Michigan's Newest National Champions Crowned at the 2006 National Junior Olympic Championships in East Lansing

Over 250 of the best junior racquetball players from around the country arrived at the MAC in East Lansing to battle for pride and a spot on the USA Junior team at this years finals. Champions would be crowned in divisions ranging from the 6-year-old multi-bouncers to the premier 18 and under group.

Junior Team Michigan had 25 of our best players ready to defend the home soil and at the end of the week they didn't disappoint, winning a State record 23 medals during the tournament and taking home Gold in 4 different divisions.

Mercedes Arias and Ines LeCland became Michigan's newest National Champions winning the Girls 10/12 Doubles in a very exciting match against last years defending champs, Abbey Lavely and Elizabeth Vargas. Way to go ladies! These two have truly established themselves as the new Queens of the Court.

Other Championship division action saw **Brad Schopieray** and his Ohio partner Andy McGuffey lose a heartbreaker to the powerhouse Stockton California team of Marco Rojas and Jose Diaz in the final of Boys 12 and Under Doubles.

Mercedes and Brad joined forces for the 12 and Under Mixed Doubles competition and narrowly missed a trip to the final losing to the eventual winners. Not ones to ever give up, they came back and easily won the third place match over a pair from Oregon, giving them the bronze medal in their first outing as teammates.

Andrew Price made it through to the quarterfinals in the ultra competitive Boys 14 and Under Gold Division in both singles

and doubles, with home state partner Matt Barbuscak. These guys were playing for the first time as a team and were doing very well in National level competition.

Connor Cowan brought home gold in the Boys 8 and Under Red Division beating downstate rival, **Kurtis White** in the final. Kurtis got the job done in the 8 and Under Multi-bounce Red Division getting the win over Ohio tough guy Christian Ulliman. **Mary Zeng** held up the ladies end of things bringing home the gold in the Girls 6/8 Multi-bounce Red Division.

WOW, what a week...we kicked things off with a one day training camp at the Davison Athletic Club where all of our Team Coaches: Lewis Forrest, Ed Arias, Jim Woolcock, Joe Budzinski, Jack and Sandy White, Don Schopieray, and club volunteer, Marshall McFarland, worked with our kids to prepare them for what was to come. Without their help we would not have been as successful as we were, Thank you all!

After the first day of the Tournament we had a team dinner with special guest, Jack Huczek. Jack hung around signing autographs and taking pictures with all of the kids. Then Jack gave a very good speech on the value of teamwork and having fun on the courts. This was definitely one of the week's highlights and a big hit with the kids, thank you Jack!!

I think the biggest thing for the week was the way Team Michigan rebounded from losses in the initial rounds. Our coaching staff is second to none and they were kept very busy all week, keeping up with the matches our players were involved in, and helping out with pointers and encouragement. Without them it would have been

TEAM MICHIGAN CROWNS A NATIONAL CHAMPION IN HOUSTON IN MAY

Another National Singles has come and gone, and Team Michigan has put in another outstanding performance. Congratulations to our newest National Champion, **Dave Lund**.

Mr. David Lund made his first trip to Houston to vie a National Championship in the Mens 70+ Division. This is always a tough division with great play, and even more camaraderie. After a hard week of play, David Lund defeated a world-class player, Francis Florey 15-2,15-1 to win his first National Championship. He added this Championship to his US Open Championships and several State and Regional Champions. Congratulations to David Lund, Team Michigan's newest National Champion.

Jack Huczek was looking to become the first man to win the Open Championship three years in a row. He advanced to the finals against Rocky Carson, who is also a top pro on the IRT. These

two have met in the Finals in Houston several times, each one coming away with victories. This year, Rocky was just too much and he defeated Jack 11-3 in the tiebreaker. Rest assured, Jack will be back net year to start another streak.

USA Racquetball implemented an "Olympic" style format for all of the Womens divisions. That means that all of the players who signed for 35+divisions or A divisions would be combined into one division. If they won the first round, they would advance in the Gold bracket. If they lost the first round, they would drop down to the Blue bracket. If they won, they would advance, if they lost, they would drop down again.

Melody Gorno has made quite a habit of going to Houston, and coming home with medals. 2006 was no exception. In the new format, Melody competed in the 35+A, and 45+A Divisions losing to two former professional players. She made the Quarters in the Gold brackets, and

moved to the 45+A Blue division where she earned a Silver Medal.

Pete Harvey has become a regular Houston and this year was a great trip. After making it to the Quarters in the 55+B Division, Pete finished with a Bronze in the Mens 55+A Division. Another great trip Houston.

Another perennial medalist is **Sharon Huczek**. This year was no exception. Sharon made it to the Semis of the Womens 55+ Division.

As for yours truly, I made the trip, but left my game in Michigan.

