MICHIGAN RACQUETBALL HALL OF FAME INDUCTS TWO BRIGHT STARS



Close to 100 Racquetball players from all corners of Michigan gathered for the Annual State Singles Tournament – AND to celebrate players and tournament directors. A big part of the celebration is the Michigan Hall of Fame Banquet, which was a stirring event again this year.

In addition to rewarding Improved players, Junior players, Outstanding contributors, and Excellent directors/clubs, the golden hour of the evening was the induction of two phenomenal men into the Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame. These men embody the spirit of competition, sportsmanship, and love of the game that is contagious for anyone standing in their spheres.

Dave Lund, who has been competing in racquetball since picking-up a racquet in 1979, was introduced to

the assembled audience by Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame member Lynn Hahn. Lynn stressed that Dave's appreciation for racquetball has centered on learning, fun, camaraderie, and winning, of course! Dave has won numerous National Tournaments over the decades, and hasn't slowed down yet, doing very well again this year



in the National Tournaments in which he competed.

As Dave took the podium, he shared stories of "Milkcrate" Gottlieb (Bill Gottlieb, a Michigan Hall of Fame member) whose backhand is still pretty bad according to Dave, and had to move to Squash in his "declining years". Dave spoke of people he has met; friends he has made and kept; and the continued high quality of life he enjoys – all because of Racquetball. Dave was joined at the Banquet by his lovely wife, Kay, and his brother. Dave expressed his gratitude to his

wife, his family, Pete Ruhala, Duane Russell, Jack (his brother), and the voting committee with the heart and humility that we have all grown accustomed to experiencing---OFF the court.

Joel Bonnett was introduced by his father (an Michigan

Hall of Fame member), Ken Bonnett, who spoke with pride and emotion of the son who has grown from small child to man in the world of racquetball. Joel started hanging out with racquetball players when he was 6, tagging along with Dad to tournaments and goofing around on the court.



"Goofing around" turned into learning the game, competing, and a few years later winning World Juniors. Joel attended Memphis State University on a Racquetball Scholarship. Over the years, Joel estimates that he has spent tens of thousands of hours playing thousands of matches. He also related his delight in he and his partner, Bill Sell, winning National Doubles against Jimmy Floyd and his partner, Todd O'Neil.Joel has fond memories of traveling with his Dad to those thousands of matches at various tournaments and has a clear recollection of beating Mike Anderson at the Grand Rapids City Open one year.

Joel thanked his parents for their support, encouragement, and love, and shared with the audience some of the things he has learned playing racquetball:

- Discipline
- Commitment
- Investment
- Accountability
- Patience
- Competitive Spirit

Both Joel and Dave would sum up racquetball as a way of life that teaches much about life. Both epitomize a quote that Joel shared from Ken: "There's no such thing as a big enough lead, never let up when you're ahead; never give up when you're behind".

Congratulations to two very deserving men, who are excellent models for the young players growing into adults in the world of racquetball.

TEAM MICHIGAN GETS ANOTHER TOP TEN FIN-ISH AT THE JUNIOR OLYMPIC NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

This years Junior Nationals were held at the Recreation center of the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Over 200 of the nations best junior players showed up to play for national championships and spots on the USA junior team which will defend the world championship this year in Los Angeles.

Michigan had nine players make the trip to Minnesota, Zach and Braeden D'Almedia, and Caige Durvea all played in the boys U12 division where they dominated the red bracket, taking home 1st, 2nd, and 4th. All of these kids were competing in their second go round of national level competition and are getting the hang of things, next year they will be a force to be reckoned with. Nathan Tucker held down the fort in boys U14 and came into the tournament on a hot streak, also in his second Nationals Nathan got a decent seed but ran into heart of the draw in the second round, after losing there he went on to a good run in the blue bracket making the quarter finals. With 25.5 points on the event Nathan was our 4th highest point total and is really getting the hang of how this tournament works. Mercedes Arias had a great week in the girls U16, scoring the 3rd highest point total for the team at 27, Mercedes was also recognized as an All American athlete and finished the week 2nd in doubles, 3rd in mixed doubles, and 4th in singles. Mercedes will no doubt be back to improve on her results next year and is a great asset for our team. Brad Schopieray came to Minnesota on a mission to get to the top of the boys U16 bunch. He was not disappointed, scoring a team leading 54 points Brad finished 3rd in singles earning a spot as an alternate on

