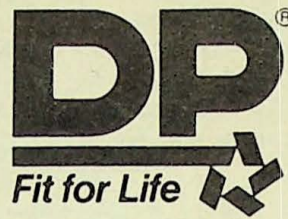

Company Commits to Racquetball

Diversified Products, a top home fitness equipment manufacturer, purchased Leach Racquetball in 1980 and the Opelika, Ala. based company has dedicated itself to becoming involved in the grassroots of racquetball by becoming the official racquet of the AARA.

In the amateur market, DP is quite active in the AARA and sponsors all State, Regional and National Tournaments. This racquetball powerhouse exemplifies its philosophy of ing grass roots racquetball through its home pros, professional clinics, Olympic training program and instructional camps. As each season's finale, DP hosts its National Championship which has become the most prestigious tournament for professional and amateurs alike.

In the professional arena, DP boasts some of the world's best players including Gregg Peck, Brett Harnett, Terri Gilreath, Caryn McKinney and Jack Newman.

The Florida Racquet Journal conducted an interview with the company's product manager, Greg Eveland.

FRJ: Other companies tended to shy away from committing dollars to the AARA, why did DP decide to identify itself with the AARA?

Eveland: Basically, it didn't offer immediate marketing and advertising advantages. It was young and going through growing pains --add all that up and it's hard to justify the marketing value. As a company, we expect to be around 20 years from now and the most important area is the grass roots level. Without a viable amateur body we are all going to struggle. We are committed to the grass roots level. In the early years all the attention was focused on the pro level. Take soccer as a parallel. They brought in Pele and it flopped. They went back to the grass roots and now it's a thriving sport for kids eight to 15. We hope other companies get involved with the AARA. We're only the racquet sponsor.

FRJ: DP has a strong junior package which is offered through the AARA. Are clubs taking advantage of it?

Eveland: The junior program has been totally exciting. We try to work through the central office by providing product to Luke (St. Onge, AARA Director). It's the secret to

success of racquetball. We find clubs that get involved with it are your more successful clubs. It provides a family atmosphere."

FRJ: Bradenton's Pat Powers probably has one of the model junior programs in the nation. Is his program a showcase?

Eveland: "Pat Powers aggressively offers several programs for juniors. We wish more people would go after juniors like he does."

FRJ: Ideally, every one would be in a win-win situation if the schools offered racquetball.

Are the manufacturers trying to get involved in this aspect of racquetball?

Eveland: The Racquetball Manufacturers Association has looked into this. The problem is every situation is different. There's a transportation problem of getting the kids to the club. It takes a commitment from the clubs to work with the board of education. We're tied in with the Sporting Goods Manufacturers Association and working on that project. There aren't too many sports you can play from eight to 20.

JUNIOR RACQUETBALL TEAM SPONSORED BY PENN ATHLETIC PRODUCTS COMPANY DIVERSIFIED PRODUCTS

The AARA is offering a Junior Racquetball Team package that you can use as a foundation for your own program.

The package consists of:

- Six (6) DP Junior Hawk Racquetball Racquets.
- One (1) case of Penn Ultra-Blue Racquetballs.
- Two (2) iron-on transfers per participant for use on team uniform.
- Twenty-five (25) AARA Rule Books.
- One (1) Sportsmanship Award (elected by the team members).
- One (1) Participant Certificate per team member (upon completion).
- Completion of league qualifies participant for President's Council for Physical Fitness Award.
- Team competition chart.

In return, the AARA, DP and Penn require:

- Participants must be an AARA member.
- Junior League must be for six (6) weeks or longer.
- All league participants must be 18 years of age or younger.
- Iron-on transfers must be placed on team uniforms as specified on instructions.
- Additional sponsors are acceptable if they are not in active competition with DP and Penn Athletics.

OBJECTIVES OF THIS PROGRAM

- Stimulate greater junior involvement at the club level.
- Organize club programs and club junior leagues in all clubs.
- Develop club junior teams to compete against other clubs.
- Develop city junior teams to compete against other cities throughout the year.
- Have state city junior championships.
- Develop state junior team (to compete against other states) from city team championships.

HOW TO GET STARTED

- Decide if you want to utilize the junior league concept. We strongly suggest you try this. The league concept has a proven record in California where over 500 juniors are involved in Northern California alone.
- Select a person interested in working with the kids. Reward that person, free membership, court time, etc. THIS IS THE MOST IMPORTANT STEP! Without this interested person, your program is destined to fail.
- Start a parents club. Have a meeting of the parents of children involved in your program. The purpose of the parents club is twofold:
 - Raise Money
 - Transportation

The parents concept comes from other sports like soccer and baseball. The parents provide ideas for fund raising etc., but the kids do the work.
- Get all league members T-shirts. It is extremely important that all participants feel that they are an important part of the league.

EXAMPLE OF A TYPICAL JUNIOR PROGRAM

- Total kids: 21
- Divide kids into 7 teams (3 players per team)
- Each team has 1 top player
1 medium player
1 poor player (or one 8 and under no bounce)
- Each team member receives:
 - 1 T-shirt Transfer
 - 1 Participation Certificate
 - 1 President's Fitness Award
 - 1 Rule Book
- Typical monthly schedule—meet every Saturday or immediately after school during week.
 - Have 30 minute junior clinic with instruction.
 - Have 30 minutes of games to test skills (shoot at cans, carry ball on racquet, etc.)
 - Allow 30 minutes to 1 hour for play.
 - Post results on Team Competition Chart to be displayed in prominent club location.
 - Winners of league (first two teams) each member receives 1 DP Leach Junior Hawk Racquet.
 - Each month have a mini tournament instead of league play—round robin format works well.
 - Attempt to stimulate juniors to get involved in club team.
 - Those who participate do fund raisers (rent a ref, raffle racquets, run-a-thon, etc.) to pay entry fees and team uniforms.
 - Top club players then travel to state junior team meets.