This is always a great event and a great way to close the season. It's another chance to see old friends, and make some new ones. You get to see the top amateurs in the world and hear what is going on in the industry. And Houston has always been a great host. Next year, why don't you join us?

JUNIOR NATIONALS . . . PASSION AND COMMITMENT

It all started the autumn of 2004, as a thought shared by Don Schopieray to bring Junior National Racquetball Championships to Michigan. Don approached the CARA gang in Lansing with the idea of the Michigan Athletic Club (MAC) being the venue for the event. Allan Coyle brought in the Lansing Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) to help win the bid, and Dan Mullin, with the help of Ruth Beier, set out to win the support of the MAC, RAM and USA Racquetball (USAR). From these beginnings the Michigan Coalition for Junior Olympic Racquetball Championships was formed.

From the beginning, the intention was to bring players, tournament directors, and racquetball enthusiasts together to set a new standard on which future Junior National Championships would be judged. A lofty goal, yes...but one accomplished. Here is what Jim Hiser, USAR Executive Director had to say, "On behalf of USA Racquetball, the junior council and all the juniors and parents, I wanted to thank you for hosting such a great event. I did not hear one complaint about the club, the hospitality, the special events or anything associated with your volunteers. A true rarity... You and your volunteers should be congratulated for all your work, extra effort and superb organization. You have set a standard that will be difficult to meet! Again Congratulations!

Listening to parents, players, and organizers of past tournaments and events, we set out to provide a welcoming and hospitable venue. We accomplished "Welcoming" right off the bat by telling families they had the full use of the MAC facilities; apparently not a common policy at other tournaments. We provided excellent lunches starting with Chef Mike Manista of Nestle's cooking up plentiful amounts of pasta with three delicious Stouffer sauces (I particularly enjoyed using friendly persuasion to entice the kids to try the Pesto sauce); each day we provided a different lunch like the now nationally famous Menna's Grilled Dubs, Pitas from Mr. Pita, and pizza from Hungry Howie's. We also provided fruit, snacks and Gatorade throughout the day in the hospitality room for the players.

Actually, hospitality started each day at our "Welcome Table" where families could stop by and pick-up gum, nuts and snacks upon entering and leaving the MAC. And least we forget, a huge thank you needs to go out to the Welcome Table Staff, Robin and Jim Woolcock, Ruth Beier, and Caryn Coyle; they provided friendly faces all throughout the tournament, all week long, offering information on daily events and activities, and suggesting area attractions and directions when the CVB staff were not present. Though she may try to down play her role, a seemingly constant presence, Caryn arrived at the MAC a half to an hour before play times and was always one of the last to leave.

A week full of excellent play, great food and good times were not limited to day time hours. The talk of the tournament was the Pool Party open to all families, hosted by Team Michigan. Grilled hot dogs with all the fixings, chips and punch were served pool side, as families relaxed, swam and the kids used the giant slide. This all took place with the vibrant live entertainment from the band "Taste This!" (they also played at the Awards Banquet). All of this at the pool party, and still more...there was also a Euchre Tournament, a mini-bike raffle, and yes, outdoor racquetball matches for the insane who couldn't get enough during the day or could only remember when they were young enough to play juniors.

We tried so hard to make every aspect of this event special; even the banquet at the Kellogg Center drew rave reviews. One father from California stated, "...I've been involved in tournaments for 13 years, and this, by far, was the best food." Other parents commented on the Kellogg waitstaff and how well they interacted with the kids.

The whole reason for being was to provide Michigan players the opportunity to play against and watch the best players from across the nation, and to vie for a spot on the USAR Junior Olympic Team. We accomplished this and so much more. We showcased Michigan, and our state capital, Lansing, and we provided an outstanding opportunity for youngsters to see what can be accomplished with teamwork and caring passionately with a goal in mind. Sometimes hard to value, or measure, we provided positive, supportive role models. Charles and Anita Mills stated it well in a note to RAM President Twayne Howard, "We wanted to thank you and the entire committee who worked to put together the Junior National Tournament. It was the experience of a lifetime for our children (Vincent and Veronica). They are still talking about it!! We were so impressed with how smoothly it was run. Even more importantly, we want to thank everyone for the positive feedback and support that our children received during the tournament. The sport has an overwhelming positive atmosphere and we know that is a tribute to the wonderful adults that helped make the tournament happen...Thank you once again!!"

The passion and commitment was astonishing on the part of players also, well illustrated on opening day, when a young lady (18) checked in at our Welcome Table. Astonishing because she traveled from Utah, spoke little English and unbelievable as it seems, she had not booked a room for her stay! Some would say this was foolishness, but undeniable was her driving passion to be at the games! All worked out in the end with her dilemma resolved when compassion and "the right thing to do" drove a family to convince their dad (cont on pg 14)

CHRIS COLE AND JIMMY FLOYD INDUCTED INTO THE RAM HALL OF FAME 2006

Chris Cole and Jimmy Floyd became the 26th and 27th persons to be inducted into the Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame was developed in 1884 by the Racquetball Association of Michigan (RAM) to honor those recipients who demonstrate outstanding achievement, leadership or contributions to the sport of racquetball in the state of Michigan.