the USA team, and was also recognized as an All American as well as being named Junior Sportsman of the year. It was Brads 6th Junior nationals and his experience really showed as the week went on, we are looking for good things from him in the next season. Andrew Price came into the tournament fresh off his first IRT professional win and was seeded 4th in

the boys U18 division, Andrew easily made it to the quarterfinals before losing a heartbreaker to the 5 seed, at 30 points Andrew was the 2nd highest point earner on the team, he teamed up with Brad in doubles and made it to the quarters as well, it was Andrews last Junior nationals and it was certainly his best, the team will miss him for sure. Lucas Arias and Bryan Schopieray came out of semi retirement to also play in their final Junior nationals. Both of these guys have been playing at the college level for the last season and made the trip to Minnesota to have some fun, coincidentally they played their first and last nationals as doubles partners. Both of them played hard but mostly had fun taking in all the things going on at the tournament. Bryan will be off to start his second year at Central Michigan and Lucas will be starting at MSU in the fall. As with Andrew it has been a real blast having them on the team and we wish them all well.

Michigan's total points were 165 which placed us 7th overall, Colorado which had 40 or so kids won the team event. The 5 day format of the tournament is very busy and if it hadn't been for all of the great parents we have in our program it would have been impossible to achieve the success we have, thank you. Also we had Team coach Tom Blakeslee who took a week out of his schedule to make the trip to Minnesota to help with the coaching duties, Tom's years of national level experience proved invaluable in the upper division matches and certainly his help was instrumental in our success, thank you Tom.Next years Tournament will be held in Portland

Oregon and we are starting to plan now, if you would be interested in helping out just drop us a line or see me at any tournament we always welcome the help, and it's really fun too.

The 43rd National Singles Racquetball Championships were held in Houston, Texas for the last time. A small contingent of seven Michigan racquetball players made the journey to say good bye. Congratulations to **Michael Stephens** for becoming a national champion!

Results were mostly disappointing for the rest in close wouldacoulda moments. Michael Stephens entered into 55+C division and lost to the eventual winner. His second division was 60+C and he was the #1 seed and proved that he should be. The finals were set up against the #2 seed, but only one came out with a national championship title! Jason Kennedy made his first trip down to Houston as well as **Brad Schopieray**. Jason played exceptionally well taking out the #1 seed in 30+A but lost to the eventual winner of the division. Jason had a heart breaker loss in A, losing in the tie breaker 11-6. Even though he had losses, he was excited to play on the national level and thought every minute was worth it. Brad Schopieray went down to gain experience for the Junior Nationals and received it. Brad lost in the first round of 24- in a tough 11-10 defeat. However, Brad made up for it in Men's Elite, losing in the semi-finals 11-6, more on that later. Dan Mullin, Ed Boan, Mark Candy, and Tom Blakeslee all had early defeats in tie-breakers or to people that eventual made it to the finals in their respective divisions.

Given that I had A LOT of free time on my hands, I was able to watch quite a few matches. One in particular match created a lasting moment. I watched two players go at it for quite some time. Both were quick and hit the ball hard. I have to give a thumbs-up to the ref, who I thought did an excellent job given the circumstances. What was disturbing about the match was the complete opposite way the players handled themselves on the court. The first player was calm and cool during the match, never yelled or screamed, argued with the ref. Yes, some calls were questioned, but when the ref made their call the player accepted the outcome – good or bad. The other player screamed at the ref and their opponent, argued every call, and overall was obnoxious. One player was older and the other was younger. The game was great to watch with low shots, gets, and dives by both players. With such games, it is normal for the audience to applaud when the match is done. The memorable part of the match was when the players exited the court: the loser received a standing ovation from the crowd of about 30 people. It was quiet when the winner exited the court. This is very rare to see. The crowd was applauding how the losing player conducted himself on the court, his court maturity, and his demeanor. You see, it should have been the other way around, because it was the YOUNGER player that showed better sportsmanship during a LOSS! Did I mention that it was during the semi-finals of Elite and the losing (winner in my eyes) player was Brad Schopieray!

National Singles is moving to California, right across the street from Disneyland! Hopefully more from Michigan can make the journey and continue to represent us well.
