

Televised racquetball has begun to gain momentum on the heels of strong ratings from the 2000 Hilton U.S. OPEN broadcast this past June on ESPN2. In a highly favorable move for the sport, ESPN has announced that the 2001 Hilton U.S. OPEN broadcast will be shifted to the network's flagship channel — ESPN — and will air on Friday, February 8, 2002 at 12:00 PM C.S.T. "In addition, ESPN has called for an immediate meeting to discuss what it will take to get pro racquetball on TV on a more regular basis. He still has that distinctive backswing that goes up way over his head. The 35's came down to a great match between Ruben and Woody, with Ruben still showing top form winning (11), 6, 4.

Never a cross moment. It was great seeing the current generation of IRT pros with some hero worship of their own. Sudsy even

Bob drew second round matches against both Jack Huzek in the Open's and Marty Hogan in the 35's. 



## Travel Team Update