Both of these inductees know each other well and grew up together in the Flint area. They played a lot of racquetball at the Davison Racquetball Club together. Both of these gentlemen have done many things and won a lot of tournaments over the years to deserve to their induction into the Hall of Fame.

A few of Chris's accomplishments include:

- Won a Michigan Junior State Championship in every age division.
- 2. Won at least five Michigan Men's Open State Singles Championship.
- 3. Won five Michigan Open State Doubles Championships with different partners.
- 4. In 2001 won Bronze at National Doubles in Mixed 30+ with Sandy White.
- 5. In 1992 Won Tournament of the Americas, World Championship Singles and US National Singles
- 6. In 1994-95 was Head Coach for US Junior Nationals Team.
- 7. For 8 years was an instructor at the US Olympic Training Center in Colorado.
- 8. In 1995 received Award for Fair Play by IOC in Rome.
- 9. From 1990 to 1994 was on the Board of Directors of RAM (1992-94 was President).
- 10. From 2000 to 2003 was on the Board of Directors of USRA and USOC.

A few of Jimmy's accomplishments include:

- 1. In 1980 won the 10 and under division at the AARA Junior National Championships.
- 2. In 1988 was the Michigan Junior Athlete of the Year
- 3. In 1988 was a High School National Champion.
- 4. In 1989 was the Michigan Male Athlete of the Year.
- 5. Came in 2nd place in the Men's Pro at the Davison Bud Light Open.
- 6. In 1989, 90, & 91 he was a member of the US National Team.
- 7. In 1990 won 1st place in the Men's Open at the AARA National Doubles Championships.
- 8. In 1991 won 1st place in the Men's Open Doubles at the Tournament of the Americas.
- 9. In 1991 won 1st place in the Men's Open Doubles at the Pacific Rim Championships.
- 10. In 1992 come in 2nd in the Men's Open Doubles at the AARA National Doubles Championships.

The Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame is located inside the Michigan Athletic Club in East Lansing. It is Michigan's most prestigious racquetball honor.

In only its second year in Chicago, Pro Nationals has solidified itself as a true Grand Slam event. It has all the flair of the US Open, but it is far closer to home, which makes it a great event for Michiganders. The Pro Nationals is also the Adult Regional Championship making it a qualifier for the National Championships.

The work done by Dave Negrete, Commissioner of the IRT, Doug Ganim, the Executive Director of the US Open, Jim Hiser the Executive Director of USA Racquetball and their team cannot be overstated. This has become a true world class event.

As for the on-court action, by the end of the weekend, Team Michigan had earned five Gold Medals and several other Medals.

Mr. **Dave Lund** has celebrated his 70th birthday by beating up every 70+ player that has gotten in his way so far. That trend would continue in Chicago as he earned the 70+ Pro National Championship. This certainly would bode well for his seeding and play at the Nationals.

Karen Green is no stranger to impressive wins and has garnered several championships in recent years. In Chicago, Karen worked her magic to win the Womens 50/55 Championship.

Mercedes Arias is another proven winner. Mercedes had to play all the boys at this tournament as well. Fortunately, she gets a lot of practice. And, as usual, Mercedes beat up on this group as well, winning the 12- under Championship.

Mercedes also made it to the Semis on the Womens C/D Division.

In what was dubbed "The continuing adventures of Fat Boy and the Cripple Kid", **Dan Mullin** and **Twayne Howard** won the Men's B Doubles Championship. These longtime sparring partners had never teamed up before, but put up a good fight and even pulled off a "righteous win" on the way to the win. Dan also made it to the Quarters and Twayne made it to the Semis of 25+B.

Unfortunately, **Mary Zeng** had no one to play. Apparently the other girls saw her coming and decided to give the Championship to her without a fight.

Congratulations to our Team Michigan Champions!

Dale Graham made the trip to Chicago to compete in the Mens 55 and 55+A Divisions. At the end of the weekend, Dale earned the Silver in the 55+A Division.

Jack Huczek was ranked Number 1 at the beginning of the tournament. A win would earn the year end Championship. Unfortunately, Jack could not get by Kane Waselenchuk in the Finals. For the second year in a row, a loss in the final match cost the Championship.

Chuck Van Hoose is another perennial power. At Pro Nationals, he ended up with a Silver Medal in the Mens 50+B Division. Chuck also made it to the Quarters of the 50+A Division.

Another seasoned veteran is **Andrew Price**. After dominating the Junior play in Michigan, Andrew took his show on the road to Chicago. At Pro Nationals, Andrew finished as the Runner Up in the Juniors 16-

under division against a tough field of competition.
