### From the President

They also introduced their new online membership system and tournament management system. They struggled with the implementation of those systems, but by the time next season comes around everything should be functional and we should reap the benefits. A new website has allowed us to get the entry forms out to you electronically and to post the results quickly after the event. We'll keep working to expand the content on the website. Next season, Travel League results will be posted on the website rather than mailed to team captains, and we promise to have pictures out there.

The ISRA held the state tournaments at three different venues. Joe and Diane DeArmas hosted State Doubles at the Glass Court and made everyone feel at home. Roz Wendt at Chalet worked with us to put on a great State Singles tournament, including a firstever awards dinner. From my perspective it was much nicer for the annual award recipients and I liked the fact that I didn't have to yell over the sound of bouncing racquetballs to give the awards. The Juniors gathered at Landmark in Peoria for their very own state championships. Landmark host Terry Sutton did an outstanding job of making the kids feel welcome. (I heard the parents had a pretty good time, as well!) Thanks to the clubs and the volunteers who made our events successful this season.

For those of you who play racquetball through the summer, you'll find 3 events on the calendar. For those who trade their racquets for a set of golf sticks, the ISRA Golf Outing is on July 17th, at a new venue. Entry forms are on the website for these events.

Whatever you do, wear your sunscreen, enjoy the summer and we'll see you back on the courts full-swing in the fall!



## St. Valentine's Day Massacre LPRA-IRT Racquetball Event

February 13-15, 2004

The 2004 Valentine's Day Tournament returned to the Schaumburg Tennis Plus (formerly Woodfield Athletic Club) and showcased the top LPRA and IRT players in the world. Players from Venezuela, Mexico, and Chile participated alongside the U.S. players in the women's and men's draws, making it a true international event. The Women's LPRA final featured our own Cheryl Gudinas and Canadian Christie Van Hees. They put on a great show hitting a wide variety of shots that impressed the sold-out crowd. Gudinas, who has dominated the tour since Van Hees took some time off, continued her winning ways and solidified her #1 LPRA position by winning the match in five tough games. This was a full ranking LPRA stop as 17 ladies played for a total purse of \$8,000.

The men's side was an IRT Tier 3 event

featuring #1 in the world, Jack Huczek; #4 Cliff Swain; #9 Mike Guidry; and #12 Shane Vanderson. All four players came out to support the event and to vie for the \$4,000 purse. In the quarterfinals, Shane Vanderson won a hard-fought battle over local star Ben Croft, who came home for his birthday to play. Ben has been quietly creeping up in the IRT ranks. Shane faced off in the semifinals against #1 Huczek and lost in three straight. Mike Guidry lost in three on the other side to Swain, which set up the finals between the former sixtime #1 and the current #1: youth versus experience. They didn't let the packed house down! Both players played as if this was going to determine who was going to finish #1 this season. It had to be one of the best-played and intense matches I have witnessed on the tour in the past three years. With only a \$250 difference in winning and losing, money wasn't the issue; it was pride as both players left it all on the court. With great diving gets and

unbelievable shot making, topped off by Swain's powerful serves, this match went the full five with youth, Jack Huczek, coming out on top.

STP will be back on the map as another place to play racquetball and service the membership with programming run by Dave and Dennis Negrete. With five courts and the possibility of eight, the Schaumburg Park District is making a big effort to bring racquetball back to life at this club. Thanks to STP for hosting the event.

I want to thank all the players who lent their time and support.