Yellen Crushes Hogan

The critics were ready to write his obituary. They had already forgotten he was the world's No. 1 player the last three years.

They had forgotten he often started the season off slowly. Anyone who thought his days at the top were numbered dismissed such talk when Mike Yellen won the D'Lites Pro Racquetball Classic in Omaha, Nebraska with one of the most one-sided triumphs ever produced in racquetball history.

Yellen didn't lose a single game in the first four rounds and then stunned Marty Hogan 11-0, 9-11, 11-10, 11-10. It was the first time Hogan was ever shut out in two games.

Yellen played with Ektelon's new oversized racquet, "The Toron" and while the racquet can't be credited with his victory, it did give the manufacturer credibility in marketing the racquet to the average player.

Yellen was like a hurricane out of control. He didn't allow more than seven points per game against Dolwain Green and Florida's Cory Brysman. Brysman, who has given Yellen fits over the years, couldn't handle Yellen's awesome display of power and control.

His victory over Gerry Price, one of the hottest players on the pro tour, 11-8, 11-8, 11-9, put Yellen in the semifinals against Gregg Peck. Peck had defeated Yellen in semifinals of the Ektelon's and the finals of the DP Nationals in their last two meetings. But Yellen wasn't about to be denied. Yellen wasn't about to lose this time. His serve resulted in several aces and Peck had trouble returning the drive serve.

On the other side of the draw, Marty Hogan who boldly predicted he would win 10 of the 14 events this year, eased by Andy Gross and Ed Andrews in the first two rounds. Left-hander Bret Harnett almost eliminated Hogan in the quarter but fell short. Hogan needed five games to dispose of Harnett 11-8, 2-11, 11-6, 10-11, 11-6.

Racquetball's newest phenom, Cliff Swain was reported to be ill Friday night and wasn't able to garner enough strength to give Hogan a game, losing 11-8, 11-3, 11-5.

Hogan's win set up the final against Yellen. While Yellen and Hogan have been No. 1 and No. 2 the last four years, they have only met in the final, twice in the last 15 tournaments. One of those meetings Hogan won on a forfeit because of a Yellen injury, so the two hadn't gone to war in a long time. With several players capable of defeating Yellen and Hogan when their game is on, matchups between Yellen and Hogan are becoming rarer and rarer.

Thus, the crowd was anticipating the match even more.

Yellen's powerful serves to the forehand and backhand sides, were too much for Hogan to handle and before the fans could become comfortable in their seats, Yellen gave Hogan a donut. The next two games were classic Hogan-Yellen battles. Marty got his serve back on target and edged Yellen 11-9. The third game was pivotal. Hogan held a 10-8 lead when Yellen called a timeout and promptly scored the next three points to secure an 11-10 win and 2-1 lead in games.

The fourth game was no contest. Yellen couldn't miss and Hogan collapsed. Hogan scored one point but was called for a technical at 8-1 when he swore at himself by ref Cory Brysman. Yellen then scored the next three points.

Over the last four seasons, Yellen holds a 7-5 edge against Hogan, while Hogan holds a 20-9 lifetime record.

"My serve was good all tournament long. With the oversized racquet I'm definitely hitting it a lot harder. The biggest thing was it was keeping Marty off guard because he knew I was hitting the serve well."

Yellen said he felt comfortable with the new racquet.

"I've been a bit sluggish and I needed a change, something to help spark me. In a few situations it definitely helped me; it's a little bulkier when you get in the corners, but if you learn to avoid that, the benefits are really great. It's certainly not the racquet winning the matches, but there are some advantages that both Ruben (Gonzalez) and I have been able to capitalize on. I feel really comfortable with it."

Racquetball Fantasy

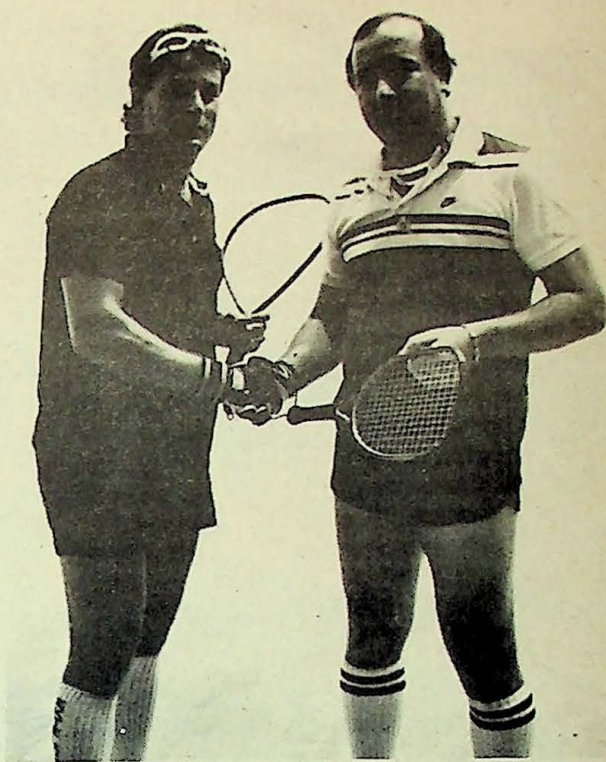
Some times you get tired of playing and defeating the same opponent week after week. You need a new challenge. A little excitement.
