamed "rat-tails", connoting the image of the aforementioned, scavenging rodent. "You can see by the use of that term what Bye has meant to the sport of racquetball," stated Easterling.

Meanwhile, Bye is overjoyed with this unexpected honor. "Sometimes I've felt like the Barney Fife of racquetball," noted Bye. "Look, I've lost every match I've played, but I guess persistence should count for something," he added. Furthermore, Bye was complimentary of the State of Michigan for finally recognizing his unique contribution to the sport. "I can die now," Bye said.
